Superintendent Smith said he was able to attend many recent celebrations, including the African American Scholarship ceremony and the Buildings and Grounds scholarship awards ceremony.

Leroy Gaines, principal, Acorn-Woodland, was introduced. Mr. Gaines said there is a new library that opened in January. He stated Acorn has an enrollment of 235 students and includes a large percentage of English Language Learners. Many of the students also qualify for free and reduced lunch. The African American student population is at 10 percent and the Latino American student population is at 78 percent. There has been a steady increase in the school's API over the last few years. Mr. Gaines stated the school's theory of action is to provide a rigorous standard-driven instructional program.

Mr. Gaines stated the school has an SSC and ELAC. Every classroom has two parent

leaders who help organize the parents in the classroom to support the students in the classroom.

Director Gallo commended school leadership and students for the API growth.

Director Spearman said she grew up in the Acorn-Woodland area. She said the school started to rise from day 1 The test scores have risen above the 800 mark and the school has enormous support from the community.

Brian Dunstan, parent, Sequoia, stated the school will be losing two teachers which will affect class size for next year. He encouraged the District to hold meetings before the start of the school year to come up with a real budget so that the issue of class size can be resolved prior to the start of the new year. He asked the Board to direct any new monies to the hiring of teachers and reducing class size.

Brett Farver, parent, Sequoia, requested the Board to call a Special Session once the State budget is adopted in order to reconsider the District budget so that teachers can be hired prior to the beginning of the school year.

Tim Sullivan, parent, Sequoia, stated Sequoia is a model school and test scores have been increasing every year. The school has a diverse student population and students are being put at risk in the classroom because large class size affects the students during the entire year.

Sharon Blaschka, parent, Sequoia, stated if the District receives extra funds, the money is for the sites. She asked the Board to keep the students as a priority.

Kara deKernion, teacher, Sequoia, said the District should be creative in its approach toward the schools.

Lisa Rasler, Kindergarten teacher, Sequoia, stated the school is facing a complete restructuring because of RBB. She would like the school to remain as it is.

Sonia Thacher, District employee, asked the Board to include children with Severe Disabilities in its priorities.

John Zaro, parent, Sequoia, said the District's task is difficult and he urged the District to not lay off teachers.

Vincente Cruz, West Oakland resident, said he is getting tired of hearing people say the money is not there. He said we choose not to spend the money. The Board needs to take a more radical role in its demands from the County, State, and Federal governments.

Robert Coleman resubmitted a charter petition for Legacies of Excellence.

Pamela Reed, Counselor, Skyline High School, said they have four counselors who have been laid off and do not have jobs for next year. They have four counselors who have been consolidated from their school sites and do not know where they will work next year. She referenced a consultant contract who is a retired counselor who will be conducting academic reviews of students and perform other responsibilities of counselors. She asked the Board to consider placing the eight counselors back in their current job sites for next year.

Mark Airgood, teacher, Brewer, stated it is fundamental to have small class sizes at all levels and it is a huge gain that Oakland made. He said to remove all the counselors from Skyline does not make sense.

Vincent Toliver, Music Teacher, Skyline, asked the Board what they see as the obstacles to having good faith negotiations and resolutions? He asked if we can set a date for authentic win for our students?

Tania Kappner, teacher, Oakland Tech, stated the increase in class sizes is unacceptable. School sites do not know how many teachers they will have and the District is behind in getting schedules out to teachers. To cut counselors is separate and unequal. The District has broken its promises to the immigrant teachers and people are suing the District for their right to stay in this country. She said the Board needs to stop implementing the cuts and make a fight for the money, stop all the layoffs and have all the counselors back in their classrooms.

Alice Phillips, counselor, Brewer, said students' performance in eighth grade is a strong signifier of success in high school and the best dropout prevention. The counselors facilitate presentations and programs for students, assist with applications, help with translation, and support students throughout high school. She said Frick, Bret Harte and Westlake are losing counselors next year. The work is being outsourced.

