

The principal or representative of principal for each SAIT school listed spoke and presented a Power Point Presentation on achievements and/or deficiencies of their respective school.

Nada Jorvocivich submitted quarterly report for the Board's review and a cover letter for each site and benchmarks. Each principal had a PowerPoint presentation providing an overview of each school's progress.

Glenview Elementary School: Deitra Atkins, Principal, reviewed progress in the Open Court process. Gains were made in Grades 2 and 3 in fluency, comprehension. For math, the most improvement was seen in K and Grade 3. Reading Language Arts/Math improvement K-3 surpassed the District's average. She reviewed intervention strategies for students and professional development coaching for staff which will take place over the summer.

Santa Fe: Carol Johnson, Principal, reviewed gains made at various grade levels and noted emphasis for improvement has been targeted at Grade 1; a 15 percent gain overall has been achieved at the school. Strengths noted at the school include providing

enrichment activities in the areas of art, music and science for all children. Challenges include working with new teachers and working with long-term substitute teachers. There will be a continued focus on implementation based on the data for next year. The school needs more math tutoring assistance. Intervention specialists are working with Grades 1 and 2 students.

Martin Luther King, Jr: Marilyn Samper reported gains were made in Grades 3; spelling in grades 2 and 3. Primary math scores tend to be higher than those in the higher grade levels. The school's strengths include coaching and collaboration. Weaknesses include staff are not all fully credentialed. Intervention strategies include reading, and workshops daily with a target population at the Far Below and Below Basic students; tutors and small group instruction for the same students.

Horace Mann Elementary School: Alana Lim, Principal reported that improvement is needed in all grade levels. Their strengths this year include grade level collaborations; Reading First I.F.; after school interventions. Some of the challenges include being a Program Year Improvement Year 4 school, as well as being a SAIT school. There is still some resistance to Open Court.

Dr. Ward announced that he had renewed his request to California Department of Education to do a one time draw down of \$7 million dollars urgently needed to address the financial system -IFAS, He stated that \$1 million is needed to fix the system and possibly \$6 million more to either further customize it or substitute. To do the latter will require additional resources, for which help is being sought from the federal government.

Dr. Ward further stated that he has only used the state line of credit to pay off the District's debts; that no funds have been used for operations and there is no intent to do so.

Dr. Ward further stated that he would further consult with the Board about the IFAS system repair or possible replacement as conditions warrant.

Board members, as a group, shared their concern that it is important to the financial integrity of the District to have a viable financial system and asked to be keep advised of the progress correcting problems in the IFAS system or if a replacement system decision is made.
