Student Directors Eric Adams and Wesley Sims read the All City Council Reports:

All City Council Middle School Update:

Joyce Peters, Nutrition Services, led a workshop on the District's Wellness Policy and changes in the school cafeteria menu items.

Student delegates reported the following:

Frick students have concerns about the cafeteria menu items. The students are thrilled about their Winter Sports Festival and their Winter Ball.

Montera leadership students reported that they successfully cleaned up Room 400, and have transformed the room into a place for future workshops and leadership classes. They raised more than \$100 from recycling efforts. Montera has successfully initiated a counseling group for their students to express themselves. Their upcoming event is the Conflict Resolution for Kids at Joaquin Miller School.

Barack Obama leadership students reported that they are addessing the issues of cafeteria meal selections, school uniforms, student lounge, basketball for females, and having a gym. Their upcoming event is a trip to Washington D.C.

Edna Brewer students report they need better activities and they are also concerned with the quality of food at lunchtime.

Explore College Prep students are celebrating better learning techniques, lunches, and teachers. Their concerns are with food and the lack of breaks between school hours.

The next All City Council Middle School Meeting is scheduled for January 19, location to be determined.

All City Council High School Update:

At the high school general meeting last month, delegates from 9 schools voted against the Oakland Police Department's plan to implement a youth curfew once again. Delegates also drafted questions for their students evaluation of teachers and worked on the All City Council statement on the closed campus lunch policy.

Youth Empowerment School students report improvements in teacher effectiveness where the teachers are coming together to listen to the students. Other noted improvements were the murals painted by the students. The students have a concern about the school being moved to another site. Their upcoming event is the Hallway Dance.

Paul Robeson students reported they have lost faith because their school is closing. The students said they were not given a chance to keep their school open.

Oakland Tech students reported their upcoming events include a Swoosh Rally and their play Hamlet: The Blood and The Brain will run from January 14-16.

Students from Castlemont Business & Information Technology reported the after-school programs have improved, they have a new auditorium, and the school has a restorative justice program led by Youth Together. Students are concerned with the closed campus lunch. The lunch lines are too long and the food is cold. Students are requesting heaters.

Students from Castlemont's East Oakland School of the Arts report better lunches are being served at the school. The students have a concern about the serving sizes of food served at the school.

The next All City Council High School Meeting is scheduled for January 21 from 1:00 P.M. to 3:00 P.M. at Castlemont.

Director Hodge said she is interested in the All City Council work around restorative justice. There is a resolution that is in Safety Committee and she appreciates the All City Council support.

President Yee noted the many members of the three charter school communities in the audience. He said the public hearings will begin at 6:00 P.M.

Director Kakishiba said Legislative File I.D. 09-1871 is for a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the East Bay Asian Youth Center at Manzanita Community School. He is the Executive Director for that organization and he will be stepping out of the room when that item is taken up. Director Kakishiba said he has had no conversation with any District staff or Board Member on this item and he will be recusing himself from the discussion and vote.

Director London said Legislative File ID 09-3452, Professional Services Contract with Dowling Associates, Downtown Education Project, is listed under Item K New Business. Director London said her husband is a principal for Dowling Associates and she will be recusing herself from any discussion and vote on the item. She has had no conversation with any District staff or Board Members on this item.

Director Spearman pulled Legislative File I.D. 09-3496 for separate discussion and vote.

Richard Thompson, teacher, Thornhill Elementary, asked about compensation for board members and superintendent. He said he assumes that OUSD teachers will receive the same percentage increase in their salaries.

Mark Airgood, OEA, commented on the editorial in today's Oakland Tribune and on the OUSD web site on the "Race to the Top." He said he does not feel board members feel unqualified in the endorsement of Race to the Top in tieing everything to standardized test scores and imposing merit pay. He said Teach for America endorsement of Race to the Top should not be merged with OUSD and featured as though it were some kind of statement of District policy.

President Yee, responding to the compensation issue, said the Board voted at the end of its Organizational Meeting to approve a resolution that increased the stipend to Board Members for their service on the Board from \$750.00 to \$787.50 a month. The item was approved by a vote of 5-2. The Superintendent has not received an increase, however, his contract was negotiated when he was hired. Director Spearman stated Board Members

have not had any increase in their stipend in over 16 years.