Wandra Boyd said the District should examine the number of students who are not programmed properly. She thanked Board Members for attending the DAC Conference. We are initiating the process of training parents. She is a member of Jack and Jill of America and they will be at Lakeview in June to clean school grounds and provide community services.

Sepeedeh Zapala, parent, Westlake and Peralta, said we have to find a way to make everybody pay attention and make a difference.

Lori Davis said it is sad that the schools are suffering and commented on the Skyline shooting incident. She said the children are suffering and the District is wasting money by having police in the schools. [Ms. Davis displayed purported autopsy photographs of her deceased son.]

Jabari said congratulations to all those who won awards. He also commented on the issue of police officers on school campuses. He said the schools do not want to educate students. Classes are overcrowded. Teachers are getting pink slips. Schools are getting shut down. The money needs to be put back into the classroom and into after school programs. We need more counselors for the students.

Miss Sherri said she wanted to know which, if any, staff would step up to the plate with regard to budget issues. The Board needs to support the parents.

Timothy Killings spoke on the issue of police in the schools. He urged the District to conduct its own investigation and not to leave it up to another agency's Internal Affairs and that OPD is a corrupt institution that does not keep our children safe. He asked the Board to do some additional research and to hold the officers accountable. He said having police in schools is not about safety; police are here to intimidate people and to keep us in check. He said their demand is that the District take the police out of schools. He said education is facing severe damaging cuts and the District is wasting its money on police officers.

Angelica Reyes Avediaro, speaking through a translator, addressed the issues of social, emotional and physical challenges at Brookfield Elementary School. Brookfield has highly competent and dedicated teachers. She asked the Board to listen to the parents who want their students to experience academic success. She said SSC members have not been informed about budget details.

Director Spearman stated that she and Deputy Superintendent Vernon Hal met with Brookfield parents a couple weeks ago. The outcome of the meeting will be shared with the parents.

Kim Shipp, parent, announced she is a retired parent from OUSD after 20 years of parenting. Her son is graduating from Skyline High School this year.

Secretary Rakestraw stated this is the preliminary presentation on the budget. The Public Hearing will take place on June 29.

Vernon Hal, Deputy Superintendent, Business & Operations, used a Power Point for his review of the 2011-2012 Adopted Budget First Reading - dated June 8, 2012. (Draft V.6)

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The District Budget is based on the May Revise State Budget. Until the State approves the final budget, we will not definitively know our financial situation.

ASSUMPTIONS FOR NEXT YEAR

Mr. Hal stated we have eliminated certain one-time items, including \$1.7 million of Mandated Cost Reimbursement dollars. The current budget had another item of \$1.7 million of E-Rate Reimbursement relating to the prior year which we eliminated for 2011-12.

OTHER CHANGES

Mr. Hal stated Special Education Transportation had a one-time cost item that was taken out in the amount of \$1 million. We reduced our contribution for our Routine Repair and Maintenance Account to fund our School Security Officers.

Mr. Hal said there is an additional \$6 million flex from the Adult Education funds. Those funds are Tier 3 flex and \$3 million have been allocated to enrich the high school programs, i.e., A-G requirements.

THEMES FOR THE MAY REVISION

Mr. Hal reviewed slides on major problems in education finance, low level of funding and uncertainty of funding. The May Revise is aligned with the general theme of the Governor's Budget--cuts outside of education, realigning programs from the State to local agencies, relative funding for K-12 education, and significant cuts from community colleges and higher education. Tax revenues have increased. Mr. Hal stated the State Budget is still dependent on extension of taxes.

NATIONAL ECONOMY and CALIFORNIA ECONOMY

Mr. Hal stated 224,000 jobs were added in April. The unemployment rate did rise in March.

