


Vision




School Improvement: Vision





Building the Foundation: New School Creation




Prototyped models of success

- 26 new schools opened since 2000



Building the Foundation: Close Underperforming Schools




Demonstrated a commitment to the belief that all students deserve to attend a high quality school

- Five underperforming schools closed in 2004
- Seven underperforming schools closed in 2005



•Building the Foundation: Underperforming School Interventions




Developed a process for intervening in under performing schools

- Improved community participation

School Improvement: Plan



Moving towards a coordinated management of quality within *all* OUSD schools

Development of a school improvement framework that will:

- Define each stage within a school's path towards high quality
- Build systems for schools to implement successful site-based interventions
- Continue to help communities define intervention strategies for underperforming schools



2005-2006 Next Steps for Underperforming School Interventions

- Next week we will begin meetings with all communities who may be in need of targeted interventions for the 2005-2006 school year to:
 - Examine data on academic performance, enrollment, and sustainability
 - Begin discussions concerning possible intervention strategies
- At the November 2, 2005 Board Meeting we will present information for each school in the district regarding where it stands in order to determine which schools need to receive intervention for 2006-2007
- Beginning in November, we will convene community meetings with intervention schools to determine appropriate, school-specific intervention strategies