I. Report of Regular Board Members

Director Kakishiba said the Finance and Human Resources Committee will be presenting recommendations for two proposals regarding a potential parcel tax measure either for the June or November election. The work is the outgrowth of a community coalition that has met during the past 12 months involving District personnel, community organizations and collective bargaining units of the District. Their work has been to craft a proposal that would generate new revenues to the District to support employee compensation for teachers and school level employees.

Director London provided an update on work of the Intergovernmental Relations
Committee. She said the Field Representative from Senator Swanson's office provided an
update on the budget situation in Sacramento. The State is projecting significant shortfalls.
Director London said the committee continues to work on our community outreach and
ways to enhance our relationship with the City through the Education Partnership
Committee. Director London said she has been giving presentations on our academic and
fiscal solvency at PTAs throughout her District. She said we are seeking community input
on establishing priorities for ourselves in moving forward. There is an on-line survey on
the District web site. Director London acknowledged the Students Run Oakland Program
that trains Oakland students to run marathons. There is a fundraiser on January 21 for the
trip to Los Angeles marathon. Director London thanked the Jack London Cinema for
opening its doors to all the safety patrols in Oakland. The kids got to see a movie for free.

Director Hodge said there have been a number of safety issues in District 3, including a weapons incident at a basketball game between McClymonds and Oakland Technical High School. She hopes that the adults in those communities can begin to talk and deal in a different kind of way. Director Hodge said she is in the process of developing advisory groups on the fiscal solvency issue. The Safety Committee has been discussing Restorative Justice which is an attempt to look at how harm happens in the lives of people and in our schools and how do we get to the root causes. She said there is a resolution in the works that is aimed at changing adult behavior. Director Hodge congratulated Lafayette Elementary School students for their work in the Swun Math Competition.

Director Gallo welcomed the school communities of World Academy, Lighthouse Academy, North Oakland Academy, and Cox Academy Charter Schools. He said he knows them and they are his neighbors. In his travels, Director Gallo said he is asked about Oakland Schools and he responds that Oakland provides the highest quality of education that money can buy. We have some challenges. Personal responsibility lies with mom and dad and with the student.

Director Spearman stated that students from Barack Obama Academy will be visiting Washington, D.C. in the spring. The school is asking for donations to help defray costs of the trip.

President Yee congratulated the winners in the Swun Math Competition. Brad Stam, Chief Academic Officer, said the third grade competition was on multiplication and a student from Lafayette Elementary School won the competition. The fifth grade competition was on

fractions and a student from Howard Elementary won that competition. The sixth grade competition was on integers and a student from Edna Brewer Middle School won the competition.

President Yee said he attended a Multiple Pathways Meeting. He said Multiple Pathways is being considered the transformative high school reform of the next few years. We are at the beginning of a significant transformation of high schools. He congratulated All City Council for their work.

President Yee stated that the Teaching and Learning Committee and Brigitte Marshall, Director, Oakland Adult and Career Education, reviewed a report on the impact of the proposed cuts to the budget to that program. There will be proposals coming forward that will be rolled into the work that our Superintendent is doing.

Vice President Dobbins asked the Board to adjourn this meeting in the memory of former principal Charles Schmuck.

Public Comments on this Item:

Ward Rountree, Executive Director, OEA, said his comments at the Teaching and Learning Committee were misunderstood or misheard regarding the District's application for the "Race to the Top." He said he wants to be clear that he does not support the District's unfettered application for the "Race to the Top" monies. He said at that meeting that there were some ideas in the "Race to the Top" that might be engaging, but that, in no way does he endorse an unfettered "Race to the Top" application. He also said he would be dogmatic about the fact that the PowerPoint referenced a Restart Model that says "close the school, restart it as a charter school" and he wants to be dogmatic so that it is clear he does not think the District should close any school and restart them as charter schools. He said there are some ideas in the Transformation Model that we might find interesting and the District ought to set up models of excellence that might stress and develop teacher and leader effectiveness that we might start talking about setting up models that have extended learning time and create community oriented schools. He said most of these schools are successful because they have effective and energetic leaders. They also are effective because they get a chance to innovate and speak and discuss and deal effectively and collaboratively at their individual school site about the youngsters that they deal with on a day-in and day-out basis. He said we might experiment in some ways in this community with an all boys or all girls school. We ought to be creative.

Jim Mordecai said the Superintendent signed the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) and he did not get the signature of the union. It is unclear if the Superintendent engaged in a conversation with the OEA leadership or the other unions. He said the Superintendent does not know what he is signing. There were other school boards who did not sign away their sovereignty and it is all about the money.

