Subject Application for Provisional Internship Permit – California Commission on Teacher Credentialing – Named Employees for School Year 2021-2022

Action Requested Approval by the Board of Education of Resolution No. 2122-0067 - Application for Provisional Internship Permit – California Commission on Teacher Credentialing – Named Employees for School Year 2021-2022:

2. Leonardo Gonzalez, Single Subject English, Fremont High School;
3. Yeris Majail, K – 5th Grade, SDC Moderate/Severe Teacher, Franklin Elementary;
4. Sonia Del Rio-Perez, Kindergarten Multiple Subjects, Peralta Elementary;
5. Leo Faiola, 3rd Grade, Multiple Subject, Manzanita Community;
6. Bikku Kuruvila, 9th – 12th Grade Social Science, Oakland High School; and
7. Karla Parker, 4th Grade, Sojourner Truth.

Background

According to Title 5 Sections 80021-80021.1, the Provisional Internship Permit (PIP) was created in response to the phasing out of emergency permits and became effective on July 1, 2005. It allows an employing agency to hire an individual who has not yet met the subject matter competence requirement needed to enter an internship program. Prior to requesting a PIP, the employing agency must verify that a diligent search has been made, and a fully credentialed teacher cannot be found.

The PIP is only available at the request of an employing agency. Individuals may not apply directly to the Commission for this document. Holders of the PIP are restricted to service with the employing agency requesting the permit. An employing agency is defined as a California public school district, county office of education, non-public school, charter school, or statewide agency.

The PIP is available in the areas of Multiple Subject, Single Subject, and Education Specialist. Individuals who were issued four or fewer emergency permits may be issued one PIP as long as the employer requirements have been

met. Individuals who were issued five emergency permits do not qualify for the PIP.

Discussion

The Board of Education, exercising the power of the Governing Board, may approve an application seeking a Provisional Internship Permit from the Commission on Teacher Credentialing, as may be necessary for certain certificated employees of the District so they may work in the District for the 2021-2022 school year, as follows:

The current request for the 2021-2022 school year, a Provisional Internship Permit is being sought for the following employees:

1. Charisel Parla graduated from Florida International University with a Bachelor's in English. The Provisional Intern Permit will allow candidate time to complete the CSET exam and requirements for a University Intern Single Subject program.
2. Leonardo Gonzalez graduated from California State University, East Bay with a Bachelor's in English. The Provisional Intern Permit will allow candidate time to complete the CSET exam and the requirements for a University Intern Single Subject program.
3. Yeris Majail is requesting a Subsequent Variable Term CBEST Education Specialist: Mild/Moderate teaching credential. Yeris Mejail graduated from CSU, Eastbay, with a Bachelor's in Criminal Justice Administration. The Provisional Internship Permit will allow candidate time to complete CSET exams and the requirements for a University Internship Education Specialist Moderate/Severe teaching credential.
4. Sonia Del Rio-Perez graduated from UC, Los Angeles with a Bachelor's Degree in Political Science. The Provisional Internship Permit will allow candidate time to complete the CSET exams and the requirements for a University Internship Multiple Subject Teaching Credential.
5. Leo Faiola graduated from UC, Merced with a Bachelor's Degree in Economics. The Provisional Internship Permit will allow candidate time to complete the CSET exams and the requirements for a University Internship Multiple Subject Teaching Credential.
6. Bikku Kuruvila graduated from Stanford University with a Bachelor's in Political Economy. The Provisional Intern Permit will allow candidate time to complete the CSET exam and the requirements for a University Internship Single Subject credential.

7. Karla Parker graduated from University of California, Santa Cruz with a Bachelor's in Individual Studies. The Provisional Internship Permit will allow candidate time to complete the CSET and requirements for a University Intern Multiple Subject program.