OUSD BUDGET OVERVIEW

Mr. Hal stated the budget for the District is \$527,000,000 and most of that is in the General Fund in the amount of \$370,000,000 and includes \$100,000,000 in Construction related items. An amount of \$200,000,000 is at school sites.

The current year's budget is \$650,000,000. We drew down money from our General Obligation Bonds and used those funds in construction of our facilities. We anticipate another draw-down in the next year from our authorization.

GENERAL FUND

Mr. Hal said reviewed the information on school site budgets and central budgets, including centrally services for schools and centrally funded site based services. He stated the Appendix has information on departments for each of the shown buckets.

UNRESRICTED GENERAL FUND

Mr. Hal said most of our salaries and benefits, teacher costs, and school site costs and central office funding is shown here. He said, of the \$370 million, \$217 million is unrestricted with about \$153 million being restricted. He noted a decrease in Central Office and District Leadership.

REVENUE LIMIT

Mr. Hal said over time the revenue limit increased. For the current year we are at \$5,215 with flat funding anticipated.

ADA

Mr. Hal said ADA was declining over time. We are projecting the number to be flat for next year at about 36,359 ADA.

UNRESTRICTED GENERAL FUND BUDGET COMPARISON TO THIRD INTERIM PROJECTION FOR THE CURRENT YEAR

Mr. Hal stated there is a minimum change in our Revenue Limit and there is flat funding for ADA. The change in our fund balance is approximately \$20 million.

LOCAL REVENUES

Mr. Hal said the information represents an accounting issue. We have ROP and those funds are flexed. In the current year, we would receive the money, send it to the ROP, then bill the ROP, i.e., as local revenue. For next year, we will be actually providing the services for the District.

EXPENDITURES

Mr. Hal said school sites budgets are down by about \$15 million. As we comb through our budget we are ensuring to place the funds where they make the most sense in accounting. There was about \$3.4 million dollars in Central budgets that was moved to district wide budgets. As we talked about Adult Education being flexed in the amount of \$3 million, \$2 million is sitting in central budgets to be allocated for high school efforts and additional money in central budgets. 3.35.39 He said there is an additional \$900,000 that was budgeted for School Security Officers.

ENDING FUND BALANCE

Mr. Hal said the ending fund balance increased by \$20 million. There are certain items we need to be careful about, i.e., \$250 budgeted per student. The State will not give us the cash until next year and those monies have not been allocated expenses because there is no

cash for it. Mr. Hal stated the \$12 million deals with setting aside in our reserves. We had initially cut about \$350 per kid.

BOARD MEMBER COMMENTS

Director Spearman asked about the pass through of the ROP?

Mr. Hal said ROP dollars are part of Tier 3 flex resources. We have chosen to continue to use those funds as if they were not flexed.

Director Spearman said the Board set a policy of more than a two percent minimum requirement for a reserve.

Director Gallo requested staff to include the following information on page 1 of the budget: Number of K-12 schools in the District, including public charter schools in Oakland; actual and projected enrollment for 2011-12 for elementary, middle, and high school level; and any variance change between the elementary, middle and high school grade levels. Director Gallo said he wished to simplify the budget and establish a system to track what is adopted versus current. He was at a meeting yesterday regarding formula for staffing levels and that information is not shown in tonight's document. We need to be able to track the changes.

Mr. Hal said we do not have a staffing formula. Results Based Budgeting is enrollment-based budgeting and is based on projected enrollment. The school communities decide on the allocation for the resources.

Director Gallo asked to see a budget summary for all funds which would identify allocations for state, federal, and local, along with appropriations for the various funds.

Mr. Hal stated the Interims contain slides for each of the funds that detail federal, state and local funds. Director Gallo said he is looking for the estimated actuals for this year and adopted actuals. Mr. Hal said we produced that information, but did not have time to include it for this particular document.

Director Spearman stated there has to be more clarity in how we budget for the schools and allocate teachers.