Director David Kakishiba said the Committee voted 2-1 vote to recommend approval of this contract for a performance and financial audit for the Measure B construction bond program. He said Director Spearman had a few questions that the General Counsel had addressed in an E-mail earlier today.

Director Spearman said her biggest concern is that this firm has done this audit for the last eight years. She questioned if these contracts go out to bid and is it good practice to have the same firm doing an audit over a number of years? She said people get complacent. It should be determined if there are other agencies that could do the same work.

Director London said she is willing to support this contract this year, but she would not necessarily want to support it next year unless she saw there had been a bid for the work.

Vice President Dobbins asked if there are any new regulations that have been issued about switching audit firms. General Counsel Minor said Government Code section 53060 mirrors the provision in the California Public Contracting Code which provides that the

Board can engage certain professional services without going out to bid. These are services, such as legal, accounting, auditing, engineers, and architects, that have a presumption of making a decision not based on the lowest bidder; and that there are services that have value that are not tied to the lowest cost. The bid is a way to encourage some competition to see who is out there to provide the services. If the Board were to consider a recommendation to the Superintendent that this go out to bid, we would recommend that it not be based on lowest bidder, but based on other criteria that we could establish.

President Yee asked if there is any evidence or suspicion that there is any conflict of interest in this case? General Counsel Minor said she is unaware of any conflict of interest in this case.

Director Spearman asked the Superintendent to develop criteria for the audit process. Tim White, Assistant Superintendent, Facilities Planning & Management, stated this may be the third audit that the firm is proposed to work on.

President Yee said this is a topic that we might wish to bring up in the Rules Committee to take a look at the whole procedure.

Downtown Educational Complex - PreConstruction Report

Update on the Downtown Educational Complex including the legal requirement that the Board of Education review Public Comments and Conduct a Public Hearing on the District prepared draft Preliminary Endangerment Assessment (PEA) Report, required by the California Environmental Protection Agency, Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC), now scheduled for hearing at 5 p.m., Regular Board Meeting, on January 27, 2010, before Downtown Educational Complex construction may proceed.

Vice President Dobbins said Director Gallo raised important issues at the last Facilities

Committee Meeting about the Asset Management Plan. Tim White, Assistant Superintendent, Facilities Planning & Management, and his staff, were thanked for their work on the Asset Management Plan. He said Director Gallo raised issues about the Plan. The committee voted to approve this item.

Vice President Dobbins said everyone is excited about the new Downtown Educational Complex. There are parking issues that need to be resolved and there are legal requirements that need to be resolved before they can start working on the project. Secretary Rakestraw said this item is an informational item. The public hearing is scheduled for the next Board Meeting. Director Hodge said there is a lot of great design work and at some point some of us would like to hear about it or be a part of it. Mr. White stated the project is in design and ultimately the project will be broken into phases. The item tonight is information to prepare the Board for a public hearing that is going to be scheduled at the next Board Meeting to deal with the environmental conditions. Mr. White said he has a three-minute video on the downtown project that is also posted on the District web page. The video shares information on the timeline, budget and other associated information.

Mr. White said the Downtown Educational Complex includes the new construction for La Escuelita, a K-5 Elementary School which will accommodate up to 360 students. The complex will also include a child development center which combines two child development centers, Yuk Yau and Centro Enfantil, with a capacity of up to 170 students. Also, there will be a full service health care clinic incorporated into the facility and accommodate Met West High School which will have production facilities and technology services in the location directly across the street. The location is a six acre parcel that is between East Tenth Street, Twelfth Street, and between Second and Fourth Avenues downtown. Mr. White said construction will begin in February. We hope to have an agenda item for the demolition of the portables at the next Board Meeting. The demolition will start in February with more construction starting in March 2010.

Mr. White stated the California Department of Toxic Substances requires an environmental assessment to determine what is in the soil, whether the soil is suitable to build on and if it is safe for students. Since it is an existing school site, we applied under an exemption category. We did a Phase I which is a paper study history of what has been on the site and what is within a square half-mile radius, as well. Per the recommendations, we determined that a preliminary environmental assessment was needed. It is required to be posted for 30 days for public comments. The public comments will be incorporated into a report and an action plan will be submitted to the Department of Toxic Substances. Once the Report and Plans are approved, we will go forward with the project. The Department of Toxic Substances then acts on the report and we proceed with the project.

