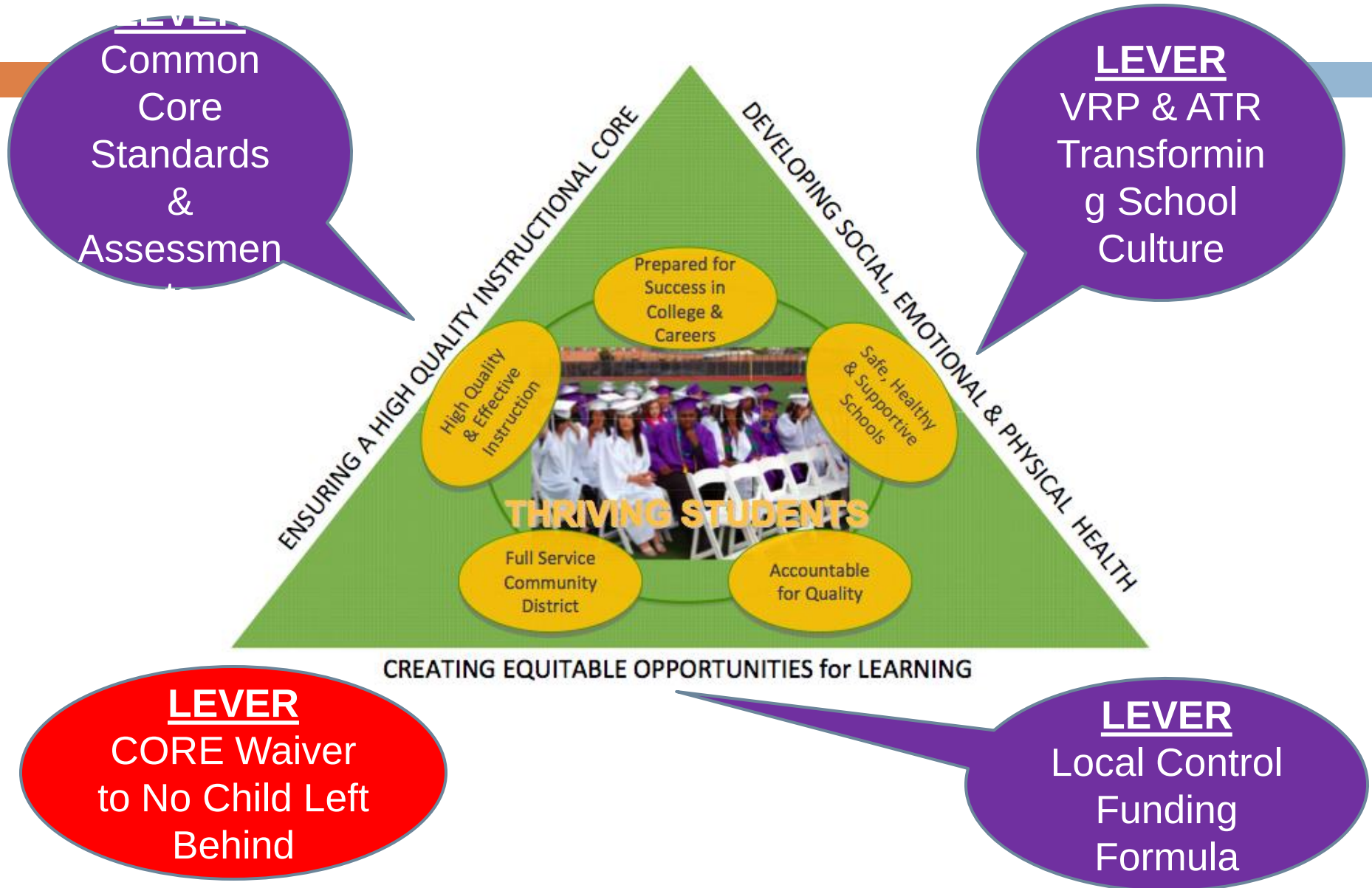
1. CORE (California Office to Reform