What is Open Enrollment?

- Oakland Unified School District (OUSD) window period for families of students who will be in grades K-8 and grades 10-12 to transfer to a school outside of their neighborhood school within the OUSD school boundaries for the upcoming school year, if there is adequate space at the requested school.
- *Rising 8th graders must participate in the High School Options program. For more information call 879-8474.*

How are Open Enrollment schools determined?

- Participating Schools submit the number of available spaces to the Department of Student, Family and Community Services for each grade level for non neighborhood students for the 2005-2006 school year based on prior enrollment trends.

What is the Open Enrollment lottery?

- If there are more requests than available spaces, a lottery will be held for specific school sites and priority placement students will be randomly selected from the pool of applicants.

When: Wednesday, February 2, 2005

Where: 1025 2nd Avenue, Hunter Hall

Time: 10:00am

How is placement prioritized?

Priority 1

Students presently ATTENDING a school on the Program Improvement (PI) List, determined by “No Child Left Behind” (NCLB) legislation. If a student is transitioning back into OUSD from a non-OUSD school or will be in Kindergarten for the upcoming school year, PI eligibility will be determined by their OUSD neighborhood school.

Priority 2

Students who qualify for free and reduced lunch.

Priority 3

Students who perform *below or far below basic* on standardized tests.

How do families participate in Open Enrollment?

Complete and SUBMIT an Open Enrollment Form to Hunter Hall.

Required Documentation:

- Open Enrollment Form
- Verification of Address (e.g. utility bill, telephone bill, driver's license, etc...)