Vice President London requested clarification on Slide 31 and what it means in terms of our goal around eliminating our structural deficit. Mr. Hal stated one of the three budget priorities is to eliminate the structural deficit. We have one-time revenues sources.

In response to Vice President London, Mr. Hal said the first column shows \$3,758,000 is a structural surplus. We have eliminated the structural deficit.

Director Kakishiba stated the Board, in January, set three priorities. At issue is how the three priorities are being addressed in the budget. Director Kakishiba said the discussions surrounding the Strategic Planning process raises the bar in how we should be conducting ourselves as a governance team. Director Kakishiba said the "Provide Electives in the Middle School" is not in compliance with Measure G language. That needs to be pulled

out and reinvested into the high school program, but not into the middle school program.

President Yee said the three Board budget priorities are: Eliminate the structural deficit, employee compensation, and teacher retention which are independent of the Strategic Planning priorities.

Director Spearman said the budget is going to support the Strategic Plan. Is the Strategic Plan going to support the three priorities of the Board?

Director Gallo said there is a significant piece that is missing--we have been reluctant to deal with the school sites. The enrollments stay the same and the District is still investing on sites to keep them open

Vice President London said one of her challenges is figuring out how the broad buckets translate into the program. We have the Board budget priorities and how do we pull those things together and how do we identify the programmatic changes? The public continues to ask for competing priorities, including the issue of counseling, restoration of the family literacy programs in adult education, preservation of class sizes at a smaller size, and more teachers are needed at certain schools. Somehow the priorities need to come through in the Strategic Plan and in the Budget. She said, with the exception of the Structural Deficit and Employee Compensation, how do those programmatic things translate into our budget priorities.

Superintendent Smith said the budget priorities live explicitly in the Strategic Plan in terms of guiding activities. In terms of recruiting, retaining high quality effective teachers, that is on Page 30. Information regarding elimination of the structural deficit and the others are on Page 38. He stated the three current Board priorities are driving programmatic changes and we are aligning all of our resources. Anticipated revenue for next year is different than getting real revenues. We have been using the Board's budget priorities as a guide to do our best.

President Yee said it is the weighting of the priorities that makes us choose between Adult Education Family Literacy Programs and A-G courses. That kind of priority needs to live somewhere in the document. Class size reduction or combination classes do not live in the Strategic Plan If a priority does not live in the Plan, but is a priority for four of the seven Board Members, then the priority needs to be put into the Plan. If a priority is not there, then how would a person come to the Board next year and advocate for reduction and combination classes? That is an important value of a real Strategic Plan.

Director Hodge said she has issues around equity. The playing field has not been leveled. If there really is a surplus, then she still wants another conversation about how we work with those dollars. She said there are items that live in the Strategic Plan around effective teaching and there are structural systems that have not educated all children equitably. There are pieces that we need to put on the table as to why we are not doing certain things.

Director Dobbins asked about the ADA funding figure of \$5215 and income we get from the lottery.

Mr. Hal said the number on page 25 refers to Unrestricted General Fund base revenue limit per ADA. Those are the dollars that we get for all our kids attending school. For

each kid we basically get \$5215. We receive approximately \$5 million in lottery funds. Mr. Hal said if the enrollment projection is the same for next year, but school attendance is down, the allocation will be less.

President Yee stated the Board has had the conversation for the past year about potential assets which are costing us money in terms of maintenance. In the past, Superintendent Smith has noted a need for a deliberate process and that a Strategic Plan has to be in place. We can safely say there is something in the range of 10 and 30 sites depending on the seriousness of the budget scenarios. President Yee stated the budgeting process includes a strategy that ties in asset management and focuses on the budget priorities established by the District. If we save money by closing a school, does that money go back into the total pot of money that schools get to spend or does it go into reducing the structural deficit, or does it go into employee compensation? He would like to have that discussion as we move forward in the budget adoption. President Yee said the RBB Task Force and any recommended changes in RBB funding are not being implemented for the initial cut of the 2011-12 budget for June 29. We are still following the current RBB rules. We have all agreed that we want to work on those rules and make modifications on the practice.

