Adoption of Resolution 1112-0253 – Request to the State Superintendent of Public Instruction for Renewal of Alternative School of Choice Waiver of Education Codes pertaining to Computing Average Daily Attendance (ADA).

## **Background**

A one paragraph explanation of why the consultant's services are needed. Gateway to College is a nationally recognized education model serving youth who have dropped out of high school. In June 2008, the District authorized the establishment of Gateway as an Alternative education high school to be operated on the Laney Campus. Students attending Gateway are concurrently enrolled in Laney and Oakland Unified School and from their first day earn credits toward a high school diploma and an Associate's Degree. Gateway's student body is largely comprised of foster youth, adjudicated youth, teen parents, and students recovering from homelessness or drug and alcohol abuse.

### Discussion

One paragraph summary of the scope of work.

Gateway to College at Laney Alternative High School is a school of high expectations and equally high levels of community support with the goal that vulnerable youth receive a second chance to re-engage in education in a meaningful way and create better lives for themselves.

The District will seek and obtain all necessary renewal waivers from the California Department of Education in order to fully continue to support Gateway. Under the Waiver Authority of the Education Code Section 58509, the particular Education Code or the California Code of Regulations Section(s) or portion thereof to be waived is: Computing Average Daily Attendance.

This is a request to again seek waiver of the following sections of the California education Code related to computation of average daily attendance for high schools.

- Education Code §41601 Reports of average daily attendance
- Education Code §46202 Reduction of districts apportionment
- Education Code §46300 Method of computing average daily attendance
- Education Code §46305 Reports of active enrollment
- Education Code §48802 Allowance and Appointments for concurrently enrolled students

The aforementioned sections provide the process and unit of measurement for student accounting procedures used in apportioning and distributing state ADA funds for education. In particular, section 46300 provides, in part, that in computing average daily attendance, pupils should be under the immediate supervision and control of an employee of the District who possesses a valid certification document.

Under the California Department of Education regulation and the Alternative School of Choice Waiver Request for (CDE form AEW-1 (Rev 3/10), no public hearing is required if the renewal waiver is not controversial. In addition, meet and confer with bargaining units and review by the SSC are not required if the renewal waiver is not controversial. OEA and the SSC have been advised that the District is seeking renewal of the waivers. There is no controversy related to the Gateway program.

Request to the State Superintendent of Public Instruction for renewal of the Alternative School of Choice Waiver of Education Codes pertaining to **Computing Average Daily Attendance (ADA)**. This is a renewal request to waive the following sections of the California Code related to computation of average daily attendance for high schools: Education Code § 41601 — Reports of average daily attendance, Education Code § 46202 — Reduction of districts apportionment, Education Code § 46300 — Method of computing average daily attendance, Education Code § 46305 - Reports of active enrollment, Education Code § 48802 — Allowances and Apportionments for concurrently enrolled students for Fiscal Year 2012-2013.

**WHEREAS**, The Oakland Unified School District (District) and the Peralta Community College District operate the Gateway to College alternative high school on the Laney College Campus; and

**WHEREAS**, the aforementioned sections provide the process and unit of measurement for student accounting procedures used in apportioning and distributing state ADA funds for education; and

**WHEREAS**, section 46300 provides, in part, that in computing average daily attendance, pupils should be under the immediate supervision and control of an employee of the District who possesses a valid certification document; and

**WHEREAS**, the program is offered on a college campus, the District is requesting renewal of the waiver renewal of the method of computing average daily attendance for K-12 schools; and

**WHEREAS**, the students are under the supervision and control of a community college instruction; and

**WHEREAS**, under the agreement with the District, Laney (Peralta Community College District) will not claim Full Time Equivalent Student (FTES) apportionment and instead, the District will claim ADA on behalf of the alternative school established at Laney College (Gateway to College) under the method identified in section 58001.3; and

**WHEREAS**, under the requirement that students be under the supervision and control of a certificated District employee, the District believes that supervision by a qualified community college faculty person satisfies the intent and purpose of the law; and

**WHEREAS**, Section 66700 of the Education Code provides, in part, that California Community Colleges are part of the public school system of the state. Section 53405 of the California Code of Regulation provides that references to certificated employees in the California Code of Regulations, as it pertains to community colleges, apply to community

college faculty who meet the minimum qualifications required by the Code. In support of the conclusion that supervision by certificated community college employees satisfies that statute, we note that students can receive high school credit for courses taught by community college faculty under section 48800 (c) of the Education Code; and

**WHEREAS**, Gateway to College at Laney College is part of the Early College High School Network which is listed as a type of school that can be established under the statutory framework of section 58500 et seq. of the Education Code. The school was established in accordance with statutory procedures and approved by the governing board of the Oakland Unified School District and the California Department of Education, and

**WHEREAS**, renewal of the waiver of the aforementioned K-12 provisions is necessary to continue to fully implement the Gateway to College model in the college setting; and

WHEREAS, the District is requesting renewal of the waiver for one year; and

**WHEREAS**, the request by the District for and granting of the renewal of the Waiver by the State Superintendent of Public Instruction will allow Gateway to College to continue to operate on the Laney College campus and collect apportionment, which it would otherwise be denied; and

**WHEREAS**, the request by the District and granting of the renewal of the Waiver by the State Superintendent of Public Instruction will not have a negative fiscal impact on, or otherwise harm, the District; and

**WHEREAS**, as provided by California Department of Education regulations a public hearing is not required for renewal requests that are not controversial; and

WHEREAS, this renewal waiver request is not controversial; and

**WHEREAS**, at its May 9, 2012 meeting, the Board of Education authorized the District to seek waiver of Education Codes pertaining to ADA; and

This is a renewal request to waive the following sections of the California Education Code related to school attendance and minimum school day, minimum school week and minimum school-year.

