President London opened the Public Hearing at 5:05 P.M.

Deputy Superintendent Hal

Special Education Program brief overview for the last three years:

- 2010-2011 Budget \$74 million increased over \$3 million to \$77.3 million
- 2013-2014 Budget A reduction of \$1.750 millions
- The increase from 2010-2011 and the current year is related to additional mental health resources. Last year's contribution was under \$17 million and the current year the contribution is at \$24.1 million. Next year there is an increase of \$331,000.

Deputy Superintendent Santos

The District has been working the last several weeks in looking at the Special Education budget, reviewing all the elements of the program with the intent to sustain educational services for students and submit a budget within the fiscal targets. To do that the District has engaged in a deep review with the practices, systems and the operations. The Special Education target caused the department to move forward on the re-organizational plans the department has been working on in alignment with the Strategic Plan. The department has strived to look effective and provide efficient delivery of services while putting in place the primary resources to support direct instruction for Special Education Students while at the same time looking toward moving toward the District's Strategic Plan Goals. In looking at the budget for Special Education, the District used the following criteria in determining where the reductions would be deployed or where services would be realigned, making sure the District is in compliance with the IEP, providing direct services to students in the classroom, meeting the District's mandate and aligning positions and expertise to the

student's needs. The District is looking at program reductions in certain areas:

- Resource Specialists positions (the District has 8.5).
- The District reduced the Orientation and Mobility position (vacant of over one year). As the District sees a need for particular services as it relates to a student's IEP, the District will reinstate them. At this point, certain services have not been needed and the District is reducing them. The District reduced non-severe teacher services (vacant positions or staff separating from the District).
- Psychologist's position was a reduction in time by an individual.
- TSA's centralized positions the District is looking to reduce four Program Specialists looking to add Reading Specialists to address the District's disproportionality issues in the system.
- Instructional Support Staff (vacant positions). As students need additional support the District will reinstate these positions.
- The District is looking to set up a centralized classified clerical staff.

RSP Ratio – The District is standardizing that to 28:1. The District is looking at that to make sure teachers are serving at a discrete number of schools. The maximum number will be three schools. Currently there are only two teachers who would be serving three schools, most teachers will serve one or two schools. This reorganization of staff will reduce the amount of time and resources dedicated to travel and increase the time to direct support for students.

SDC Ratio – The District is looking at the moderate ratio being 14-16 and for students with severe challenges 10-12 students. Non severe students are in classrooms that usually have an additional adult. Students in the severe classroom usually have two adults. The District will monitor closely and make adjustments as needed to ensure the quality of service.

TSA Positions – The objective is to improve the capacity of the General Education Teacher to effectively improve for students with disabilities in general classrooms. These teachers are not responsible for direct instruction but to support their colleagues in the school. Many of the staff in these positions spend a significant amount of time in administrative functions. The District is looking to make sure the Coordinator's Position is charged with the administrative function and follows through with those functions. The Program Specialist is dedicated to becoming more strategic about instruction and compliance alliance focusing attention on the instructional program, learning to use data and drive decisions based on data around academics improving the instructional supports in those classrooms.

Office Positions - All are centralized positions and the District is just eliminating those positions.

Board Member Discussion

Director Gallo

The budget that is being presented this evening represents 53-54%.

Mr. Hal

"That's correct."

Director Gallo

The 55% will be made up by the end of the year.

Mr. Hal

"Yes." For the current year the District hopes to reach 55% for 2011-2012 as part of the closing process as well as going forward. Part of the issue is that certain classifications of employees the District is not getting credit for as part of the 55% because historically the

way things have been classified as well as what people do.

Director Gallo made the following motion that was seconded by Director Spearman.

Director Gallo stated his motion to read as follows: To approve the current budget being presented by the Superintendent and staff with an addendum or a change to it. What I am recommending in addition to approving the budget is that the District be able to maintain the Special Education funding that has been appropriate for this year to the coming year.

- (1) The District uses the ending fund balance which is \$38 million and takes \$4 million out of the ending fund balance to be able to carry Special Education at the current level to the next year.
- (2) For the Superintendent and staff to work with parents and Special Education Teachers to implement the District's Engagement Policy passed by the Board the previous week; to get input; to be able to come back and evaluate, do assessments, and make recommendations to the Board and the public in terms of the future operations of Special Education.
- (3) Ask through the Chair to establish a special work session on Special Education to hear from staff as well as the public in terms of after coming together and being able to craft a plan the Board can clearly look at, debate, accept, make changes to that in the end; the Board will be able to approve a Special Education Plan for the future of the Oakland Unified School District. That's my motion on the floor.

Director Yee

The Ending Fund Balance of \$38 million seems like a large amount which includes monies that are set aside for the reserve and other audit and other one-time findings.

Mr. Hal

"Correct".

Director Yee

How much would you say is discretionary in that amount of money? Money set aside for the implications if the November Ballot Measures does not pass.

Mr. Hal

Hardly any at this point.

Director Yee

At the bottom of page 23 I see the structural deficit surplus is \$665,000. Does that reflect in the range the amount of money as close as you can estimate?

Mr. Hal

I am looking on page 22, the Reserve for Economic Uncertainty is at 3%. Audit findings are still in that process, I hesitate to call any of that money discretionary. There is the designation of the mid-year cuts. We have \$441 here and I hear \$457. I would caution not touching any of that. The District did approve an early retirement plan at the end of this year for next year, that's part of that payment. At the bottom there is \$2.7 million – if anything can move around it's in that number. I would caution the Board from using any of these monies and dipping into the fund balance because there is so much uncertainty. If you are looking for a line item it would be the last line item.

Director Yee

In the Special Education budget on pages 29 and 30 Director Gallo specifically called out

that modification in your budget proposal. As I understand it there are implications in terms of personnel regarding the notification of people whether their positions are filled or not in the coming year. I would like further clarification of what the implication are in terms of human resources regarding Director Gallo's suggestion to withdraw the proposed changes in the Special Education budget as it relates to personnel.

Mr. Hal

My understanding most of these positions are vacant or will be vacant.

Santos

Most of the positions are vacant, separations or retirements. The only positions are the Program Specialists and that would be a re-organization that would be for less positions in the Program Specialists category. Other than that we are looking mostly at vacancies and separations.

