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Recap of Major Changes



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- Shifts OUSD away from exclusionary discipline (places limits on suspension).
 - Incorporates positive, preventative, and restorative practices.
 - Adoption of a Response to Intervention (RTI) framework (tiered supports).
 - Maintaining and reviewing discipline data
 - Adoption of a universal referral form
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Feedback Received Since First Reading



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- Received feedback from
 - OEA
 - Public Counsel, ACLU, and BOP
 - Board members
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Changes Made Since First Reading



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- New language about the importance of building relationships with families.
 - New language to clarify requirements and expectations regarding administrator and teacher-initiated suspensions.
 - Addition of date for re-visiting suspensions for willful defiance (within a year of adopting the revised policies).
 - Addition of July 1, 2014 effective date.
