

SUBJECT: Application for Provisional Internship Permit – California Commission on Teacher Credentialing –
Named Employees for School Year 2017-2018

ACTION REQUESTED

Approval by the Board of Education of Resolution No. 1617-0202 - Application for Provisional Internship Permit – California Commission on Teacher Credentialing – on behalf of the following employees for School Year 2017-2018:

1. Mindy Natale, 1st Grade, Laurel Elementary School;
2. Divya Farias, 9-12th Grade SDC Mild/Moderate, Coliseum College Prep Academy;
3. Paul Sherreard, 9-12th Grade SDC Moderate/Severe, Oakland High School;
4. Remi Bereola, 6-8th Grade Social Science, Alliance Academy;
5. Michael L. Moore, Jr., 9-12th Grade SDC Mild/Moderate, Fremont HS.

BACKGROUND

According to Title 5 Sections 80021-80021.1, the Provisional Internship Permit (PIP) was created in response to the phasing out of emergency permits and became effective on July 1, 2005. It allows an employing agency to hire an individual who has not yet met the subject matter competence requirement needed to enter an internship program. Prior to requesting a PIP, the employing agency must verify that a diligent search has been made, and a fully credentialed teacher cannot be found.

The PIP is only available at the request of an employing agency. Individuals may not apply directly to the Commission for this document. Holders of the PIP are restricted to service with the employing agency requesting the permit. An employing agency is defined as a California public school district, county office of education, non-public school, charter school, or statewide agency.

The PIP is available in the areas of Multiple Subject, Single Subject, and Education Specialist. Individuals who were issued four or fewer emergency permits may be issued one PIP as long as the employer requirements have been met. Individuals who were issued five emergency permits do not qualify for the PIP.

DISCUSSION

The Board of Education, exercising the power of the Governing Board, may approve an application seeking a Provisional Internship Permit from the Commission on Teacher Credentialing, as may be necessary for certain certificated employees of the District so they may work in the District for the 2017-2018 school year, as follows:

The current request for the 2017-2018 school year, a Provisional Internship Permit is being sought for the following employee:

1. Mindy Natale, 1st Grade, Laurel Elementary School;

2. Divya Farias, 9-12th Grade SDC Mild/Moderate, Coliseum College Prep Academy;
3. Paul Sherreard, 9-12th Grade SDC Moderate/Severe, Oakland High School;
4. Remi Bereola, 6-8th Grade Social Science, Alliance Academy;
5. Michael L. Moore, Jr., 9-12th Grade SDC Mild/Moderate, Fremont HS.

Mindy Natale graduated from Holy Names with a Bachelor's in Liberal Studies. The Provisional Internship Permit will allow her time to complete the CSET exams and the requirements for a University Internship Multiple Subject: General Subject's teaching credential.

Divya Farias graduated from Princeton University with a Bachelor's in Anthropology. The Provisional Internship Permit will allow her time to complete the CSET Exams and the requirements for a University Intern Education Specialist Mild/Moderate teaching credential.

Paul Sherreard graduated from Liverpool John Moores University in England with a Bachelor's in Imaginative Writing and Theatre Studies. The Provisional Internship Permit will allow him time to complete the CSET Exams and the requirements for a University Intern Education Specialist Moderate/Severe teaching credential.

Remi Bereola graduated from Florida A & M with a Bachelor's in Business Administration. The Provisional Internship Permit will allow him time to complete the CSET Exams and the requirements for a University Intern Single Subject teaching credential.

Michael L. Moore, Jr., graduated from Prairie View A & M University with a Bachelor's in Political Science. The Provisional Internship Permit will allow him time to complete the CSET exams and the requirements for a University Intern Education Specialist Mild/Moderate teaching credential.