Director Yee

Regarding the four positions, do you need to notice them? Should Director Gallo proposed Amendment to the budget recommendation be adopted?

Ms. Santos

These individuals have been noticed. They are TSA's and they receive notice every year like all TSA's in the system and have received notice the job description is changing. They are welcomed to apply to the new position which there will be nine.

Director Spearman

Please explain to me why the Economic Uncertainty is part of the total fund balance when it can't be used? It inflates the ending fund balance because it is a pot of money you really can't mess with.

Mr. Hal

That's the appropriate accounting for the fund balance. You have restrictions, reserves and designations. This amount is designated for the reserve for the economic uncertainty. It is one that we have to have. It is part of fund balance, one that you should not touch unless there is an economic uncertainty, but it is a set aside of the total reserve for the District's full fund balance.

Director Spearman

Do you think the public understands that?

Mr. Hal

"No."

Director Spearman

When they look at the total ending fund balance and see the District will have \$38 million, they are not going to take into consideration that the District has about \$13.5 million that can't be touched.

Mr. Hal

That's why we show the fund balance detail. If you just show what number, they say oh that's touchable. Once you show the detail they say okay, that line item you can't touch that. That's why we show the detail of the fund balance so hopefully people will have an appreciation of the components of what can and cannot be used for.

Director Spearman

Under audit findings and one-time items, can you explain what that means?

Mr. Hal

The last audit the District had by the State Controller was done in 2007-2008. There are findings in that audit the District disagrees with. The District is going to a Panel to dispute that disagreement. They have not performed the 2008-2009 and 2009-2010 audits but they are in the process of performing 2010-2011. The 2007-2008 has been done and they skipped to 2010-2011. Once that is over we will have a discussion about what to do about the two years in between. They may just do a State and Federal Compliance audit and not a full audit. There is a risk for any audit findings.

Director Spearman

We are still continuing the same practices we have been noticed under negative audit findings. Why would we think an Administrative Law Judge would rule in our favor if we continue with the same behavior they said is not compliant such as the 50%?

Mr. Hal

This is not the 55% issue, this would be an administrator/teacher ratio. We dispute how the State calculates certain things. Those rulings have not come out yet. In fact, the District has not gotten a ruling for the 2006-2007 audit for the administrator/teacher ratio. Everything is up in the air until we start to get some of these final decisions from the Administrative Law Judge.

Director Spearman

That's been a constant negative finding in all of our audits and it seems to me the District should do something to alleviate that problem. We are still continuing in the same behavior trying to justify the same behavior instead of trying to correct the problem. To me it's like we are spending money to do what we want to do instead of being compliant. We are not changing our behavior. We start changing our behavior then we can come out of some of these negative audit findings.

Director Dobbins

How many Special Education Students are there in the District?

Ms. Santos

5,089 students.

Director Dobbins

Explain the \$2.1 million in cuts to Special Education transportation.

Mr. Hai

The Program for Exceptional Children will manage transportation costs by ensuring that as new students are identified as needing Special Education services, the IEP Team will ensure transportation are indicated on the IEP only when necessary as a related service.

Director Dobbins

Ms. Santos you said there 13.5 Programs Specialists Positions and only four will not return to the District.

Ms. Santos

Correct. The District is reducing the number of Program Specialists in the Special Education Program. In looking at the District and the work going forward, the District is looking to bring into the department people who work in specialized areas and in high need areas in particular. The needs of the students have increased significantly. The District has to make sure the Special Education Teachers are in sync with the core requirements as it relates to the standards and providing them the opportunity to work in partnership with specialists from subject area matters to build together strategies for Special Education Students. Most of the work is around service provided and behavioral modifications, not

necessarily around the academic piece.

Director Dobbins

Director Dobbins said his concern is with fewer bodies how can the District ensure compliance?

Ms. Santos

Program Specialists have been doing the administrative work with IEP's – chairing IEP Meetings and reviewing IEP's which is the function of the Coordinator.

Director Kakishiba

At the last Board Meeting there was a sense that the Board would be looking at reducing expenditures or reallocating the source of those expenses by \$1.3 million. Three items were highlighted in the Structural Deficit Page on the last version of the budget.

- 1. Consultants used for the audit process.
- Administrator on Special Assignment (function unknown).
- 3. TSA strategy to be paid within last year's flex amount for Adult Education.

Are any of these costs absorbed or eliminated?

Mr. Hal

The Ending Fund Balance shows Audit Findings a one-time item of \$807,000. He said that covers the consultant costs and ASA combined. The \$600,000 for the TSA strategy is budgeted to come out of the Adult Education Resource.

Director Kakishiba

Page 26 and 28 indicates the District is losing money in Special Education in three categories. On page 28 are the criteria to recover the loss.

Mr. Hal

The reduction aligns with Special Education.

Vice President Hinton Hodge

Wanted an explanation of the coding issue and how does the restructuring and redesign gets vetted with parents.

Ms. Santos

The District looked at some of the key areas of the program. Severe Behavior and Autism was looked at by the District. One of the challenges is the program does not have expertise in the area. In aligning the resources, the District is looking for a coordinator with that particular expertise. Another key area is mental health. The District chose to create a Coordinator's Position that can work in those areas and create opportunities for students in those areas. The District is looking to make sure the services that student's need in the classroom is protected. Reductions are away from the classrooms – they are centralized positions.

Vice President Hinton Hodge

Vice President Hinton Hodge wanted to know if the eliminated Resource Specialists positions were open positions.

Ms. Santos

These are annual renewals.

Vice President Hinton Hodge

The District had 14 positions and decided to go to 10 positions for this year.

Ms. Santos "Right".

Vice President Hinton Hodge

There is a concern about the Aides being cut, terminated or not filled. The IEP's developed says the District needs an additional specialists or IA. Will those positions be filled?

Ms. Santos "Definitely."

President London

Process and engagement with the CAC – Did not hear what the process was with them.

Ms. Santos

These recommendations came quickly and there was not the time for an engagement process as the District would have desired. Going forward the District will establish a process to include the community in the District's plan development as it looks at the recommendations. The program needs signification attention in terms of effectiveness and efficiency in multiple areas. The District will be engaging the community as it looks at its findings related to a review of the program.

President London

Program Specialists provide a function directing families to the best fit for their child. She said she thinks the communities concern is the ability for someone to understand programs well enough to know where the resources for the student will disappear.

