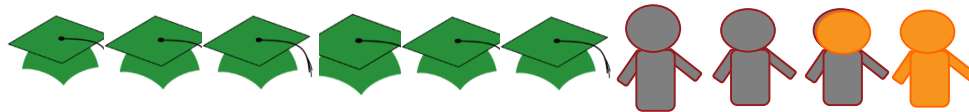

WHO IS MOST AT RISK FOR CSEC?

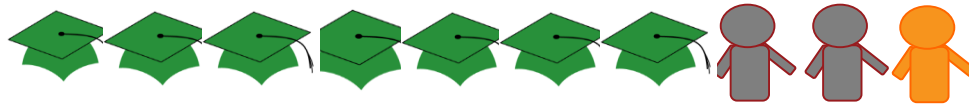
Students Not Graduating with Cohort by Gender

 Graduated  Dropped Out  Still Enrolled

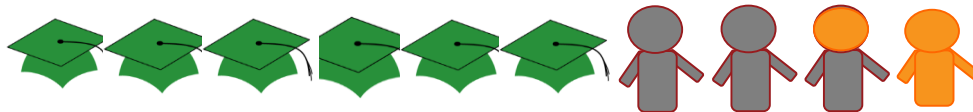
% and # **Not Graduating with Cohort**

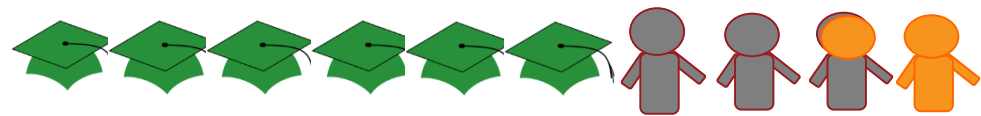

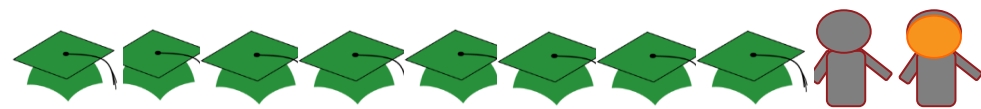
Students Not Graduating with Cohort by Ethnicity

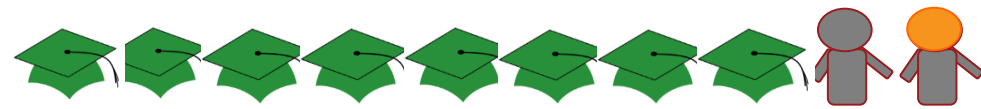
% and # Not Graduating with Cohort



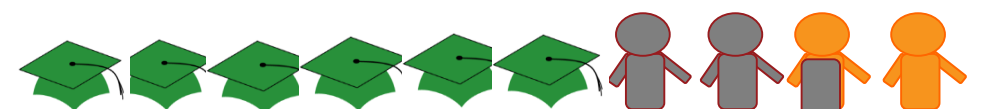

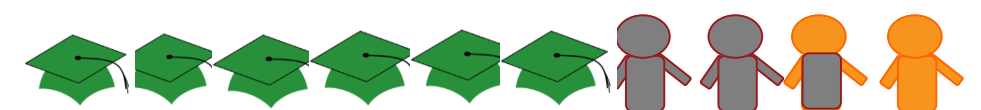

GOALS OF OUSD CSEC TASK FORCE

- Professional Development for Health and Mental Health Providers
- Prevention Education and Targeted Intervention Services for Students
- Prevention Education for Parents, Teachers, leadership, partners



ROOSEVELT MIDDLE SCHOOL

In 2011, in partnership with EBAYC, OUSD CSEC Task Force provided initial training for middle school parents concerned about safety and trafficking in the Fruitvale/San Antonio AKA “The Track.”



Training for Health and Mental Health Providers

October 2011 – All OUSD School Health Center and Mental Health providers trained in CSEC identification, intervention, and crisis services.

February 2014 – All OUSD School Health Providers trained in CSEC Screening Tool, CSEC identification, and response.

March - September 2014 - OUSD CSEC Task Force trains Mental Health providers at WOMS, Bret Harte, UFS, Roosevelt, Roots, Frick, Madison to provide “LOVE DON’T HURT” CSEC orientation and targeted intervention program.



OUSD CSEC Task Force Accomplishments

- Guided development of OSP CSEC First Response Protocol, with Bay Area Women Against Rape and OPD
- Member Alameda County Safety Net Case Conference for minors at Juvenile Justice Center
- Developed CSEC Parent Alert Letter to all middle and high school principals for distribution to parents in multiple languages
- Bret Harte and United for Success middle schools complete LOVE DON'T HURT orientation, begin 6-week group intervention
- Collaborating with DA to launch CSEC Prevention Toolkit for High Schools



CSEC TASK FORCE Objectives for 2015-2016

All 7th graders in OUSD will have received “LOVE DON’T HURT” CSEC prevention orientation

All OUSD 7th graders identified as “at-risk” for CSEC will complete “LOVE DON’T HURT” 6-week early intervention group

All students identified as CSEC will receive screening, intervention and referral

All OUSD staff and parents will receive information about CSEC prevention and intervention services

INCORPORATE CSEC PREVENTION INTO OUR HS HEALTH EDUCATION

PRIORITIZE TIME AND FUNDING FOR ALL MIDDLE SCHOOLS TO IMPLEMENT “LOVE DON’T HURT” PREVENTION