Director Kakishiba said the construction is being funded by bond money and will have no direct effect on the budget challenges that we have. He said there is approximately 600 students on the property. The commitment by the District to build La Escuelita has been around for more than ten years.

Director London said she looked at the preliminary environmental assessment that needs to be approved by the Department of Toxic Substances and Control. She said the Harper Building's history includes industrial uses and career technical education uses. Director London asked if there is going to be a need for any remediation at the site? If so, who is

responsible? Is there a potentially responsible party to pay for that or will the District have to pay because we now own the property. She said under superfund, we should be able to go after them to do their clean-up. Mr. White said that may be a legal issue as to whether we have legal recourse to remediation funds from the previous owner. Mr. White said at this point we would generate a plan and we would engage and support the clean-up as a district.

Director Kakishiba said the school is being constructed for 360 seats because of past information we received for the break-even point for an elementary school. La Escuelita and the District need to plan on filling those 360 seats. Historically, there was interest for a K-8 school. He said that needs to be on the radar screen for the District through the Family and Community Office.

President Gary Yee opened the public hearing for World Academy at 6:24 P.M.

Susan Sperber, Principal, World Academy, acknowledged the 200 family members in Hunter Hall tonight in support of World Academy. She said the school, over the past four-and-a-half years, has adhered to its mission of providing high quality instruction to all of its students. Ms. Sperber said World Academy has created a community where all parties are actively involved in the success of our students. The majority of their students are Latino at 88 percent. The school is committed to ensuring that students of all ethnicities feel they are a part of their community. She said 96 percent of their students receive free and reduced lunches. The students are primarily English Language Learners.

They are committed to ensuring that all students are redesignated as fluent English Learners.

World Academy students addressed the Board of Education. The first student said she is in Grade 3 and the school gives her an opportunity to learn new things. World Academy has taught her that education is important. The second student said World Academy has given him a great education. The third student said World Academy is special because he has been taught to do many things. He now reads 127 words per minute and his school is great.

Ms. Sperber said World Academy adheres to their theory of action, having a well-defined curriculum and highly developed professional development. The teachers are constantly looking at data to improve instruction. They strongly believe in teacher collaboration and in giving their children a high quality education. Their aligned after-school program works in concert with the Open Court Reading and Math Programs. The agenda for their weekly professional development is structured around their data and student needs. The focus for this academic year includes fluency, text analysis for English Language Arts, relational thinking for Math, and a continued overall focus on student engagement. Every two months, they have a Math or English Language Arts data summit for grade level chairpersons. Ms. Sperber said they have met yearly API targets for the past three years and they made their AYP this year. Ms. Sperber said in a comparison group identified by Oakland Unified, their API has been higher than the identified schools for the past two years. World Academy has increased the number of Proficient students in English Language Arts since the end of their first year. They have decreased the percentage of Below and Far Below Basic students. Ms. Sperber said with increased coaching staff and support from Alameda County Office of Education, World Academy has achieved great success in Math. More than 60 percent of their students are at Proficient and Advanced levels of mathematics. For the past two years, they met their AYP in mathematics. World Academy strives to ensure that parents are fully involved in their children's education. They believe in a team approach toward community involvement and hold regular meetings with parents to keep lines of communication open. The Winter 2009 Parent Survey Results reflect their school is safe and well organized. They had 100 percent attendance at their parent conference.

Two World Academy parents were introduced. The first parent said her daughter's reading level is 113 words per minute and she is the First Grade. The second parent said her daughter is in Grade 2 at World Academy. The school is their children's second home and she asked the District to renew the charter for World Academy.

Ms. Sperber said World Academy is in sound financial condition.

President Yee requested the Charter Schools Office to present API scores and AYP data for English, Math and ELA when the staff recommendation is presented to Board.

Director Spearman said she has problems with the Charter School at the Cox site in that the school population is 72% Latino and 27% African American in a neighborhood that is 60% African American. She requested an analysis on the neighborhood of the children that attend the charter school on the Cox site. The recruitment of students is disturbing to her. She requested an analysis about some of the complaints that we have dealt with over the last four years from that charter. There have been serious complaints.

President Yee closed the public hearing at 7:00 P.M.

President Yee opened the public hearing at 6:00 P.M.