Ms. Santos

The District will continue to have Program Specialists. There are Coordinators that understand where the assets are and the different programs within the system. They will be available to work with families on an on-going basis. It's hard to reduce four people, but the District also has fewer schools in the system moving from 101 to 84 schools. This is a much more concentrated effort and part of the work is minimizing the impact to communities. The District is moving to continue to support and inform also looking at how central office has to be the right size for the right sized district.

President London

Where on page 29 and 30 will I find the Coordinator's Position you just referred to?

Ms. Santos

On page 29 near the bottom.

Second Round of Board Discussion

Director Spearman

How will the restructuring ensure compliance with IEP's?

Ms. Santos

The IEP responsibility requires the participation of the Special Education Teacher, Teacher, Parents, Principal and the Site Administrator. The IEP is the responsibility of the site. The Program Specialists and Coordinator support that activity. The District will be working diligently to ensure that General Education, Site Administration and Teachers understand their responsibility as it relates to the IEP. The District will be putting into place mechanisms to look at quality control issues as it relates to IEP's. The way the District operates the program it is not a shared responsibility between Special Education and

General Education. It is important throughout the system that it becomes a shared responsibility.

Director Spearman

If the District pays out millions of dollars every year on compliance issues regarding the District not meeting IEP's, how will the District decrease the amount of money paid in law suits when the District is using people not familiar with the system? I am very concerned the District is paying out all this money every year for not meeting IEP's. You are putting in these Coordinators but you say it's the responsibility of the school. If it is the responsibility of the school, it is a direct responsibility of the Principal. Is that part of the Principal's evaluation?

Ms. Santos

There will be significant training of principals around their responsibility as it relates to the IEP and attention to the evaluation. The current practice is not working. The District needs to shift to practices that will work and find ways to monitor those practices by putting the responsibility where it needs to be.

Director Spearman

Are you saying that will be a part of the Principal's Evaluation? If there is no accountability, the District will continue the same practice.

Ms. Santos

It is a responsibility of the site administrator and the District will follow through with that.

Director Spearman

Where does the funding come from to pay for all the Special Education law suits the District pays out every year?

General Counsel Minor

The due process and mediation settlements approved by the Board are paid out of the Special Education budget.

Director Spearman

Where in the Special Education Budget does the District budget for this to be paid?

Mr. Hal

It's called Resource 6500.

Director Spearman

There needs to be a line item that shows how much is put aside for lawsuits.

Director Gallo

Perhaps the Program Specialists or Managers will have greater input in terms of meeting with the parents and working with District staff to resolve the issues without parents resorting to legal actions. The bottom line is to be able to provide a service to the children. For the District to accomplish this it needs to step back a minute, continue the current program at the current level, and be able to work together to bring this to a resolution.

Vice President Hinton Hodge

Page 25 talks about the General Education contribution to Special Education. In 2011-2012 the contribution is \$24 million and in 2012-2013 there is an increase of \$332,000.

On page 29 the Severe Teachers increased from 97 to 99 teachers.

What does the District do around the \$2 million in cuts to transportation? How will the District recover from this because transportation will be provided?

Ms. Santos

The District is looking at efficiencies, making sure the District is providing transportation for students that need transportation.

Vice President Hinton Hodge

I want a clear commitment however the Board votes on this, that there is some real observation and reporting back with some real discussion.

Public Comments

Cynthia Molina said the proposal will result in dramatically increased class size for Special Education; Maximum caseloads for Resource Specialists regardless of student need; the loss of teacher and aide positions and the widespread uprooting of children from their school as classrooms are consolidated. The Community Advisory Committee for Special Education opposes the cuts that will hurt this vulnerable population.

Ed Broad said the SELPA Budget shows a \$10 million increase and the District is talking about a decrease to Special Education. The District and the PEC suggest sweeping changes on how children will receive services, none has had any public review. Any layoffs should be tabled until the new director has been confirmed and has had time to work with the community; change how the District delivers Special Education.

Barbara Cass said the result will be an increase in non-public services for a select few and a decrease for everyone else. The Program Specialists carry the institutional knowledge for the department, not the ones giving out the \$14 million. The proposed changes are completely inadequate and will result in increased compliance complaints in non-public services. Having a Resource Specialists based at a school allows the District to fill Child Find a Federal Mandate.

Mary Ann Hill said she has seen many changes to Special Education and this year is one of the most dramatic changes she has seen over the years. She said many Resources Specialists and Special Education Teachers have a lot of students with emotional needs. Program Specialists look at IEP's and help make decisions. IEP's are written by General Education Teachers, Parents, Principals and Resource Teachers, a team effort.

Sherry Kelly said she has been in the District since 1998 and there are always changes and deficits. She said she needs her Program Specialists to answer questions, to help with difficult cases, to work with the classroom teachers and to answer questions the principal does not have the knowledge of.

Jack Gerson said the District is asking people to create miracle upon miracle everyday cutting to the bone tying rocks around their waist throwing them into the pool. This continued dismantling of the District is shameful. Adult Education was destroyed; Early Childhood was cut back; and now the attack is on Special Education.

Mike Hutchinson said at the beginning of the year the community was told there was a \$2 million structural deficit and that is why schools were being closed. He said on today's Consent Report \$400,000 is being spent on portable classrooms for Burckhalter School to accommodate the students moving from Lakeview School. He said when staff are asked a question they dance around it and give maybes and never directly answer a question. Everybody lets it go and don't expect any better.

Ben Visnick asked why Program Specialists? He said many of the new Special Educations teachers come from Teach for America and Oakland Teaching Fellows and need that extra support because the District doesn't provide the training beforehand. He said because the charter schools do not welcome District students with disabilities the District accepts a higher percentage than most school districts.

Maya Mosley asked the Board to make the right decision tonight.

Brian Blase said the issue is around the Program Specialists and trying to integrate more students into the General Education environment is good on paper because it is one of the least restrictive environments. He said General Education Classes are already overloaded. All parents want their children to be mainstreamed and to have a fair and appropriate education as outlined by CDE and Federal Law.

Angle Wager said her son is severely handicapped in a full inclusion program. She said thanks to the collaborative engaged relationship of the IEP Team, her son is receiving the services he needs to access his education. These services and the Intervention Specialists that support his program are critical to ensuring he is academically, socially and emotionally engaged in his General Education Classroom. The proposed cuts will drastically affect the program like his.

