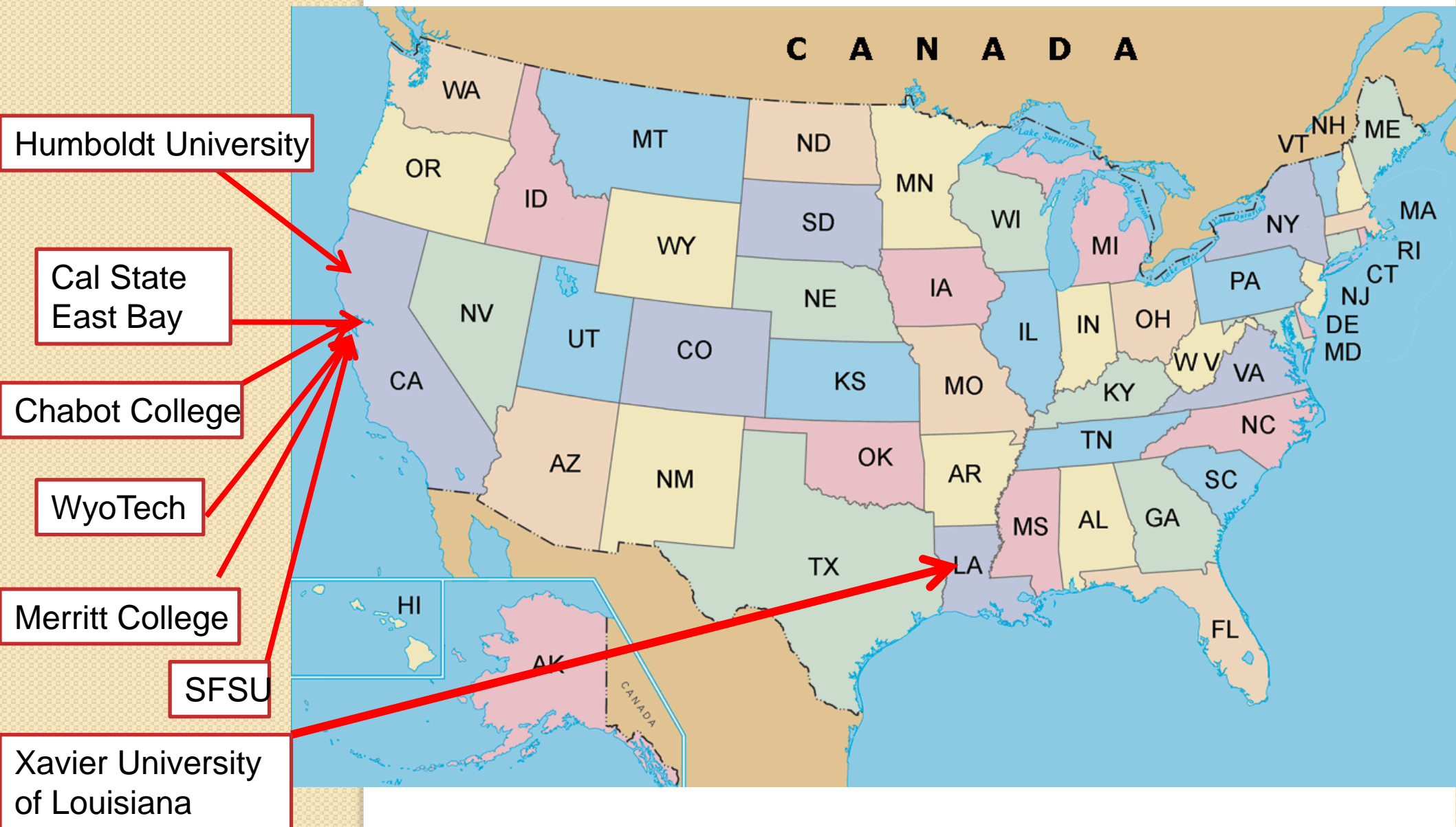

- Spanish, 3 years

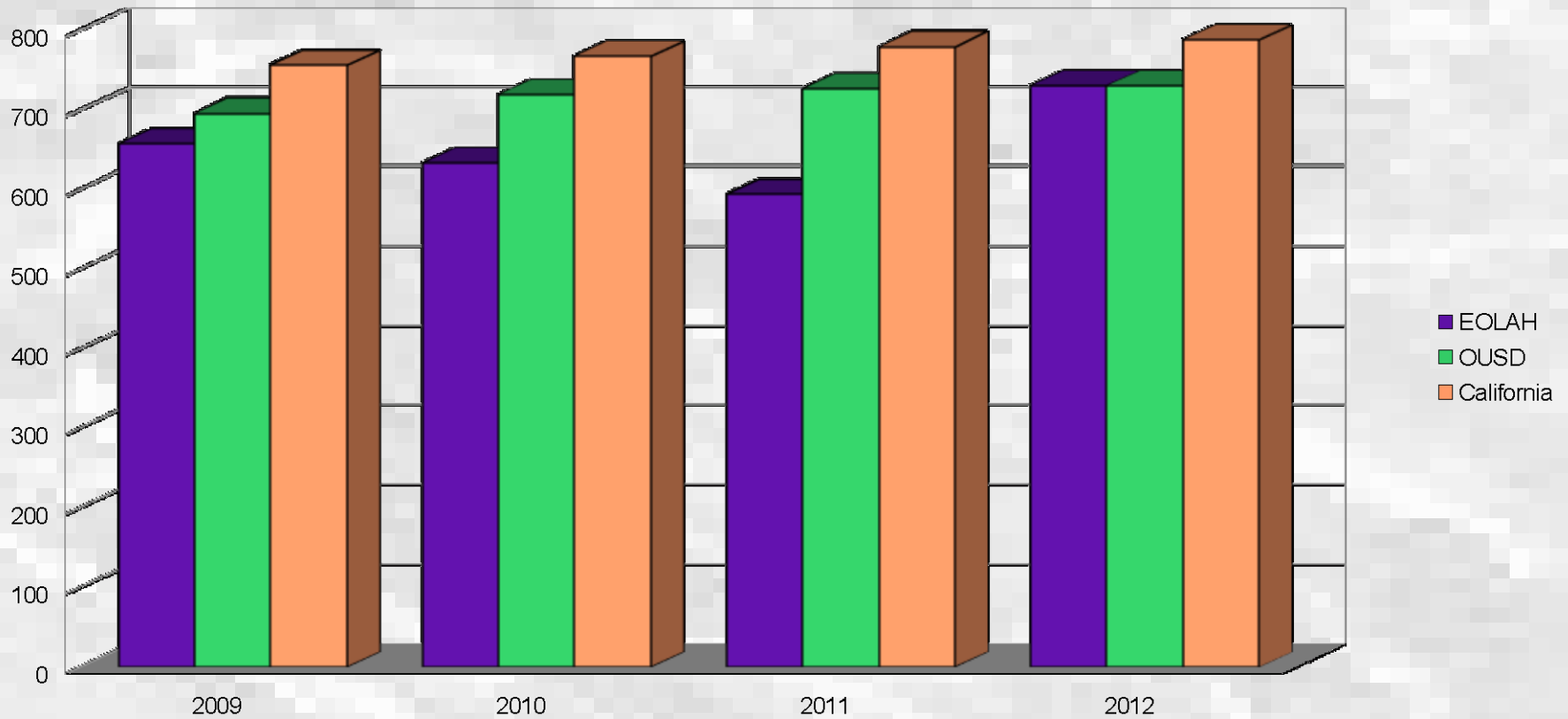
Our Academic Program

- CAHSEE Preparation, 1 year

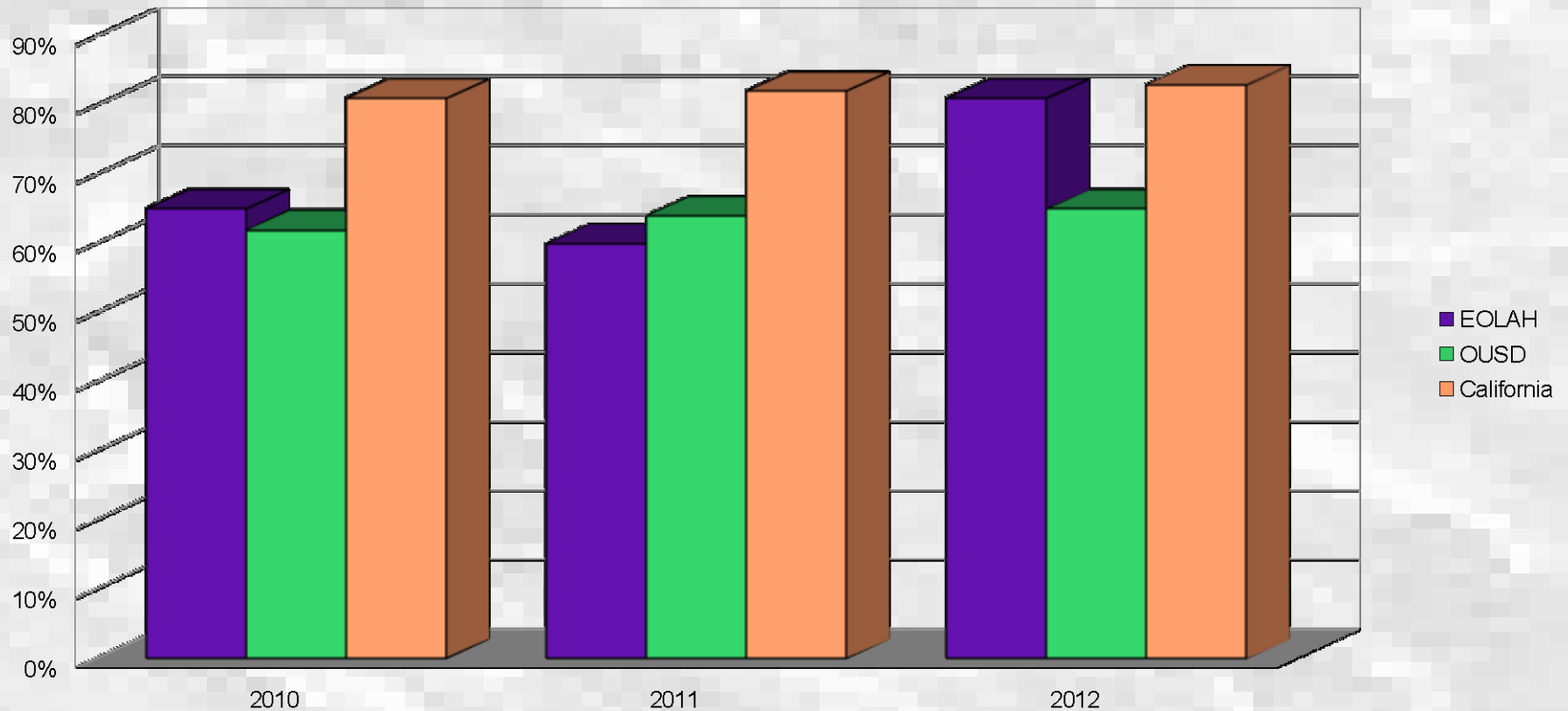
Our Academic Program

 - Implementation Summer 2013

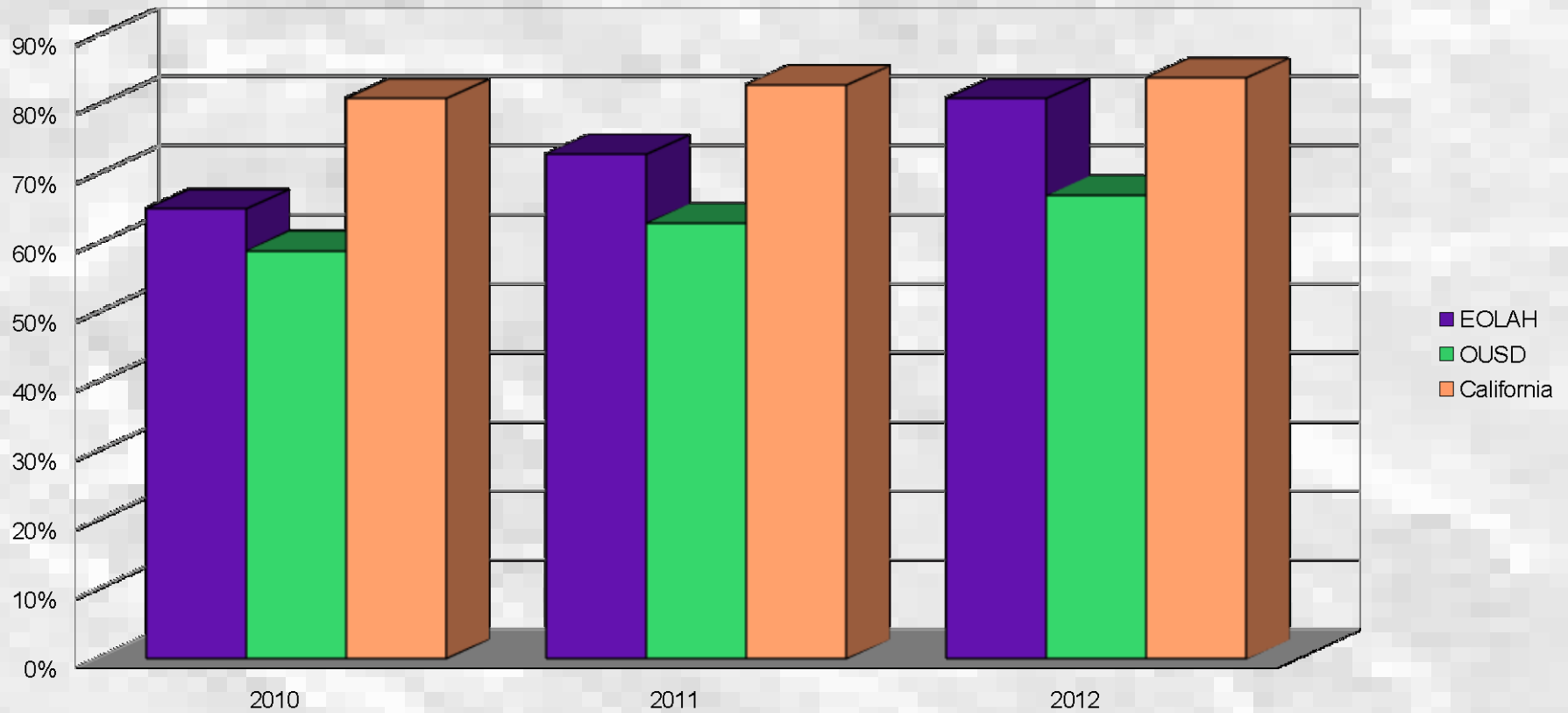
Our API Growth Data

Our Service Learning Program

- Service learning is a required course for all juniors and seniors.
- All students must complete 20 hours of community service during their eleventh and twelfth grade years.

Our After School Program



EOLAH After School Youth Leadership Program

- Learning 101: homework time, tutoring, and college preparation
- Inner and Outer Beauty: knowledge of self, public speaking, character building, personal hygiene, writing as self-expression
- Healthy Living: nutrition, physical activity, cooking with healthy recipes
- Abstinence for Pregnancy Prevention: STD awareness, consequences of teen pregnancy, teen birth rates, practicing abstinence
- Career Development: career choices, job interview preparation, resume and cover letter writing

Our Students

- 53 students