Enikia Ford Morthel, Principal, Cox Academy, acknowledged more than 300 parents and students tonight in Hunter Hall in support of Cox Academy and Education for Change. A Power Point was used for the charter renewal petition presentation. She said Cox Academy is a K-5 elementary school and serves 520 students. Cox shares a campus with Reach Academy. This is Year 5 for Cox Academy as an Education for Change (EFC) public charter school. Their mission is to provide a superior public education to Oakland's most underrepresented and underserved children by creating a system of public schools that focuses on continuous refinement of high quality instruction with a goal of finding out what works best for these students and replicating this in other urban public schools.

Ms. Morthel reviewed the seven core beliefs that guide all of the school's interactions and actions. She said that 71 percent of the students are Hispanic or Latino, with 23 percent identifying themselves as African Americans. She said 92 percent of their students qualify for free and reduced lunch and 67 percent of their students are English Language Learners. She introduced Cox students to share their stories. One student said all the adults help to answer his questions and the teachers have patience to help the students. Another student said he has been at Cox since Kindergarten and Cox is a wonderful school. Another student said she likes every teacher and the school is great. Ms. Morthel said Cox provides high quality teaching, coherent comprehensive rigorous standards based curriculum, extended time for collaboration and learning, enrichment and interventions for their students. They wish to engage their community at all times, and offering them a choice of Education for Change. They dedicate themselves to a cycle of continuous improvement. Professional development is the cornerstone of their model. Professional development is ongoing, explicit and data based, and followed up by observation and feedback from administrators and coaches. Ms. Morthel said their focus this year is on

fluency and text analysis for English Language Arts, relational thinking for math, and continuing to focus on student engagement. They seek to develop critical thinkers in all of their students and engage them in learning and as active participants. They are focusing this year on engaging their African American students and finding ways to increase their academic achievement. She said staff participates in professional development on a weekly basis. A Kindergarten teacher said the teachers at Cox have produced a culture that strives for excellence and she is proud to work with Cox teachers who are dedicated and compassionate.

Ms. Morthel reviewed achievement data. She said Cox has gone up over 100 points over the last four years. Last year, they went up 78 points and met their AYP growth target in both ELA and Math. In ELA they maintained a trend of increasing student scores in Far Below Basic. Over the past year, there were significant gains in students who are performing Proficient and Advanced. The trend is the same in Math. Ms. Morthel said the school has parent leadership councils every month on general topics. A parent said her son is in his second year at Cox and the school has raised her expectations about education.

Ms. Morthel said the school builds relationships with other agencies in the community. They partner with East Bay Agency for Children, MOCHA, and Creekside Church. A member of Creekside Church stated they have seen the Cox campus become safe for students and students are very focused. Cox staff is dedicated and enthusiastic. They appreciate the diversity at Cox school.

Public Comments:

Mark Airgood, teacher, spoke in favor of the reconversion of Cox back to a regular Oakland Public School. The District conversion under Education for Change of the Cox campus was done under State Administrator Randolph Ward at a time against the wishes of the community. Previous to that conversion, Cox had been left overcrowded with virtually no upkeep. Mr. Airgood stated the problems with the charters are they do not establish a right of every child for entry into their schools. The charters are more segregated than the public schools in Oakland.

Director Hodge asked the principal what would be the difference if the Board did not renew the charter? What would be some of the systematic changes and differences at the site? Ms. Morthel said her assumption is that the staff would change. With that comes union issues and a need to create a new culture with a new group of people who are working together to serve the same community. Her assumption is that there would be years of not the same growth.

President Yee closed the public hearing at 6:24 P.M.

President Yee opened the public hearing at 7:09 P.M.

Carolyn Gramstorff, Principal, North Oakland Community Charter School (NOCCS), said the school is celebrating their tenth year as an organization. Next year will complete their full K-8 growth pattern and they will have 210 students in grades K-8. She said on an annual basis, they have an average of 150 people who are applying for spots at NOCCS and through a public lottery they are only able to bring in 20 students. The school has a strong record of student achievement. Achievement is measured by many different tools. Their school performance report details all of the ways they measure student achievement at NOCCS. Ms. Gramstorff reviewed API growth. For the past four years, NOCCS has maintained an API ranking of over 800. Their current ranking is 880 which places NOCCS at the 11th highest achieving school out of Oakland's 70 public schools and fourth highest of Oakland's 23 middle schools. Over the past five years, an average of 73% of all NOCCS students have scored Proficient or Advanced on the English Language portion of the CST. She said 50% or more of their African American, Hispanic, and Students with Disabilities have scored Proficient or Advanced on the CST over the past two years. The school has a goal that 100% of their students become Proficient or Advanced in Math. Over the last five years 69% of all NOCCS students have scored Proficient or Advanced on the Math CST.