Tanya Kappner said the District will lose students by closing schools. This is against the interest of the community. What this has been about, is the destabilizing and weakening the powers of the Oakland Community. She said Lakeview Elementary needs to remain open, what a crime to put offices there. She said it was an outrage how the community has been treated regarding school closures.

Theresa Miller said National Board Certified Teachers are among the Program Specialists recruited by Oakland Teaching Fellows and recipients of District Quality Awards. The award and recognition are only meaningful if they signify a commitment to retaining strong employees. The work of Program Specialists meets legal requirements and the District's ethical obligation to children and families.

Ofelia Gomez asked the Board not to reduce the number of Program Specialists. She said by doing so that you assume they are part of the problem; in fact they are part of the solution. Ms. Gomez asked the Board to have the wisdom to discriminate the number of students that should be in a caseload.

Joel Velasquez wanted to know when is everyone on the dais going to stand with the community and go to the State to do something about the ridiculous cuts to the community and the schools. He said these cuts are unacceptable. The District cannot provide services with the budget the State of California is giving to school districts. The children most affected cannot handle these cuts.

Phyllis Stevenson said she is concerned and outraged that the Board will consider short sided quick fixes to a budget. The children are not games pieces to be moved around. It is so important to maintain the budget where it is. She said 5,000 students and less than 20 Program Specialists.

Sonya said there are not Program Specialists that are mild to moderate or moderate to severe. She said Deputy Superintendent Santos spoke of IEP compliance as a site responsibility. She said currently Program Specialists exists because they can't do that at a site level.

Debra Wysinger said she has two grandchildren in District schools with IEP's. She said she had to retain an attorney in order to get an IEP. She said the funding is needed

because we don't need children out on the streets. Ms. Wysinger said she supports IEP's.

Dennis Nelson said Katy Murphy characterized the District's knowledge of Special Education Program Specialists as "the glue that holds a very weak system together." Mr. Nelson said this is a sad day for us all.

Lisa Winslow said the District is vulnerable to absorbing an increased number of legal costs due to non-compliance. Without Special Education, cultural diversity, and knowledge of an adequate number of Program Specialists, more students of color will be identified as eligible for Special Education.

Mary Clark said three of the Program Specialists recruited to teach in the District through Oakland Teaching Fellows stayed beyond their two year commitment. One of the three was recently given an award by the Board of Education for her outstanding performance. Is it wise to spend millions of dollars to recruit talented professionals who have been trained to be Programs Specialists?

Richard Freidman said as a Program Specialist he believes he has been effective in his work with families, students and teachers. "We may not be able go about this exactly in the way you had in mind, but together, as a team, we are able to figure out something that will work for your child." These are the words the Program Specialists live and stand by every day.

Lisa Reiser said it takes a lot of time and effort on the part of the teacher working with the Inclusion Specialists and the Program Specialists to identify and get services appropriate for the students. Ms. Reiser noted last year her daughter's IEP included transportation but she was brought to school in a taxi paid for by the District because the transportation department did not do their job. She said she hopes some of the wasteful expenditures will be examined.

Susan Henderson said failure to meet Maintenance of Effort can and may result in penalties from the CDE, a reduction in Federal Funds.

Melissa Graham said her parents have not been told where their children will attend school. She said they call her and she tells them what she thinks she knows. She said if these families were in the "hills" they would have been treated differently.

Beca Rosa Marsh read a response to the press release regarding the Lakeview Elementary sit-in. Last week Dr. Smith announced a \$4.3 million cut to its Special Education Program. She said this means larger class size, bigger case loads, fewer teachers and the elimination of Special Education Specialists Teachers need for the program to work.

Thearse Peco said it essential for children with disabilities to have their needs met. How the District meets them is with Specialists. She said to cut the program will affect a lot of children in the learning process. She said the Board took an oath to protect education, not to destroy it. If the Special Education budget is cut, a lot of children's progress in learning will be damaged.

Jennifer Brohart said she attended and directed many professional developments in the District and has met many dedicated Special Education Teachers whom she has relied upon for their expertise.

Katelin Everett said if the District thinks it can reduce costs by cutting services and positions will result in Special Education students thriving, the Board, if more short sighted than she thought. Ms. Everett urged the Board to do the right thing.

Julie McCalmont said she believes the Theory of Action proposed by the District to increase inclusion in General Education participation is the right direction to go. In order to be successful there needs to be a lot of supports in place.

Stephanie suggested ways the District can get money to keep Special Education programs going and to keep schools open. She suggested taking back the building in West Oakland using it for office space and eliminate the District's Police Department.

President London closed the Public Hearing at 8:17 P.M.

PRESIDENT LONDON

THE BOARD WILL MOVE ON TO DISCUSSION WITH TWO ITEMS TO VOTE ON.

- 1. The motion from Director Gallo
- 2. The actual budget –the motion from Director Gallo has a direct impact on the budget. My suggestion is to first debate the motion from Director Gallo then move on to the full budget.

The motion from Director Gallo was a three-part motion. My notes show it was to approve modifications in three areas

- Maintain the current Special Education budget take \$400 million from the ending fund balance
- Direct the Superintendent to work with parents, staff and the community on the redesign that may be helpful to the Special Education Program
- The Board should have Study Session on Special Education Program.

Is that correct Director Gallo?

DirectorGallo

"Right." My first statement was to approve the budget proposal with the modification (the addition of dealing with Special Education) – the amount is \$400,000 not \$400 million – to be able to make reference to the ending fund balance for that subtraction.

President London

That's the motion before us. We are going to take debate on this motion – each Board Member will have five minutes if needed to state their case.

Director Gallo

Even though I think we are close to the 55% in the classroom, there are different activities we do not record that apply to the classroom according to the State Trustee. He said the bottom line for him the District did not go through a fair process in terms of being able to define what Special Education should be about. He said a lot of us heard it for the first time as Board elected officials here at the Board Meeting that we were eliminating some of the Positions. The numbers kept changing. The District should continue funding the current program at the current year's level and be able to engage the public, parents and teachers to bring to this body for discussion and approval a program we all can say is a quality Special Education program to serve our children. We recognize the fact that we have some challenges when it comes to funding. I need each one of you not only to fund the special programs in Special Education but at the same time we will be asking the public to fund the General Obligation Bond to improve our facilities and improve the environment. He said in the ending fund balance there is \$38 million – taking the \$4 million designated for a reduction to be able to put that in place and be able to work with the parent body from Special Education.

