Relational Culture

Resolution Item	Current Status
Ensure there is staffing for community positions at priority schools	Expanded Community School Managers to 49 schools.
Expand Parent Teacher Home Visits	354 teachers/staff trained in PTHV model, across 42 sites, 10 training sessions took place June-Sep 189 PTHVs logged across 7 sites, July-Sep*
Expand staffing to support social, emotional, academic needs.	Increased social workers (7 FTE) or partnerships with mental health organizations.
Create Peer to Peer Mentoring Structures / Networks	Peer Restorative Justice teams at 10 elementary, 7 middle, and 5 high schools.

Resolution Item	Current Status
Create intentional Healing & Restorative Spaces for staff and students.	At least 64% of schools implementing community building/healing circles in restorative restart 2021-22
Utilize COST / MTSS to facilitate additional supports for students	Universal Mental Health Screening conducted at 21% of schools, in-process at 16%, with 63% preparing to implement. To date a total of 732 students referred for mental health services. Central screening scheduled following the mid-winter break.
Partner with City and County to maximize resources for students	Oakland Thrives Leadership Council selected Adolescent Mental Health as as 2021-22 City/County/District #1 Priority. Conducting a gap analysis. ABCHCS Investment of 14 million in Medi-Cal MH Services

Resolution Item	Current Status
<p>Leverage the advisory structure to create a space for collective trust building and support within secondary</p>	<p>Advisories have been used to implement restorative community building and to conduct mental health/wellness screening. Structure for advisory varies across networks. All Middle Schools host advisory.</p>
<p>Provide a community of practice that includes training and capacity building for adults who hold Advisories in middle and high schools.</p>	<p>PD on Sown to Grow in progress at 13 secondary schools. Second cohort of schools planning for implement in January.</p>
<p>Create a library of Advisory curricula organized by grade-level span that is accessible for schools across the District.</p>	<p>39 schools implementing Sown to Grow digital social emotional learning platform in Advisory. One site implementing Panorama Ed Platform.</p>

Advisory & High School Credit

Resolution Item	Current Status
Pilot Innovative and Flexible Credit Recovery Programs	Created comprehensive Central credit recovery program. Expanded staffing. Offer global (centrally administered) credit recovery to be started in spring. Will continue to offer in the summer in addition to current summer model.
Expand opportunities for summer learning including work-based learning	In Summer 2021 doubled the size of work based learning offerings. Expect to continue to grow in Summer 2022.
Develop targeted strategies to outreach to and support students who are not on track to graduate as well as students who have been chronically absent	Additional staffing (case managers) at schools are providing targeted supports and outreach to reconnect students to school.