Parents from NOCCS addressed the Board. One parent said that a key aspect that draws so many parents to NOCCS is its amazing curriculum that encourages students to think creatively and critically. The school is designed to ensure that every child is well known and well educated. A NOCCS education is about educating the whole child. On an annual basis, the families log over 7,000 volunteer hours in service to the school and community. They support the NOCCS charter renewal petition. A NOCCS teacher said teachers are drawn to the school for many reasons, including the professional learning community. The staff collaborates to develop curriculum, master best practices and support all students. Other parents and board members of NOCCS spoke of the importance of local control and democratic deliberation. The majority of their Board is comprised of parents and family members; that board members are continuously learning and improving organization and they use a collaborative cycle of inquiry to establish school priorities to drive their budgeting process. A NOCCS board member said the school is strong, stable and has developed practices. Its budget is solid and the school has a system in place to ensure the school is run well. He said the NOCCS Board supports the renewal petition.

Several students spoke about the school and the support they get from NOCCS. One student said he gets after school assistance in Math three days a week at NOCCS. One student talked about the school's service learning program. In Grades 6 and 7, they have a community action learning class every Wednesday and they are in the process of developing proposals to benefit the neighborhood and community.

Other NOCCS parents spoke in support of the charter school petition renewal. One parent said one of her sons has special educational needs and he is served extraordinarily well at the school. Another parent said NOCCS has provided an excellent education to her daughter and son. They have excelled in their math ability, language skills, and NOCCS

has been a community to her. Another parent said NOCCS provides a positive place for students with special needs and a challenging environment with a strong curriculum. Another parent spoke of the involvement and volunteerism of families.

Public Comment:

Jim Mordecai said when the U. S. Supreme Court "passed" Brown v. Board of Education, that was about integration. Today, there has been a counter revolution and we are moving more and more toward a segregated society. The Board is not democratic because it can be changed at any time. He said charter schools are problematic and they are not democratic. Their management is not a public management, it is a private management. He urged the Board to vote "NO" on the charter school renewal.

Board Discussion:

Director London said the Board has heard presentations where schools are doing things that seem to work well for families. She would like to get a report on how we are taking our best lessons. There probably are things the charter schools would like to learn from our neighborhood schools as well. She would like to see more on how we can integrate.

Director Gallo commended the leadership of the school and student body and parent body. As a parent and as part of a democratic society, he looks for a choice where he can send his daughters to school. He wants the best for his daughters. He said he does not see charter schools as adversaries. He learns from charters and the great things they are doing in terms of autonomy, direction, less bureaucracy, and financially, they can do more things.

President Yee talked about the achievement differences at NOCCS among the subgroups. He knows the data is very small because the school is small and there may be validity and reliability issues. He asked that there be responses to any possible questions around achievement gaps in the subgroups.

President Yee closed the public hearing at 7:37 P.M.

President Yee opened the public hearing at 7:41 P.M.

Steve Sexton, Founder, used a Power Point for his presentation on Lighthouse Community Charter School. He said three out of four students qualify for Free and Reduced Lunch and about seven out of ten students are English Language Learners. Under High Expectations, they have a clear system of retention and promotion for students. With their first

graduating class, every graduate was accepted to college, every student passed the CAHSEE, and all of their students, except one, was accepted to a four-year college. More than \$700,000 was raised in grant money for their graduates. Every single student at Lighthouse feels that their teacher is expecting them to do their best. Nine out of ten students think they are ready to go to college. Their graduating students were admitted into state colleges, universities, local and out-of-state private schools. Mr. Sexton said every one of their students will complete the CSU/UC course requirements (A-G).

Mr. Sexton said the school has improved its CST proficiency over time. Over the last three years, their math still needs to go up. Nine out of ten students are passing the CAHSEE. Over the last three years, they have gone from 606 to 726 in their API. Their target is 800 by 2014.