Director Yee

Just a point of order Madam President. You asked structurally to have people who are

speaking

President London

That was the advice from the Parliamentarian.

Director Yee

Some of us are waiting for that.

President London

Is there anyone else who wishes to speak at this time in support of the motion (among Board Members)?

Vice President Hinton Hodge

Just for clarity sake, the \$4 million I don't see (1) where we are taking in from and (2) I think I know where you got to that number but I am wondering whether or not if we are looking at a potentially smaller number that's actually based on the costs savings on page 29 which doesn't fully add up to unless you are talking about preserving Office Manager positions. Maybe some clarity around where the \$4 million comes from you are talking about taking out of the ending fund balance.

Director Gallo

If you look at page 46 on version 3 and go to version 6 that I saw today for the first time on page 59 what you see is the current annual budget. It says \$85.74 million 2012-2013; last years was \$88.8 million under 2011-2012 — across from that you see the \$3.1 million difference (negative). The negative comes from the \$1.2 million under Special Education and transportation is \$1.9 million and that is the difference I am talking about. I want to be able to make up that difference to keep the program whole and be able to take that \$3.19 million out of the ending fund balance reflected on page 33 of version 6 which amounts to \$38.0567 million.

President London

Are you amending your motion to be \$3.1 million instead of \$4 million?

Director Gallo

Four million was tossed around before and that's why I threw \$4 million. But if it is \$3.192 I will stick with \$3.192 million.

President London

So it sounds like you have modified your motion.

Director Gallo

That's fine.

Director Kakishiba

The basic sentiment of the motion I am in favor of. However, there are a couple of things I would like to offer. I am concerned as I expressed at the last Board Meeting that our enrollment projections are a little bit optimistic. I support adopting the budget tonight. I believe in September when we close the books for this fiscal year and when we get a 20 day enrollment count that we revisit the budget and see basically where we are. Are we on track with the enrollment projections and did we bring any additional fund balance as a result of closing the books. At that time we should have our audit completed as well and will have some sense around the findings and penalties related to that. I am in favor to maintain the spending levels on the program side. I think we should maintain the reductions in the transportation line item. I also would like to be very clear that the Superintendent is engaged in a fairly well designed planning process with the Community Advisory Committee and with clear stakeholders on the ground in schools sites to be able

to come up with a plan, design and improvement plan for Special Education services that will result in improved student outcomes per the Strategic Plan. In particular I would like to include an analysis about why the District's percentage of Special Education students is increasing; I would also like to have an analysis of where we are around our legal costs (legal settlement costs) and if there is a trend upward, stagnation or downward. That the Board is deliberating specifically on a proposed improvement plan for Special Education services beginning in October.

Director Yee

Point of order. When he was talking about maintaining the expenditures, are you referring to maintaining the expenditures as proposed in the current budget or are you talking about maintaining the expenditures from the 2011-2012 year?

Director Kakishiba

From the previous year. If you look on page 25 under the first Special Education expense under Special Education the line item there is a difference so I am in favor of maintaining at the current 2011-2012 levels for that particular line item.

Director Spearman

Is that a little different from what Director Gallo is saying?

Director Kakishiba

Yes it is.

Director Spearman

What's the Difference?

Director Kakishiba

Director Gallo I believe included both the Special Education program and transportation line item which equals to \$3.8 million (page 25).

Director Spearman

You are proposing?

Director Kakishiba

One point seven five million.

President London

Director Kakishiba you are proposing to retain the program side but not the transportation side?

Director Kakishiba

"Right."

President London

That's his comment and we can continue with the discussion and if the maker of the motion wants to reconsider his motion he can.

Director Gallo

I would welcome Director Kakishiba's addition to the motion.

President London

So you're (Gallo) accepting this. So now the motion is just we would...

Director Gallo

Maintain the program but we will support the recommendation from staff on transportation.

The transportation for 2012-2013 is \$10.725 million not \$12 million.

Director Yee

I would like to summarize what I consider the issues and ask the Superintendent and his staff who have heard all the public comments as well as the discussions for their analysis of the impact of the amended budget proposal to the overall balancing of the budget. That is fundamentally the requirement of this particular action. It is not about Special Education it is about our budget, the wholeness, the balancing of the budget and the approval of a budget that can be moved forward, approved through the State Trustee and approved by the County of Alameda. Here are the things I heard:

- 1. The engagement process was ineffective and not engaging of parents, teachers and stakeholders.
- 2. The services to students actually will be impacted even though the initial statement was the services will be away from the students. I don't think anybody believes any of the cuts (\$4 million) will have no effect on students.
- 3. There was a discussion about potential legal liability. The question was would the legal liabilities outweigh the efforts to balance the budget?
- 4. There is an agreement about the requirement for structuring and restructuring of Special Education to include Inclusion especially around the academic topics.
- 5. The need Resource Specialists have for professional support, senior professional support that provides a backup and a second set of eyes for their work, especially in light of the fact the District has many new Resource Specialists.
- 6. None of us should misunderstand that any increase in class size has an impact. The impact is unclear but generally it would be a negative impact. We have gone through this with Adult Education and regular class size and many of the other efforts the Board has done.

When I joined this Board we were taken over by the State because the District had a \$35 – \$65 million deficit. One of the issues was the General Education contribution to the Special Education budget that was roughly around what it is now (\$32-\$35 million). That was one of the legs upon the State took over the District. My commitment when I joined the Board was to be fiscally responsible as possible. Mr. Superintendent given this is what I hear and I am sure it is the same things you heard, I would like to have your comments whether you believe the budget you put forth is the best, most professional, most responsible budget that you are recommending this Board adopt.

Director Dobbins

I agree with my colleagues on this issue. Many students who live in Oakland are able to navigate the system to get the best education. There are so many Federal mandates for Special Education, we have to follow the law yet we don't have the resources to implement the law. The District is at a challenge so how do we best meet the needs of these students? The public does not see the amount of money the District pays in attorney's fees for these students. Director Dobbins requested information on the following:

- 1. To see what the lawyer's fees are.
- 2. How much the District is paying in settlements for students living in the City of Oakland taking advantage of the Federal mandates?

