- Gen Ed & SPED team teaching



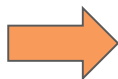

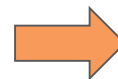

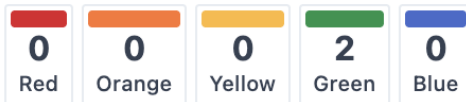

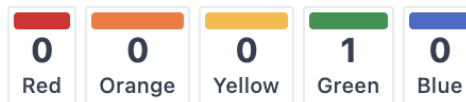