Mr. Hal stated recommendations will be submitted for the June 18 meeting. He was at a recent meeting and the big buckets are: completion by mid February; certain staffing minimums; and sustainable;

President Yee stated he wants to ensure that our budget reflects the appropriate balance between instruction and non-instructional costs which is the 45-55 ratio.

Mr. Hal said we will look and see if this budget will meet the 55 percent rule. He said we have a lot of schools. We have a structural issue, and, as we go into budget development for 2012-13, we had talked about the size of our schools and the number of schools that will get directly at that issue in terms of the 55 percent. Given the cuts we made for the current year as we close the books, we'll see how close we got. We made a lot of progress given some of the reductions we made outside of classrooms.

President Yee stated another challenge of the budget includes set asides for the audit findings. The audit findings is a substantial bucket while we have this wild swing around the structural deficit right now and we would have solved the structural deficit only if we could take the audit findings off of our books.

Mr. Hal said the structural deficit is ongoing revenue versus ongoing expense. Our fund balance has one-time money set aside for audit findings.

General Counsel Minor said AB609 has been relegated to the Suspense File.

President Yee said it is not realistic at the present time to count on audit finding money that we can pump back into the system quickly.

Mr. Hal stated we have had monies in our State Loan fund set aside for audit findings for several years. Those resources, going into next year, are gone.

In response to President Yee, Mr. Hal stated we did not use adult education dollars to

eliminate our structural deficit.

Director Spearman said the proposal is to pay Oakland Schools Foundation \$98,000 to provide 1,395 hours of coaching, strategic design, participation in a privately funded collaborative, and fundraising support. She asked how much money was raised? Director Spearman said for us as a governing board to sit here and approve any school paying \$98,000 for a period from May 1, 2011 to June 30, 2011, for 1,395 hours is outrageous. She said United for Success should have put this request in earlier in the year. The contractor has probably already performed the service.

Director Spearman said there are seven separate requests to pay Oakland Schools Foundation in the range of \$98,000 to \$2,000. One school had a contract approved in the last budget and now they are asking for another \$10,000. Oakland International was approved for a large amount last month and they asking to pay another \$17,000.

Director Spearman said she totalled the amounts for all the schools on tonight's agenda and it totals more than \$155,000. She questioned \$98,000 being paid for one month of service. She said the contracts need to go back and come back with the right dates. They need to provide the actual dates of service. Director Spearman asked how the vendor is going to provide services in the amount of 1,395 hours from May 1, 2011 to June 30, 2011. She said they are using School Library Improvement Grant money.

Mr. Hal said staff has already begun conversations with the organization and the organization is being asked to explain the scope of the services and benefits of services.

Director Gallo made a motion to have the Superintendeent take the contract back to the

school and verify the dates and scope of service. Vice President London seconded the motion.

General Counsel Minor made a comment on all listed contracts for Oakland Schools Foundation. She said the Board needs information about the terms and conditions of the grants, whether they are use it or lose it grant funds and clarification of the contract dates.

Director Dobbins said he disagrees with an evaluation of the OSF Program which should be the principal's responsibility as they are the ones with the autonomy to make these calls. As a Board, we cannot overstep that.

Director Gallo said it is ultimately the Superintendent's role to supervise the school sites.

Superintendent Smith stated we have initiated this and it has been an ongoing conversation and the Deputy Superintendents have both been working from Fiscal and Program and meeting with the Executive Director of the Oakland Schools Foundation. He said sites do have this money. It has been allocated from last year and it is in their budgets. They are trying to decide where they put it and where they spent it. There is a practical question of now going back and saying you operated, you made these decisions, this is the practice of the District."The question about the dates is a good one, but whether or not the sites have the right to enter into this agreement--currently, they do, and until such time as the Board directs him to change that, the school sites have the autonomy to make these kinds of decisions. We are looking at the question to sites have the ability to park money for next year's budget in an outside organization? Which is not okay. Superintendent Smith said staff will bring back a recommendation.