Director Spearman

I am leaning in the Direction of Director Kakishiba. If the Board directs the Superintendent and staff to do something, that's what they do and they will figure it out. They will not put the Board in any jeopardy. This was just brought to us. I am not happy with what was done with Special Education because it was done in secrecy, I think. This was not discussed with the Board. I know enough about budgets and how budget are manipulated to know this small amount of money will not send the District into bankruptcy. There are compliance issues with Special Education and the District will have to pay. The positions that are critical will be funded. It is my duty to make sure students are educated properly in

this District with the resources the District has. I believe we can find a way to keep this budget balanced. I will support Director Kakishiba's recommendation. I think it can be done, I know it can be done, and if we say it's going to be done it will be done and staff will come back with a balanced budget because that is what they must have.

Director Kakishiba

We don't have an open ATM. Assuming the budget passes, a position of spend, spend, spend is not real. We have to problem solve this. This is not saying the administration is doing things in secret, trying to hoodwink the public or hoodwink this Board is not helpful. There are choices and options and I believe the Superintendent and staff did present their best thinking on the budget and the Board is putting out another viewpoint and consideration.

Vice President Hinton Hodge

I support a motion that looks at the program side of the program. I am concerned about picking a number without the balance or compromising piece Director Kakishiba talked about.

Director Gallo

The only reason the Board is here is to serve the child in the classroom. The power of education lies in the classroom.

Director Yee

It is my duty to balance the budget based upon these years of watching State Administration in this city re-create a General Education contribution to Special Education virtually the same that partially drove the District into bankruptcy. Is this the best expenditure of General Education funds to fill the one time gaps because stimulus and the loss mental health money from the County and the State? I asked the Superintendent earlier with the instructional and fiscal staff who have looked at the entire budget if you can tell me this \$1.7 million currently the best use of that \$1.7 million so that the Board can adopt the budget which it is required to do so tonight. If that's the best use of the \$1.7 million it is very persuasive. If not, you need to tell this community and the Board that in your professional judgment this is not the best way to spend the money. That is why we hired the Superintendent. The Board's responsibility is to adopt a budget, hire and evaluate the Superintendent.

Superintendent Smith's response to Director Yee

Superintendent Smith said the one thing to remember these are dollars the District will not get. In terms of Maintenance of Effort, the District is increasing its contribution. We have talked with the Program Specialists how to best provide support for in the classroom and getting the best service for kids. When hired by the Board, the direction was to eliminate the structural deficit. When the District was returned to local control expenditures were \$40 million greater than ongoing revenues. This budget represents the first time there is a structural surplus. We have had to cut deeper than other districts. The other direction from the Board was to keep the school year. The District has not done furloughs, we have 180 days for everybody and are able to increase per pupil allocation thru school closures. I would be uncomfortable with eliminating the structural surplus of \$665,000. To protect the four positions at \$400,000 seems reasonable. We need to be able to have that conversation. That will increase the contribution the District is making. Having a long term plan for Special Education that included a community advisory committee has been something the District has wanted to do and now it is something the District needs to do. I make the recommendation to put back the four Program Specialists at a cost of \$400,000.

President London

The motion on the floor is to put back the \$1.750 million currently indicated in the budget to be cut from Special Education programs. The recommendation from the Superintendent in

response to Board Member questions is to restore funding for the Program Specialists and still maintain a small structural surplus.

President London

Director Gallo as the maker of the motion are you maintaining your...

Director Gallo

It is up to the Superintendent and staff to work with the community to be able to make the adjustments. I just want to keep the program whole for the whole year as the District gets to the level to establish a quality Special Education program all can agree upon. I would like to maintain the \$1.750 million.

Secretary Rakestraw

For the record, as we recorded, we understood the budget is approved with the modification as made. Is that correct?

President London

President London opened the Public Hearing at 8:32 P.M.

The petitioner (did not state his name) stated Legacies of Excellence Charter School is submitting their charter petition again tonight. He said the organization want to create a school that will address the needs of at risk students; students that are drop-outs; potential drop-outs; students in the juvenile justice system; students habitually truant; etc. Legacies of Excellence will be a high challenged school, with an enriched and challenging curriculum. He cited the differences in the school:

- 1. The school will have an agricultural component. There will be a longer school days with the last part of the day spent with agricultural class and intervention class.
- 2. Family counseling will available.
- 3. The school will have a social/emotional training program addressing the emotional needs of the student.
- 4. A strong mentoring program.
- 5. Field trips for students to see what success looks like.
- 6. A strong professional program and a strong bond with the families.
- 7. A reduction in the student drop-out rate.
- 8. The agricultural program with organic farming will make a difference the lives of the students.

Goal of Legacies of Excellence

- 1. All students who wish to attend will be enrolled.
- 2. The instructional philosophy will be focused on engaging students with a rigorous curriculum.
- 3. The program will respond to emotional learning.
- 4. English Language Learners/Academic Language Learners will be accepted with a curriculum designed to appeal to all.
- Course content with a focus on literacy.
- 6. Partner with UC Davis with field trips to UC Davis and staff coming to Legacies of Excellence to assist.
- 7. The science program will be a State approved curriculum used in a number of districts.
- 8. Math and Grammar will use a lot of word programs that will put language into math so that students can comprehend.
- 9. Intervention program for disruptive students.
- 10. Accelerated program to address accelerated students.
- 11. Some agriculture in every subject.

David Roche (Petitioner) said located in East Oakland Legacies of Excellence has been

privately funded. He said agriculture is more than growing food, it's an outdoor science lab and a commodity sold in stores. He said a lot of students have not tasted real food. He said this is a health issue and its training students to become future grocery store owners. Once students learn the skill of how to grow and sell food and create stores in the community, they become the future turning some of the abandoned buildings into places that can be beneficial to the community. Legacies of Excellence wants to train the students to become the future business owners which incorporates math into the curriculum.

Jason Newell (Petitioner) said the difference in this school and in most schools they plan on a school that works with at-risk students; students not working at their fullest potential; and student who don't potentially attend school. The social work aspect will be implemented in the school. He said this is not a school that will take money away from the District. He said these are students who have been underserved and have not attended school a lot of the time.

