Subject Agreement with Alameda County Registrar of Voters to Use Prescott School as a Polling Location for the November 2020 General Election

Action Ratification of Agreement with Alameda County Registrar of Voters to Use Prescott School as a Polling Location for the November 2020 General Election and Addendum.

Background & Discussion Due to COVID-19, all voters received a vote-by-mail ballot. However, physical spaces were needed to serve as accessible voting locations rather than a traditional polling place. Any voter in Alameda County could vote at the voting locations. For November 2020 General Election, voting at the voting location occurred over 4 days rather than just on Election Day. Ten OUSD schools served as accessible voting locations, with Prescott School being one of them.

Fiscal Impact Payment of \$200 to offset minor additional maintenance costs.

ADDENDUM TO
AGREEMENT TO USE LOCATION AS AN ACCESSIBLE VOTING LOCATION ON
General Election on Tuesday, November 3, 2020

This addendum is and is intended to be legally binding and to complement the Agreement to Use Location as an Accessible Voting Location on General Election on Tuesday, November 3, 2020 ("Agreement"), incorporated herein by reference, between the Oakland Unified School District ("District" or "OUSD") and the County of Alameda ("County") for the County to use the following District site ("Site") as an accessible voting location from October 31, 2020 through November 3, 2020:

Name of District Site: Prescott School

In addition to the terms and conditions set forth in the Agreement, OUSD and the County hereby additionally agree as follows:

Termination Due to COVID-19. The Agreement is terminated immediately if a shelter-in-place (or similar) order due to COVID-19 is issued that would prohibit the District from making the Site available to be used as an accessible voting location from October 31, 2020 through November 3, 2020.

Compliance with COVID-19 Guidance. The County shall ensure that any employee, contractor, agent, or representative of the County and any voter or potential voter follows all applicable local, state, and federal health and safety guidelines regarding COVID-19. These include, but are not limited to, symptom checks, wearing masks, social distancing, and the frequent cleaning of high-touch surfaces.

COVID-19 Reporting. Consistent with any federal or state law (including, but not limited to, HIPAA and the California Confidentiality of Medical Information Act), the County shall notify OUSD, via an email to ousdlegal@ousd.org, within twelve (12) hours if any employee, contractor, agent, or representative of the County who was on Site tests positive for COVID-19, shows or reports symptoms consistent with COVID-19, or reports to the County possible COVID-19 exposure.

Indemnity. Other than what is stated herein or in the Agreement, the County acknowledges that OUSD shall play no role in, and have no obligations related to, the use of the Site as an accessible voting location. To the furthest extent permitted by California law, the County shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless OUSD, its Governing Board, agents, representatives, officers, consultants, employees, trustees, and volunteers ("OUSD Indemnified Parties") from any and all claims or losses accruing or resulting from injury, damage, or death of any person or entity arising out of the County's use of the Site as an accessible voting location, including but not limited to claims related to (1) the County's alleged violation of any COVID-related law, regulation, guidance, or guidelines and (2) any individual's suspected or actual contracting of COVID-19, and any impacts therefrom. The County shall, to the fullest extent permitted by California law, defend OUSD Indemnified Parties at the County's own expense, including attorneys' fees and costs, and OUSD shall have the right to accept or reject any legal representation that the County proposes to defend OUSD Indemnified Parties.
