

## **Ensuring accurate attendance accounting**

### **Attendance Specialists - Daily responsibilities**

- Monitoring attendance daily
- Reminding teacher to complete Classroom Attendance (Every student must have a code for every scheduled class period.)
- Entering missing attendance data into Aeries
- Calling families of absent students

### Adjustments for this year:

- Online attendance Code Update tools
- Attendance Records Check Dashboard
- Attendance window extended to 6:30pm.





#### **Supports for Attendance Specialists:**

- **Professional Development**
- 1:1 PDs for newer specialists
- 12 Clerical Mentors
- Partnership with Community School Managers & Net. Attendance Liaisons
- Central Attendance dashboard











### Supporting students participation/attendance

### **OUSD Attendance Plan - Distance Learning**

#### When a student is absent:

- Daily Intervention
- Automatic call for the day/period
- **Attendance Specialist calls** guardians individually and documents excused or unexcused absence
- At 3, 6, and 9 Absences: Letter is emailed / mailed to families about absences

#### At three absences overall:

- Attendance Team implements appropriate intervention using student attendance and connectivity data.
- Student added to Attendance & Intervention Watchlist dashboard.
  - Sites to know which students need an intervention and how effective the intervention is.
  - Central office monitors and supports sites (i.e. Network Attendance Liaisons, Office of Equity's Family Navigators, Network Supts & Partners)

**Virtual Tutoring** 

Volunteers matched with individual students










### Ensuring students and staff have the tech they need

  - b. Upgrading computers for classroom teachers to improve