Public Comments

Jim Mordecai said when he listen to the petitioners, he said their heart is in the right place. He said unfortunately they are functioning as a charter school. He said one of the problems is once a charter school is established, they usually join a charter school association and take money from the public to join the association. He said he would like to see that same spirit turned into an alternative school.

Ben Visnick said he thinks this is a good idea. He said there are some good union job in the retail sector. He said he doesn't think the District should create a program outside the current schools that can deal with the ideas. He said charter schools are slowly destroying the District. Mr. Visnick urged the Board to vote "No" on the charter petition.

Board Member Comments

Vice President Hinton Hodge said the District has not done the work the petitioner are proposing to do. She wanted to know how the school sees itself partnering with the African American Male Initiative and the District.

Mr. Roche said Legacies of Excellence will be happy to partner with any initiative that will help their cause, stopping the drop-out rate and feeding the prison system.

Secretary Rakestraw noted there has been a discussion regarding the petitioners agreeing up to a 90 day timeline for the Board's decision.

Mr. Roche said "Yes."

President London noted the Board will be in recess the month of July and will need additional time before a decision can be made.

Ben Tapscott wanted to know who's responsible for the mess the District is in. He said \$8 million is a lot of money. He said it speaks to the District being fiscally responsible. Adults make mistakes the children have to pay.

President London said the District is required under Prop 39 to have an independent citizens' oversight committee for the money the District uses in its capital program. She said every year the committee issues an annual report to the Board.

Timothy White Associate Superintendent for Facilities Planning thanked the Measure B Committee for their oversight of the expenditures associated with the Measure B Bond approved by the citizens of Oakland in 2006.

Patricia Williams, Chairperson, Measure B Committee, said the Measure B Bond is a six year bond approved in 2006 for \$435 million. State law requires an independent citizens' bond oversight committee. Ms. Williams provided highlights of the bond:

- The bond to date has spent \$401 million for 110 projects.
- This year \$67.4 million of the bond was spent.
- Projects covered by the bond are dispersed throughout the city.
- The work done comprise of modernization and new construction projects (classrooms, student restrooms, digital technology libraries, multi-purpose rooms, cafeterias, wellness centers, child development centers, alarm replacement, playground and athletic fields and play structures).
- The bond supports the local economy. The District has awarded work to 152 local contractors. Sixty million of the bond has gone back into the City of Oakland.
- Measure B funds can be leveraged to apply for grants and matching funds. The District has brought in \$30 million.

Board Member Comments

Director Gallo thanked the committee for their work.

President London complimented the committee on their current annual report.

Vice President Hinton Hodge thanked the committee for being the model for how best to do this work.

Public Comments

Bob Mandel said committee members talked about using the money right. He said the District invested \$700,000 at Santa Fe School and now the District is turning the school over to Emeryville School District. He said when you look at the Measure B budget it includes \$2.3 million for Lazear School that is now a charter school. He said the Board has pursued a policy that is taking apart public education in the city.

Thearse Pecot said under this Bond Measure the District has wasted \$1 million in 2011 with the improvements to a schoolyard, installing computers and installing an alarm system for a school the District proposes to close and lease to Emeryville School District.

Jack Gerson said in the discussion on Special Education nearly \$2 million was found and

\$2 million was the justification for closing the five schools. He said the District could have found the money and the Board did not want to.

Ben Tapscott said \$435 million – Lincoln School has a new building that's bigger than McClymonds High School; Montgomery Wards was torn down and replaced with Cesar Chavez School; Oakland Tech was refurbished, etc. He said McClymonds could have been thought about. He said would like to see a beautiful building in West Oakland and real football field for Fremont High School.

Meeting

Mr. White said the General Obligation Bond is guided by the framework of the District's Strategic Plan. This bond measure is necessary for the District to in provide Full Service Community spaces for the community. The District wants to continue to provide state of the art facilities for its students. As schools are made available under Prop 39, MOU and Facilities Use Agreements, whatever improvements are made are available to whoever occupies the properties. Currently about \$70 million has been spent in project improvements at school sites that currently house charter schools. As the District moves forward these opportunities will be available for all students in the District. Mr. White asked the Board to support this issue saying all children deserve a quality education and this is a step along that road.

Public Comments

Bruce Buckelew said in order for every student in the District to prepare themselves for jobs and opportunities, they must have access to computers and broadband internet. He said technology has the potential when used correctly.

Charles Wilson, Principal, Korematsu School, said the school is embarking on a new project, the Blended Learning Project. The school received a grant from the Always Dream Foundation to support tablet computers in kindergarten classes. He said these innovations will not be possible unless the bond measure is adopted and changes are made to the infrastructure of the school.

Gary Borden said the California Charter School Association opposed the bond. He said the Association does not believe the bond goes far enough on behalf of the one quarter of Oakland's students who are in public charter schools today. He said there are between 3,000 and 5,000 students left behind as a result of the bond and asked that the Board amend the bond prior to adoption.

Tracey Logan said she works for the District's Technology Services Department and spends a lot of time at school sites and sees the creative work teachers are doing in the classrooms. She said she also see teachers bringing their own laptop computers, rigged wireless connection and work within the facilities they have to get their job done to create 21st century learning environments for students. She said it is an issue of equity.

Scott Douglas said the focus needs to be on preparing students for the jobs they are entering into. He said without the education, the District does not produce the number of students needed in the job economy. The bond is an excellent opportunity to focus on technology and putting students in the 21st century.

Gee Kin said this bond can allow the District to leverage technology to help every child achieve the common core standards that will elevate students to problem solve and prepares them to do well in life and careers. The bond allows every District student access to technology in the classroom and at home to achieve their full potential.

Jennifer Rakowski said she supports the bond. She said the bond is an excellent way to bring the community together to expand funds that the school need.

Jim Mordecai said he supports the bond. He said the work done with the previous bond is great. He parking was not included in the bond.

Board Member Comments

Director Gallo said this is one of the most important actions the Board will take in a long time. He said the District is behind other school districts in terms of technology but believes the District can catch up. He said he supports the bond. He said the greatest gift we can give the children is the financial support in its schools.

Director Dobbins asked for a legal opinion on whether the District can legally give public funds to a Catholic School that has a charter school on the campus.

General Counsel Minor said in view of the number of inquiries that has come to Board Members on this topic the Superintendent did look at the amount of Measure B funds that have been spent in facilities in the District occupied by charter schools and the numbers are quite significant.