Mr. Sexton said the school focuses on serving the whole child. They have individualized learning plans. As part of their advisory curriculum, the advisers meet with parents and kids three times a year. During that time they set goals to maximize student's academic achievement. They have different counseling support in order to ensure advisory programs work well. They have a social-emotional counselor, a college and internship counselor, and a college and mentoring program.

Mr. Sexton said this year they have had two different IEP meetings and 100 percent of parents and students have attended. Mr. Sexton spoke of family involvement and the importance of post fifth grade. They have IEP meetings where parents are part of the goal setting process with their students and they can get extra access to support and resources with their advisor. This past year, the parent advisory committee raised \$15,000 to supplement the parent activities. A parent survey indicated that 99% of parents think the school has high academic standards; 98 percent of parents think their child is learning skills that will prepare them for college and 94 percent of parents think their child is in a supportive environment.

Mr. Sexton said the school's Professional Learning Community strives to collect data and organize teams of teachers by content area. The teachers analyze the data and make instructional changes. They then have time for grade level teams to work on individual support plans for every student.

A Lighthouse parent said she is appreciative of the impact Lighthouse has had on her child's academic success. The attention and resources the school provides helps to prepare its students for college. She said many families are eager to enroll their children at Lighthouse. A former Lighthouse student spoke of the academic success she enjoyed due to the integration of SAT preparation, college application completion and college submission into every student's schedule. Her connection to Lighthouse continues through the college mentoring process. Lighthouse helps to prepare students as scholars outside of school. A current student at Lighthouse said he has been at the school for four years. He said the school pushes its students to higher standards and the school does not give up on its students. Another student said she is in the tenth grade and the teachers help her with her school work and her struggles in life. A teacher at Lighthouse said she came to Lighthouse because of the school's commitment to professional development. Their Professional Learning Community is collaborative, reflective and responsive to student needs. They consistently work with their grade level colleagues to discuss progress of students in their advisory groups. They share information about student achievement and

student struggles. A second component is the discipline specific inquiry groups. Their work is planned each summer in response to careful data analysis of student achievement. She said the Professional Learning Communities advance student achievement. Another parent said his daughter has been at Lighthouse for six years. The school has a culture of accountability. At Lighthouse, there are no social promotions. A Lighthouse student said the school is unique because the students are well known by their teachers. The teachers get to know their skills. Students are the first priority at Lighthouse. Another student said Lighthouse prepares every child for a career or college of their choice. All the teachers want their students to have a bright future and go to college. A former student said because of Lighthouse, he is able to attend the University of San Francisco. He asked that the Board allow Lighthouse to continue to achieve their goal of guiding students to a better future.

Public Comment:

Jim Mordecai asked about the school's accountability and why didn't the students go to St. Elizabeth's School? The answer is because of the charter school. The money is public money which is undermining the church experience of children who are in those schools. He asked Lighthouse to put in its document that all teachers who work in its charter school gets to maintain their First Amendment free speech rights.

Director Gallo encouraged everyone to visit the new site for Lighthouse. He commended the school leadership for doing an excellent job in getting our youngsters to succeed at a high level.

Director Spearman requested information on the ethnic breakdown of the school and why it does not service more African Americans? What are the CST scores for the African American and Latino students? How many are English Language Learners?

President Yee asked about the Individual Learning Plan and is it on line? Mr. Sexton responded they were part of the effective practices initiative epic and they have a whole profile on it. He will give the link to Mr. Montes who can forward the link to the Board of Education. President Yee asked about the percentage of students who graduate. Mr. Sexton said some students transferred out in the beginning. The other issue is retention. They currently have eight of their current 11th graders who would have been in the school's first graduating class, but they have been retained at one point or another. President Yee said that data is important and needs to be looked at in the final report.

President Yee closed the public hearing at 8:00 P.M.

M. Superintendent's Report

Superintendent Smith said he saw some excerpts from Hamlet's Blood and the Brain and the young people in the play are phenomenal. They are part of the Advanced Drama Club at Oakland Technical High School and they have been recognized internationally.

Superintendent Smith said he was reviewing the budget over the weekend and we have now

done the numbers. The Governor's "protected" education budget has an approximate \$2 billion dollar reduction for education which translates to Oakland at about \$201 per student or \$7.3 million dollars which is connected to a reduction or a negative cost-of-living adjustment that is built into the "protected" education budget. Superintendent Smith said the \$28 million that he brought to the Board in proposed cuts is now moving to \$36 million dollars. The Governor's Budget means we have to cut an additional \$8 million dollars for 2010-11. He said we are going to figure out what this means and how we are going to handle it. He said the Governor's Budget is tied to additional reductions in administration. We have outpaced what the State recommended for the percent of central office cuts.

