The other would be a parcel tax to pay the salaries of maintenance workers and other related expenses for properly maintaining Oakland schools. Now I am going to read brief summaries of each one

"To repair or replace old and deteriorating plumbing, sewers, lighting, heating, and electrical systems in existing buildings; repair classrooms, restrooms and other school facilities that need to be brought up to current safety standards; replace deteriorating portable classrooms; renovate libraries, science and computer labs; and repair and replace old and worn out roofs; shall the Oakland Unified School District issue \$475 million in bonds, which would add \$60 per \$100,000 of <u>assessed</u> value, <u>not</u> market value to property tax bills each year, with independent audits, and all money used by Oakland public schools?"

## Now, I'd like to talk just about the possible parcel tax measure for Oakland schools.

- 11a. The Oakland Unified School District is considering the parcel tax measure in order to maintain current staffing levels for maintenance and building workers. They say that although budget cuts have already resulted in cutbacks, without additional funds, more of these workers may have to be laid off. If this occurs, emergency facility needs which are now addressed within one day, such as sewer backups and leaking roofs, will have to wait 2 or 3 days for repairs to be made; and other general, non-emergency problems, such as broken toilets and alarm systems, may take up anywhere from 2 weeks to 2 months to be repaired.
