Subject	TEMPORARY BORROWING BETWEEN FUNDS – FISCAL YEAR 2014-15
Action Requested	Adoption by Board of Education of Resolution No. 1415-0015 —requesting for Temporary Borrowing between funds for Fiscal Year 2014-15.
Background	The cash flow of revenues during a fiscal year does not always match the cash flow of expenditures during that year. This creates cash shortages in some months and in some funds, while other funds have excess cash. Education Code 42603 provides that the governing board of any school district may direct those moneys held in any fund or account may be temporarily transferred to another fund or account of the district for payment of obligations. This tool allows the District to meet the cash needs of each fund, within legal parameters. Further analysis of the District's cash flow projections show cash fluctuations throughout the fiscal year that could lead to temporary insufficient amounts of cash for the Adult Ed, Early Childhood and Nutrition Services programs. This is due to State deferral of cash and the cost reimbursement nature of certain Federal and State contracts.
Discussion	The resolution should give staff the authority to temporarily transfer cash between funds (interfund borrowing) and allow staff to continue to effectively manage cash flows.
Recommendation	Adoption by Board of Education of Resolution No. 1415-0015 - Requesting for Temporary Borrowing between funds for Fiscal Year 2014-15.

RESOLUTION OF BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE OAKLAND UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT Resolution No. 1415-0015

Temporary Borrowing between Funds for Fiscal Year 2014-15

WHEREAS, the receipt of revenues during the fiscal year does not always match the disbursement of expenses, especially with recent changes in funding for federal programs and the State's deferral of payments owed to school districts; and

WHEREAS, Education Code Section 42603 permits the Governing Board of any school district to direct that monies held in any fund or account may be temporarily transferred to another fund or account of the district for payment of obligations; and

WHEREAS, such borrowed funds shall not be available for appropriation or be considered income to the borrowing fund or account; and

WHEREAS, such borrowing shall occur only when the fund or account receiving the money will earn sufficient income, during the current fiscal year, to repay the amount transferred; and

WHEREAS, no more than 75 percent of the maximum of moneys held in any fund or account during a current fiscal year may be transferred; and

WHEREAS, amounts transferred shall be repaid either in the same fiscal year, or in the following fiscal year if the transfer takes place within the final 120 calendar days of a fiscal year,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Governing Board of the Oakland Unified School District, in accordance with the provisions of Education Code Section 42603, hereby specifically authorizes for fiscal year 2014-15 the temporarily transfer of funds as needed for cash-flow purposes among eligible funds of the District; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that said borrowed funds shall be and are hereby authorized to be repaid as funds become available pursuant to the requirements of Education Code Section 42603.