Superintendent Smith said we just completed our P-1 attendance. He said we are not doing a great job and we are down between 600 and 650 students for ADA. He said eighty percent of school funding comes from ADA. We need more people being in school. That is about \$4,000,000 and that means we get \$4,000,000 less if we do not get our attendance up. We need to do our part to keep kids in school.

Superintendent Smith said we are not taking anything away from staff. We protected, in terms of our labor agreements and labor groups, no take-aways in terms of salaries and benefits. For teachers, we are still offering "0", but there are no take-aways and health benefits are protected. We are committed to that. As we go forward, we are going to figure out the right number of schools in this District, the right size of those schools, the right size of the classrooms, the central office, and get compensation right for everybody. We are committed to get high quality, good compensation for our high quality staff and to protect their benefits. That is work we are committed to doing.

Superintendent Smith said we are going to start a community-wide strategic planning process. He has shared a draft concept with Board Members to talk about the bigger ideas in how to use assets and to set a structure for engaging the Oakland community in a process to create a thoughtful strategic plan that will have us come together and figure out by region how to organize ourselves to take full advantage of the community based organizations, the faith community, and use all of our assets in service to children and families, and that has to mean one Oakland coming together. It is not just about high academic performance, but about our health and well being as a community and looking at interrupting the unacceptable rate of community violence we have heard about.

Superintendent Smith stated it is Options time and by Friday, everyone should be submitting their choices for placement of their kids.

Adrian Kirk, Director, Family and Community Office, said the Options Window closes on Friday. The Student Assignment Office is open until 3 o'clock in the afternoon which is an additional hour to accommodate families. We are taking applications directly in the office. If the student is already in a school, they may take the application to the school and the school will deliver it to the Student Assignment Office. We are particularly focused on students entering Kindergarten, students moving from elementary to middle school, and students moving from middle to high school. Any student or family that is interested in making a school change should submit an options application at this time.

President Yee referenced the Board Policy amendment that provided for Neighborhood First and that emphasized high quality schools in neighborhoods. The Board of Education went through an 18-month process which examined the implications of a massive mobility movement around the District. We believed at the time that neighborhoods and siblings were of highest priority. Mr. Kirk stated that siblings of a student who is attending a school have priority over others that might wish to enroll.

Superintendent Smith said the "Race to the Top" is the narrowest piece of any funding that is available. The District has maintained its eligibility. He has had conversations with union leadership and as part of any "Race to the Top", we would enter into a Memorandum of Understanding with the State of California. He said the "Race to the Top" funds come to the State of California and we would say what it is that we were going to do locally and that would be our agreement with the State of California. He said there have been no promises made and there have been no agreements. This is our work that we would advocate for and sign a Memorandum of Understanding. We have remained eligible to be in that conversation. Superintendent Smith said we need resources to do more of what we know works for our kids

Director Hodge said she will be dealing with the Options process this year. She asked if staff has encountered any conflict between the OAL and CIF rules and the Options program. She said there may be some conflicts in policy. Mr. Kirk said he would take a look at it, but he is unaware of any conflicts at this time.

Director London asked about teacher union support for the "Race to the Top". Superintendent Smith said we needed to stay in the conversation, initially, and, as Superintendent, he could sign to state we want to stay in the conversation. At this point, without knowing more of the details, union leadership was hesitant to sign the document. We have had conversation and once we get to something we agree on and it works, then it would not be out of the question.

Public Comment on the Superintendent's Report

Jim Mordecai said the taxpayers provided bond money that requires bond oversight. He said there is an oversight committee in Measure B that is doing a fantastic job. Page 53 of the agenda refers to Measure A monies which do not have an oversight committee.

Ward Rountree, Executive Director, OEA, commented on the status of negotiations, saying there are some take-aways on the table. He said the District's bargaining team has suggested to OEA that there will be increases in class size and that is a take-away. OEA members believe that class size is important to educational quality. Mr. Rountree said we have now entered into the last phase of the state resolution process and we are now in the fact-finding phase. He said we were not successful in mediation and in settling the contract dispute. He said over the last five years Oakland teachers have only received a 1.75 percent salary increase. Some employees have not had a salary increase since 1999.
