The following Implementation Grant conditions apply:

- The grant award will be processed upon receipt of the signed Grant Award Notification (AO-400). This AO-400 must be signed by the superintendent or an authorized official and returned within 10 working days.
- 2. All approved program funds must be expended within the dates designated and for the maximum amount indicated on the AO-400. Encumbrances may be made at any time after the beginning date of the grant stated on the AO-400. **No extensions of this grant will be allowed.**
- 3. The grantee is required to use these funds only for the operation and maintenance of the California Partnership Academy (CPA) at the high school noted in the AO-400 in accordance with the provisions of California Education Code (EC) sections 54690 through 54699. These funds may not supplant current fixed costs. Expenditures shall comply with all applicable provisions for federal, state, and local rules, regulations, and policies relating to the administration and accounting for public school funds, including but not limited to the EC. These funds are instructional in nature. These funds may not be used for out-of-state travel expenses.
- 4. The grantee must limit administrative indirect costs to the rate approved by the California Department of Education (CDE) for the applicable fiscal year in which the funds are spent.
- 5. Upon receipt of the required certifications, scheduled payments of grant funds will be as follows:
 - Fifty percent of the funds will be released upon completion and return of the AO-400. Please allow approximately four weeks for processing.
 - Final payment will be processed after receipt and approval of the CPA Annual Report due
 October of each year. Maximum reimbursement is based upon the number of qualified students
 as described in EC Section 54699. The reduced amount per qualified student is 9.9 percent.
 The final payment is adjusted based on the number of qualified students not to exceed the
 maximum grant amount.
 - The End-of-Project (EOP) Expenditure Report is due after all funds have been expended, but no
 later than 30 days after the end of the grant period. The EOP report is on the CDE CPA Web

 expenditures. Failure to submit a final EOP Expenditure Report with a detailed narrative within
 45 days from the end of the grant period will result in a billing from the CDE for the entire

How will this grant contribute to sustained student achievement or academic standards?	The grant will be used to develop a Renewable Energy Academy at Skyline High School for 10 th -12 th grades. The over-arching theme for this academy is to give students the confidence and opportunity to improve their own academic standing by showing them how their education at the high school level can direct their efforts after graduation. The academy will be designed to provide laboratory class instruction in multiple subjects and use problem-based-learning (PBL) as a means to collectively instruct content through collaborative partners across academic disciplines. The grant will allow the academy team to meet and develop PBL curriculum over the course of the (2) year period. During the process, the academy team and advisory board will design the Renewable Energy Academy to meet the Career Technical Education standards and framework. This academy will bolster California's standards-based education system by incorporating cutting-edge knowledge about green career options, technology, and skills required for success in adult life. More specifically this academy will address CTE pathway standard B: The Energy and Environmental Technology Pathway prepares students for employment or advanced training in a variety of energy and environmental industries.