- Education Code § 41601 Reports of average daily attendance
- Education Code § 46202 Reduction of districts appointment
- Education Code § 46300 Method of computing average daily attendance
- Education Code § 46305 Reports of active enrollment
- Education Code § 48802 Allowances and Apportionments for concurrently enrolled students

The aforementioned sections provide the process and unit of measurement for student accounting procedures used in apportioning and distributing state ADA funds for education. In particular, section 46300 provides, in part, that in computing average daily attendance, pupils should be under the immediate supervision and control of an employee of the district who possesses a valid certification document.

2. **Desired outcome/rationale.** State what you hope to accomplish with the waiver. Describe briefly the circumstances that brought about the request and why the waiver is necessary to achieve improved student performance and/or streamline or facilitate local agency operations.

The legislation authorizing the establishment of alternative schools of choice provides, in part, that school districts may establish alternative schools based on the premise that the best learning takes place when the student learns because of his or her desire to learn. Alternative schools and programs of choice are often characterized by responsiveness to instructional style differences, the positive consequences of being a school of choice, and small unit size. The Gateway to College alternative high school fits this profile.

Gateway to College at Laney College ("Gateway") serves 350 students, 16 to 20 years old, who have dropped out of school and provides a second chance for students to get back on a path leading to economic and educational opportunity. In keeping with the statutory purpose, the program achieves success by maintaining a learning situation that maximizes student self-motivation and encourages a student in his own time to follow his interests.

Because the program is offered on a college campus, the District is requesting a renewal of the waiver of the method of computing average daily attendance for K-12 schools and the requirement that students be under the supervision and control of a certificated K-12 employee. Since Gateway to College is a college-based program, we submit that section 58001.3 of Title 5 of the California Code of Regulations (CCR) provides an alternative and approved method for apportioning and distributing ADA funds in the program. Under agreement with OUSD, Laney (Peralta Community College District) does not claim FTES apportionment. Instead, OUSD claims ADA on behalf of the alternative school established at Laney College (Gateway) under the method identified in section 58001.3.

Regarding the requirement that students be under the supervision and control of a certificated district employee, we believe that supervision by a qualified community college faculty person satisfies the intent and purpose of the law. Section 66700 of the Education code provides, in part, that California Community Colleges are part of the public school system of the state. Section 53405 of the CCR provides that references to certificated employees in the CCR, as it pertains to community colleges, apply to community college faculty who meet the minimum qualifications required by the Code. In support of the conclusion that supervision by certificated community college employees satisfies that statue, we note that students can receive high school credit for courses taught by community college faculty under section 48800 (c) of the Education Code. Hence, a renewal waiver of the aforementioned K-12 provisions is necessary to fully implement the Gateway to College model in the college setting. The District is requesting a renewal of the waiver for one year.

#### Evaluation Procedure

An annual evaluation, pursuant to Education Code Section 58510, will be performed in accordance with guidelines established by the California Department of Education and the State Superintendent of Public Instruction. The evaluation will be conducted by the OUSD Office of Alternative Education and will include input from key stakeholders such as teachers, students, and parents and guardians.

The methodology used will be consistent with evaluations of other OUSD Alternative Schools and Programs. The evaluation will include student performance data on K-12 mandatory testing and will examine features such as the following to determine their impact on student learning outcomes:


- Sustainable Partnership (e.g., advisory committee, referrals, information sharing systems, etc.)
- Integration of the program into college (e.g., attendance on college calendar, college orientation, flexible class schedule)
- Dual credit (e.g., diploma and testing requirements are aligned with college courses, counselors trained in high school and advising systems)
- Adequate teaching and administrative staff
- Collaboration between faculty members and between students (e.g., team based approach to student success)
- Teaching and Learning (e.g., rigor and relevance in the curriculum)

- Student Support systems (e.g., focus on academic and non-academic barriers)
- Professional Development for faculty and staff (e.g., mission and core values communicated, roles and responsibilities are clearly communicated)

Dear Superintendent Smith:

This letter is in response to your request for renewal of the waivers pertaining to your district's alternative school of choice, the Gateway to College (GTC) at Laney College. The California *Education Code (EC)* sections you have requested to waive are listed in the attached table, Overview of Gateway to College Waiver Renewal Requests.

Your renewal request explains that the GTC Program is being offered in partnership with Laney College. The program is based on the national GTC model, which has achieved success serving at-risk youth aged sixteen to twenty who have dropped out of high school and are significantly behind in credits. Your request explains that the program achieves success by combining high academic expectations with one-on-one advising and support. A key component of the program is that the district is able to claim average daily attendance (ADA) for GTC students who are taking all their classes at Laney College from Laney College instructors. We understand that this unusual arrangement is necessary to provide sufficient resources for the labor-intensive support these students will need to succeed.

Based on the unusual nature of the requested funding and the limited achievement of objectives, I approve your waiver renewals for one year with the following conditions:

- Your district will develop an audit process that will demonstrate that ADA funding received for the GTC Program was used only for the GTC Program. My staff will work with you to finalize an acceptable audit process and documentation.
- The GTC staff will conduct an end-of-semester review in addition to a year-end review. It is anticipated that an earlier analysis of objectives—particularly those relating to course grades and attendance—could result in timely changes that could lead to greater student achievement.

The information gathered from the end-of-semester reviews should be referenced in the annual evaluation report required by *EC* Section 58510, including progress achieved in meeting the objectives and how the evaluation results and program adjustments will be used to develop an action plan for the subsequent year.

These waivers will be effective for the 2011–12 school year only. We will review audit findings and achievement of program objectives before approving it for the second year. I applaud your efforts to reengage dropouts, and look forward to hearing how implementation of the recommendations in your 2009–10 annual report affected student achievement.
