Project Labor Agreement which includes project stability [no strikes and no lockouts], the Alternative Dispute Resolution Process, the availability of a skilled work force, and local hiring.

Local Hiring Program

- 1. The goal is 50% of all hours worked will be worked by Oakland residents on a craft by craft basis if the workers are willing and capable to work on the projects.
- 2. Twenty percent of all hours are to be worked by apprentices if apprentices are willing and capable to work on the projects.
- 3. One hundred percent of the apprentices will be residents of Oakland if the workers are willing and capable of working on the projects and a maximum of District graduates.
- 4. Thirty two percent of all hours worked by Oakland residents; fifteen percent of all hours worked by apprentices; forty seven percent of all apprentices hours are being worked by Oakland residents.

Mr. Sloan said the Project Labor Agreement started in 2004, local workers were getting six percent of all the hours. In 2008, local workers received 25% of all hours worked and apprentices received 15.2% hours and 42% of the apprentices hours went to Oakland residents. In 2001, 32% of the hours overall went to Oakland residents, 15% for apprentices and 47% of the apprentice hours went to Oakland residents.

Challenges of the Project Labor Agreement

Grievances - In 2010, 15 grievances were received. Five of the grievances were resolved in Step I, discussions between the contractor and the union(s). Ten grievances escalated to Joint Administrative Committee which can take months to resolve. No grievances have ever been referred to arbitration.

Challenges for the Program

- 1. Unions are not focused on Oakland, they are countywide or regional. Sometimes workers are from all over the region and 46 counties [particularly carpenters].
- 2. All local hiring programs in the area are drawing from the same pool of Oakland residents.
- 3. More than 30% of the contractors are located outside Alameda County bringing their own work force.

Next Steps in Local Hiring

- 1. Working with the project managers so there is no notice to proceed with contractors until they have submitted plans for compliance that are acceptable.
- 2. Working to modifying the language of the Project Labor Agreement making sure the usage of Oakland graduates is stronger.
- 3. Working with the Oakland Housing Development and Cypress Mandela Training Program to identify local workers.
- 4. Meet with the unions on a monthly basis to talk about progress and how to improve the program.

Timothy White said this item is in response to a set of portable structures on the campus of Glenview Elementary School that called into question the suitability of the portables; the foundations; and dry rot in five portables.

Issue #1

Mr. White said the Facilities Department concurs with the engineering report on Portable 1 and Portable 5. He said the plan is to look at the repair of dry rot in those portables this summer with the work being done by the Buildings & Grounds Department. He said he believes the portables can be brought up to acceptable standards in terms of the dry rot.

Issue #2

In portables 1 through 5 - Attachment details, foundations, and the concern for how the portables may respond in a sesmic event. Mr. White said an analysis of the structures will be done and the cafeteria will be looked at. The report will make a determination on the proper type of attachment for the foundation system and determine how the District proceeds.

Short Term Item Fire extinguishers.

Long Term Plan

Mr. White said the long range plan is consistent with the Board's priority in the use of Measure "B" funds, capital funds, and the replacement of the old portables.

Public Comments

Michael Sasson, Glenview Parent, said there was some list in the District that gave priority for these portable replacements to happen and that list was changed. He said he would appreciate a process where schools are notified they are on the list but the position has changed. He said some school communities were approached to have a discussion and Glenview should have been informed.

Mr. White said the Facilities Master Plan is the document Mr. Sasson is referring to in terms of a list that talked about a set of projects that were bond eligible and categorized in several different formats. He said the Facilities Master Plan was developed in 2004-05 while under State Receivership. The Master Plan was updated and it had a lot of moving parts and unknowns. The Master Plan also looked at demographics, programmatic suitability, and created a matrix that allowed for the selection to be done as fluidly as possible given the District did not know where Small Schools were going to be created and where overcrowding may exist. He said there were also declining enrollment; Small School's creation; the creation of Small Schools that did not exist but were in an incubator stage; and the creation of Small Schools that was going to be housed at existing school sites and divided up. The Master Plan attempted to give the District the flexibility to make those kinds of decisions. He said two years ago the Board engaged in a discussion about the overcrowding that existed in North Oakland [Chabot Elementary, Hillcrest Elementary, Thornhill Elementary, Montclair Elementary and Kaiser Elementary]. A decision was voted on and approved to give allocations to address the overcrowding areas in North Oakland. He said the allocation went to Montclair Elementary and that is how Montclair got ahead of Glenview.

Vice President London suggested to parents through the Measure "B" Citizens Oversight Committee they can learn more about how the Facilities Department works.

Vice President London asked Mr. White to outline the Facilities Mater Plan that will be developed over the summer.

Mr. White said the District is engaging in a process to update the District's asset inventory and how the inventory is planned to be used over the next ten years. He said the evaluation of assets will be looked at and developed into a Facilities Master Plan that looks at the traditional elements of what the Building & Grounds needs are and what the programmatic needs are going forward. The Facilities Master Plan will take about a year to complete with Phase I being completed before the calendar year is over.

Hugh Morrison said an immediate area of concern is Glenview's cafeteria which is located in two portables and has no capacity numbers. He said at times, all four first grade classes and three second grade classes are in the cafeteria and that seems like a fire hazard. He noted that Glenview School was told two and a half years ago by District administration and the Buildings & Grounds Department the school was next on the list and that is why the community did not come out at that time. He said the school community would like to be considered for current bond funds for the projected spending at Glenview School.

Mr. White said \$424 million out of the \$435 million Measure "B" Bond has been subscribed for use. He said \$11 million remains unallocated and it will be used as a contingency.

Chairperson Gallo said in the meantime the safety concern should be taken care of and the

District should recognize the K-8 model for Glenview in the design plan.