Director Gallo said the bigger question involved the appropriate use of SIG funds or other funds for this activity.

Superintendent Smith said there are different funding sources. If some of them are "use it or lose it" that drives where a site would put it and the ability to manage their funds during the year.

President Yee said in the case where this is General Purpose money, if, in fact the school has entered into a contract with Oakland Schools Foundation for \$5,265, if we deny or reject the contract, then does the \$5,265 continue to belong to Piedmont Avenue School or does the money revert back into the General Fund?

Director Gallo said his legal charge as a Board Member is whatever he approves has to be an appropriate use of public funds and even if the date is wrong for terms of service or scope of service, he should not approve the item.

Vice President London asked if the Superintendent would report back at the June 22 Board Meeting since that is the last meeting of the fiscal year. President Yee said if the Superintendent does not come back with the certification, what happens to the \$57,000?

Mr. Hal said it is his understanding we have two more board meeting before the end of the fiscal year.

Secretary Rakestraw said the effect of the action here is to table action on this tonight

pending a report from the Superintendent to a time certain.

President said the motion is to table the remaining items, other than the one that we acted on earlier, pending recommendation from the Superintendent.

Director Kakishiba said the Superintendent is going to look at the issue of whether or not it is an appropriate use of contract in terms of whether or not this is parking excess money that cannot be spent by the school site in a rapid way. He cautions about pinpointing a particular service or an entity. The issue for him is that when we say Results Based Budgeting, whether it is professional training or a SB65 Outreach Consultant, there are all kinds of things we spend money on and he is unsure what we are getting out of it. One of the reforms we should have in RBB is that if schools are having a pattern of services, there should be very concrete deliverables and impacts that are going on. Regarding the grass roots fundraising, it is a pretty easy deliverable and it should be embedded into the contract and there should be results at the end.

Director Hodge said we need to be careful about the policy and practice piece that we are struggling with has nothing to do with a particular organization. This process went through a committee. We have also created a level of competition in the District and people have had to use marketing and had to bring people back into their district. She said Oakland Schools Foundation had been used often in District 3. She is more concerned about a principal or set of teachers or family members or other people that made an investment in this work or thinking this work is moving forward. The reason why she voted no is because she feels we are not having the conversation in the right place and the right time. She looks forward to any kind of evaluation and there is some responsibility on the committee if we are going to have a committee structure to be doing some of the due diligence.

President Yee said the only tool we have to do the policy discussion as described by Director Hodge is what we just did---we voted on it. The 7 of us made our points about this particular item.

Vice President London said she questioned the work and relationship with this particular organization early in her tenure on the Board. She was persuaded that because of the way we do our budgeting currently, that she needed to respect the autonomy we had given to school sites around the budgets that were assigned to them. These contracts point out some equity issues in the District and some needs in the District that need to be addressed. She sees this organization doing work on behalf of a large number of our schools. Other schools that do not have relationships with this organization and some that do also enlist parents to do a lot of the same type of fundraising work. There is an equity issue in there some where and we need a better way as a district to help our schools raise money from other sources and we need a city-wide education fund that meets some of these needs and we need better training for our parents.

Director Spearman responded we do not know the level of fundraising of the Oakland School Foundation. No one has ever seen the figures. We do not know what they are

doing. To give the organization \$155,000 is squandering public funds. She said there has been a serious complaint filed with the State Department of Education on the use of the SIG money. She said these people are using money that should be going to support and enhance the programs at the school sites. They are using library money and GP money. Director Spearman said RBB is a practice, not a policy.

Director Gallo made a motion to direct the Superintendent to come back to the board and do an evaluation on the service of this organization; and to make a recommendation, to include all the contracts that Director Spearman made reference to with the same organization.
