SSC Minutes FRC, room 3000 and zoom 1/6/2022

Call to order 5:30

#### Welcome & Introduction

Mr. Betlach welcomed everyone and confirmed a quorum was present between members on zoom and in person. He reviewed the notes from the previous meeting and acknowledged a quorum was present.

#### 22-23 Budget Proposal

Mr. Betlach discussed the general budgeting process this year, and the accelerated timeline. He reviewed the agenda and said SSC would be voting on three budget proposals for Title I, Title I Parent, and Title IV. *Title I Parent:* Proposal is for English classes for parents and supplies to support the Family Resource Center and ongoing parent work. Ms. Leon indicated how important the English classes were and moved to approve. Ms. Esparza seconded and the motion passed unanimously

*Title IV:* Proposal is for contracted support to provide healthy activities during lunch and some PE classes. Mrs. Sanchez move to approve, Ms. Leon seconded, and the motion passed unanimously

*Title I:* Proposal is to fund 1.0 FTE TSA11-month instructional facilitator, extended contracts, and online licenses. Mrs. White described the role of TSA. Mr. Betlach described the kind of work that teachers do on extended contracts. Ms. Grant moved to approve, Mrs. White seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

#### 22-23 G1 Discussion

Mr. Betlach described the purpose of G1 and outline two important priorities within the allowed G1 funding: elective instruction and student culture support. Within those priorities, he mentioned funding Spanish, Music, and Art, and a Case Manager/ Counselor and RJ Facilitator. There was general discussion and consensus about those funding priorities. Members named wanting to see electives like wood shop or auto shop if there were available funds. Ms. Grant mentioned financial literacy, and Mr. Betlach named that this was a 7th grade elective and could be expanded. Mr. Betlach further discussed a possible use for existing G1 funds, by bringing in an visual/ media arts teacher for the remainder of the year. There was interest in this idea

#### **Public Comment**

Ms. Leon wanted to know why there would be broad based budget cuts. Mr. Betlach reminded members of the next SSC meeting in January.
