### **Overview of Lodestar High School**

**Current Enrollment**: 234 students in grades 9-12

#### **Demographic Highlights:**

- 94% Free and Reduced Lunch
- 44% English Language Learners
- 17% of students have IEPs

#### **Schoolwide Systems of Support:**

- MTSS + Community School Model
- Extensive supports for students with IEPs
- Partnerships with EL Education, One Goal, DCAC, ACOE, and more
- Youth Alive provides additional case management
- College and career guidance for all students embedded in classes and crew

#### Student Outcomes:

- 100% of students enrolled in our Media Arts Pathway
- 89% cohort graduation rate for our first ever graduating class, including 100% of IEP students
- 88% A-G completion rate among class of 2024
- 84% of students in the Class of 2024 were CTE completers (passed Concentrator and Capstone)
- 36% of students in the Class of 2024 graduated with college credits







# Lodestar Media Arts Pathway: Reflections on 2024-2025 so far

# **Evidence of Progress**

- Increase in number of internships through development of internal work assignments as well as community partnerships
- More dual enrollment opportunities for students
- Tighter academic progress monitoring and more coordinated student supports, especially for students with IEPs
- Solid foundation of success with integrated projects that we can build on moving forward

### **Lodestar Media Arts Pathway:** Reflections on 2024-25 so far

**Challenges Faced** 

- It's been difficult to grow our Work-Based Learning Program without a Work-Based Learning Coordinator.
- In our first graduating class, fewer students than anticipated actually matriculated to college or enrolled in a verified career training program, especially students with IEPs
- A disproportionate number of our new students are newcomers to the U.S. and we don't have a fully developed program/plan to support their success
- Our Pathway is still relatively new and we need to continue to identify and address gaps, blind spots, and flaws in our program design









# Looking Ahead to 25-26

Insights & Future Goals

- Though change often comes with challenges, we are excited for the onset of our Health Pathway next year, allowing us to transition to a two Pathway school where students have more agency to choose their CTE program and we have the staffing to run yearlong CTE classes
- Build on success of integrated projects in 24-25 by clarifying expectations for teachers, providing more professional development/administrative support, and expanding focus on graphic arts in CTE classes.
- Continue to expand Work-Based Learning opportunities, industry partnerships, and student internships in meaningful but sustainable ways
- May need to get creative with Dual Enrollment as Peralta suspends school
