### **Student Surveys**

We conducted over 500 student surveys in over 25 classrooms at 13 schools.

#### Sample Questions:

- Multiple Choice: What do you want from school counselors?
- Yes or No: Do your Teachers & Administrators make school a motivational place to come to everyday?
- •Free Response: What is the school doing to help you be an effective community member?



### **Student Focus Groups**

With the help of ACC & CFJ, we ran 9 focus groups with over 45 students, where students talked about what school offers them to succeed toward 100% the goal of graduation and preparedness.

#### **Sample Questions:**

1) Do your school staff (teachers, administrators, counselors) provide you with useful resources to meet your goals?

2) What are the most important skills that you need to succeed in college, career and life?

3) What is your vision for Oakland schools?

## Finding #1 Dropping Out & Motivation

Over 40% of students that we surveyed don't feel that teachers and administrators make school a motivational place to attend. On top of this, financial problems, stress, and family issues contribute to many students considering dropping out of school.

• A student said, "Some teachers just teach horribly and cannot get through the curriculum. They also don't care for us, they treat us like cows: we work, they let us out."

• Almost a quarter of students we surveyed have considered dropping out of school.

## Finding #2 College Preparation

A large % of the student population is not being prepared for college admission and access for UC and CSU schools, when large majority of student wants to go to college.

 52% don't know if A-G requirements are offered at their schools.

 One student said, "Teachers and Adult Allies should teach us more about the college process."

#### Finding #3

Preparation for Life, College & Work Less than 1/2 of Oakland Schools that we surveyed offer Internship Opportunities & Mentoring Programs. Students would like their schools to cooperate with community organizations to prepare students for life.

 88% said they want to see more community organizations getting involved in their schools.

• 57% want curriculum that is related more to their lives, is more hands-on and engaging.

## Finding #4 Teacher Quality

Students want more money spent on getting and developing better teachers.

 65% of student said they want OUSD to spend more money on better teachers.

Good Teachers: "Believe in me," are "Supportive,"
 "Care," and " Push me,"

Bad Teachers: "Only care about who's on track,"
"Don't care," are "Boring", and "Not fun."

### Finding #5 Continuation Schools Continuation students have less resources compared to comprehensive and small schools to succeed in life after high school.

A student from a Focus Group at Rudsdale said, "We have classes where you don't get the essence of what it is they're teaching, therefore you are going to go to college and be lost. We don't have trigonometry, we don't have AP classes, we don't have calculus, you feel me, where's algebra two, where's the real economics class that's going to get us the basics." Finding #6

Student Decision Making & Voice When prioritizing what would make them more engaged in school, students said having their voices heard was the most important.

• Out of 12 options, the two most popular were students making decisions (68%) and internships/jobs (61%) in OUSD to include student voice throughout the district.

• A student said: "I think about [dropping out] all the time because the school doesn't really let us express ourselves. The only way we can express ourselves is if the school will benefit from it."

### **Our Vision:**

- Students are on all decision making bodies in OUSD.
- All schools have equal access to rigorous, high-level classes, no matter the size of school, race, and gender of students.
- Resources for all: Technology, Quality Books & Supplies, Credentialed & Supported Teachers, Preparation Programs.
- We CAN reach the goal of 100% Graduation & Preparation.
- All students are able to access college & succeed academically.
- All teachers have one-on-one relationships with students, and engage students through relevant curriculum.
- Students are effective community leaders for positive social change and learn how to run the city of Oakland.

### RECOMMENDATIONS

#### 1) **MEANINGFUL COUNSELING PROGRAMS:**

- We need strong, caring counselors to help us not only with college and career, but also life mentoring.
- Counselors follow students from middle to high school.
- An online system where students develop academic work plans and set goals, track progress on A-H classes, make appointments with counselors, register complaints, and get related information.

#### 2) <u>CURRICULUM TO PREPARE US:</u>

- Cross-coordination across classes.
- Learning about OUR History & Literature: Ethnic Studies
- Establish meaningful internships for EVERY STUDENT to experience within 4 years of high school.

### 3) **STUDENT DECISION MAKING:**

- Master schedule classes & curriculum
- Hiring & evaluating teachers and administrators
- Developing campus improvement projects
- Code of Conduct development & implementation

#### 4) **SCHOOL & COMMUNITY ORGANIZATION PROGRAMS:**

- Organizations partner with teachers in classes
- Summits to present partner work & choose in the spring
- Community in schools, and schools in the community

#### 5) MORE RESOURCES FOR MOST STRUGGLING STUDENTS:

- Focus on Continuation schools, ELL students & Special Ed students
- Provide real assessments for struggling students
- Heavily resourced counseling & curriculum based on assessment

#### **RECOMMENDATIONS**

#### 6) **QUALITY TEACHING INITIATIVE:**

- New teachers should shadow highly-ranked teachers
- Teacher Pipeline for Oakland students
- There should be a student-led classes & students as aides
- Community-led professional development

### 7) <u>COLLEGE LEVEL RIGOR IN HIGH SCHOOL:</u>

- A-H classes with student voice in implementation
- More AP classes & teachers in all schools



- Work with All City Council to implement recommendations.
- Present to and follow-up with School Board Members & Administrators to resource our ideas and make them happen!
- Make a video for public education.
- Network with different groups around the country at AERA, May 13<sup>th</sup> CQE 100% Action, and Free Minds, Free People.