Education) Waiver to No Child Left Behind

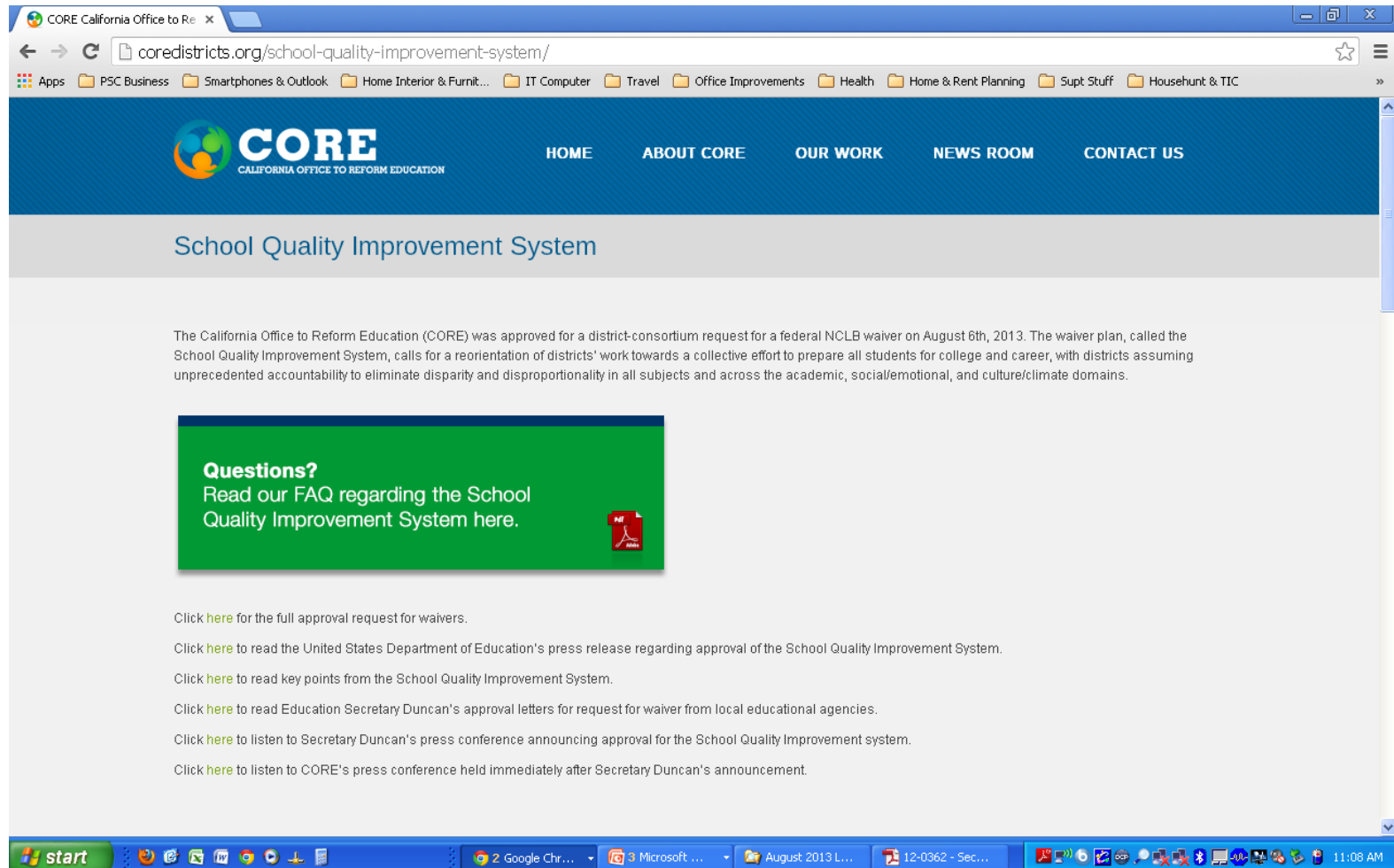