Director Kakishiba said with funds from the last bond, District buildings are being fixed and new schools are being built. He commented on the statements made by the representative from the State Charter School Association. He said it important that the Board understand what it is the charter school community is interested in terms of the bond measure. He said he hopes the District can come to an accommodation around public support, opposition or neutrality of the State Charter Association.

Vice President Hinton Hodge said if we are talking about linking technology with instruction that will have implications around how the District is structured. She said to have opposition to the bond is detrimental for the District. Vice President Hinton Hodge proposed the following amendment to the motion: "That this bond would serve Oakland Public Charter Schools that inhabit District properties."

Director Spearman said when a bond is passed it will be for Oakland Public Schools properties. She said the District has so many needs that need to be fulfilled first before the District goes to someone that wants to dance to a different drummer.

Director Spearman, the maker of the motion, did not accept the proposed amendment from Vice President Hinton Hodge. The proposed amendment did not receive a second.

Superintendent Smith clarified saying the amount of bond proceeds supporting charter schools is over \$55 million.

General Counsel Minor gave an example of Learning Without Limits School which opened a new building in September 2011 costing \$15 million in Measure B funds and it's now a charter school.

President London reminded Board Members of the discussions that led the Board to this point. She said there was a lot of excitement about nutrition services. She said the Facilities Master Plan is carefully written and talks about all the priorities. President London cautioned the Board to leave the language the way it is and get to the Registrar of Voters and let the campaigning start.

Secretary Rakestraw reminded President London the vote requires a two-thirds votes of Aye to put the question before the voters.

Timothy White, Associate Superintendent for Facilities Planning, provided an overview of the bidding process.

Mr. White said the La Escuelita Educational Complex contains MetWest High School, KDOL, two CDC's and community kitchens. He said this facility is one the most innovative designs in Northern California and the District is receiving awards because of the design of the project. The facility is a zero net energy designed to generate its own power.

The second phase of the project the District had a proposal process. The Lease Leaseback delivery method has been a method of preference for the District. With the Lease Leaseback method the District has been able to generate up to 70% participation of local residents on the projects. He noted the circulation of local dollars from the General Obligation Bond Funds that comes from Oakland residents can be circulated back into the pockets of residents at the level of 70%.

Bidding Process

- On January 18th the Request for Proposal was issued. The District had a process for proposal evaluation.
- Five proposals was received and all five were interviewed in February. A list of three vendors was short listed.
- From the short list each vendor was given an opportunity to look at pre-construction services.
- There was about five or six different rounds of meetings over the course of one month for pre-construction services. This gives the District the opportunity to lock in a guaranteed maximum price. The spending has a ceiling as opposed the typical method of design, bid, and build.
- The five pre-construction meetings took place in March.
- After March the District went through a process looking at deliverables and determining who would be selected to negotiate with.
- In April and May the District entered into a negotiation process and came up with the recommendation being submitted to the Board today for approval. Mr. White said the recommendation to the Board is to accept staff's recommendation and approve the construction contractor that will complete the work at La Escuelita Educational Complex.

Public Comments

Kira Comini said she is a small local Oakland fencing and railing company. Ms. Comini thanked the District for its support and said the contract is huge for them.

Terry Miner said he is a local small business owner that will do the structural steel fabrication on the project. He said the company is looking forward to their first project with

the District.

Len Turner a small local business owner said if the Board adopts the staff's recommendation, Turner Construction will do the structural concrete work, site work, general site services, rough carpentry and a few other things. He said the District is allowing his company to grow. The company will have two sub-contractors working under them just as they once worked under McCarthy Construction.

Samatha Hong said she is currently attending UC San Diego studying mechanical engineering. Ms. Hong talked about her internship with ACE and McCarthy Construction. She said through this internship she gained engineering experience and the different careers in construction.

Superintendent Smith said it is through Eric Johnson the District has been able to come up with this partnership to share Chief Williams and for him to be on loan from the Oakland Housing Authority.

Superintendent Smith asked Interim Police Chief to address the Board.

Chief Williams said in his first week in the District he met with Director Spearman, Chairperson of the Safety Committee, to discuss his vision and that of the Police Services Department. During this meeting Chief Williams said he and Director Spearman talked about being a professional organization; rebuilding public trust; being accountable to the public; holding officers accountable for their actions; and community involvement in the Police Department. Director Spearman said she would give him her support and stand by him and he said she has. He noted Vice President Hinton Hodge formed the Ad Hoc Committee on Police Services. He said this committee look at issues that's affecting the police department and the community. One issue is the complaint process regarding police officers. The District has nothing in place. He said through Vice President Hinton Hodge he met members of the Black Organizing Project and started having real conversations about those issues. He said the committee talked about how other departments handle complaints and suggested looking at the Oakland Housing Department because the procedure works there. He said the committee took a model from that and drafted this report. Together with Legal Counsel he thinks they came up with something that works, something that starts building the public's trust, holds officers accountable and holds the Chief accountable to the Board.

Board Member Comments

Director Dobbins inquired about the process if he completes a complaint form.

Chief Williams said once someone files a complaint, it will be investigated. There will be forty-five days to look into the complainant. At that time the department will talk to the complainant, other witnesses that may have been identified and the officer involved to make a determination if the allegations are sustained or not sustained. He said if you don't agree with the decision, you can appeal to the Superintendent. If you don't agree with the Superintendent you can appeal to the Board.

General Counsel Minor added that initially in a proposal from the Black Organizing Project Police Services would provide semi-annual reports to the Board on statistical data, results of the complaints and a Resolution at a regularly noticed meeting.

Director Yee said this could have been taken in a different direction but the Chief took it in a constructive direction and the results are before the Board today.

Director Spearman said she thinks a complaint procedure should have citizen's participation and this does not.

Public Comments

Marshae McDonald encouraged the Board to adopt the Complaint Procedures. She said

the Black Organizing Project has worked with General Counsel Minor and the Chief of Police Services to create a clear and transparent process for youth, teachers and community members to come forward and make complaints when they feel they have been mis-treated.

Julia Mendoza said the process was a beautiful culmination of people with a lot of good intentions to create something that gives community a space to come back to and articulate what's going on in their community and a space for the School Police to respond.
