

8. Invoicing

Invoices furnished by CONTRACTOR under this Agreement must be in a form acceptable to OUSD. All amounts paid by OUSD shall be subject to audit by OUSD.

- 9. Status of Contractor: This is not an employment contract. CONTRACTOR, in the performance of this Agreement, shall be and act as an independent contractor. CONTRACTOR understands and agrees that it and all of its employees shall not be considered officers, employees, agents, partner, or joint venture of OUSD, and are not entitled to benefits of any kind or nature normally provided employees of OUSD and/or to which OUSD's employees are normally entitled, including, but not limited to, State Unemployment Compensation or Worker's Compensation. CONTRACTOR shall assume full responsibility for payment of all Federal, State, and local taxes or contributions, including unemployment insurance, social security and income taxes with respect to CONTRACTOR's employees. In the performance of the work herein contemplated, CONTRACTOR is an independent contractor or business entity, with the sole authority for controlling and directing the performance of the details of the work, OUSD being interested only in the results obtained.

10. Insurance:

- 1. Commercial General Liability Insurance: Unless specifically waived by OUSD, the following insurance is required:
 - i. If CONTRACTOR employs any person to perform work in connection with this Agreement, CONTRACTOR shall procure and maintain at all times during the performance of such work, Workers' Compensation Insurance in conformance with the laws of the State of California and Federal laws when applicable. Employers' Liability Insurance shall not be less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) per accident or disease.

The policy shall protect CONTRACTOR and OUSD in the same manner as though each were separately issued. Nothing in said policy shall operate to increase the Insurer's liability as set forth in the policy beyond the amount or amounts shown or to which the Insurer would have been liable if only one interest were named as an insured.
- iii. If CONTRACTOR is offering OUSD professional advice under this Contract, CONTRACTOR shall maintain Errors and Omissions insurance or Professional Liability insurance with coverage limits of One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) per claim.

- iv. CONTRACTOR is not required to maintain any insurance under this agreement. (Completed and approved Waiver of Insurance Form is required.) Waiver of insurance does not release CONTRACTOR from responsibility for any claim or demand.
- 11. Licenses and Permits: CONTRACTOR shall obtain and keep in force all licenses, permits, and certificates necessary for the performance of this Agreement.

- 12. **Assignment:** The obligations of CONTRACTOR under this Agreement shall not be assigned by CONTRACTOR without the express prior written consent of OUSD.
- 13. Anti-Discrimination. It is the policy of OUSD that in connection with all work performed under Contracts there be no discrimination against any employee engaged in the work because of race, color uncestry, national origin, religious creed, physical disability, medical condition, marital status, sexual orientation, gender, or age and therefore the CONTRACTOR agrees to comply with applicable Federal and California laws including, but not limited to the California Fair Employment and Housing Act beginning with Government Code Section 12900 and Labor Code Section 1735 and OUSD policy. In addition, the CONTRACTOR agrees to require like compliance by all its subcontractor(s). Contractor shall not engage in unlawful discrimination in employment on the basis of actual or perceived; race, color, national origin, uncestry, religion, age, marital status, pregnancy, physical or mental disability, medical condition, veteran status, gender, sex or sexual orientation.
- 14. **Drug-Free / Smoke Free Policy**. No drugs, alcohol, and/or smoking are allowed at any time in any buildings and/or grounds on OUSD property. No students, staff, visitors, CONTRACTORS, or subcontractors are to use drugs on these sites.
- 15. Indemnification: CONTRACTOR agrees to hold harmless, indemnify, and defend OUSD and its officers, agents, and employees from any and all claims or losses accruing or resulting from injury, damage, or death of any person, firm, or corporation in connection with the performance of this Agreement. CONTRACTOR also agrees to hold harmless, indemnify, and defend OUSD and its elective board, officers, agents, and employees from any and all claims or losses incurred by any supplier, contractor, or subcontractor furnishing work, services, or materials to CONTRACTOR in connection with the performance of this Agreement. This provision survives termination of this Agreement.
- 16. Copyright/Trademark/Patent/Ownership. CONTRACTOR understands and agrees that all matters produced under this Agreement shall become the property of OUSD and cannot be used without OUSD's express written permission. OUSD shall have all right, title and interest in said matters, including the right to secure and maintain the copyright, trademark, and/or patent of said matter in the name of OUSD. CONTRACTOR consents to use of CONTRACTOR's name in conjunction with the sale, use, performance and distribution of the matters, for any purpose and in any medium. These matters include, without limitation, drawings, plans, specifications, studies, reports, memoranda, computation sheets, the contents of computer diskettes, artwork, copy, posters, billboards, photographs, videotapes, audiotapes, systems designs, software, reports, diagrams, surveys, source codes or any other original works of authorship, or other documents prepared by CONTRACTOR or its Sub-CONTRACTORs in connection with the Services performed under this Agreement. All works shall be works for hire as defined under Title 17 of the United States Code, and all copyrights in those works are the property of OUSD.
- 17. **Waiver:** No delay or omission by either party in exercising any right under this Agreement shall operate as a waiver of that or any other right or prevent a similar subsequent act from constituting a violation of the Agreement.
- 18. Termination: OUSD may at any time terminate this Agreement upon written notice to CONTRACTOR. OUSD shall compensate CONTRACTOR for services satisfactorily provided through the date of termination. In addition, OUSD may terminate this Agreement for cause should CONTRACTOR fail to perform any part of this Agreement. In the event of termination for cause, OUSD may secure the required services from another contractor. If the cost to OUSD exceeds the cost of providing the services pursuant to this Agreement, CONTRACTOR shall pay the additional cost.
- 19. Conduct of Consultant. CONSULTANT will adhere to the following staff requirements and provide OUSD with evidence of staff qualifications, consistent with invoicing requirements outlined in Section 8, which include:
 - 1. Tuberculosis Screening
 - 2. Fingerprinting of Employees and Agents. CALIFORNIA YOUTH OUTREACH SCHOOL BASED SERVICE MENU

Gang Awareness Curriculum for Youth

- 8 Week problem solving program consisting of structured two-hour per week sessions
- Video presentations, in-depth discussions and written exercises targeting Anger Management Skill development
- Topics include but not limited to the Nature of Gang Lifestyle, Cost of Living a Gang "Lifestyle" and New Gang Laws and Enhancements
- One-on-One counseling for gang involved youth available on and off site upon assessment and/or referral

Gang Awareness Presentation for Adults

- One time presentation geared for parents aspiring to "Gang Proof" their children
- Topics include but not limited to the Signs of Gang Involvement, Gang Paraphernalia and Tips on talking with your child about gangs
- Various resources will also be available regarding the affect gangs have on family life
- In addition, presentations are also available for Teachers and School Administrators, designed to enforce prevention/intervention
- Presentations include an assessment of the neighboring community to identify local gangs, tags, hot spots, etc. by a CYO staff member

Truancy Case Management (Eligible Service) — CYO intends to provide intervention at an early age, focusing on the middle schools allows the youth to learn the social and self- disciplinary skills needed to succeed and feel accepted within their school and society as a whole. CYO proposes to serve a minimum of 150 high-risk truant middle school and high school youth in addition to their families in Oakland.

- <u>Screening Assessment and Referral</u> Upon receipt of referral a CYO staff member meets with the youth and provides a home visit with
 their family to determine the specific need for services, then implements a formulated attendance plan. Depending on the needs
 identified for the youth and/or family during the screening process, they may be referred to another local service for treatment. Part of
 the assessment process is the use of the RPRA
- Case Management An Individual Service Plan (ISP) will be formulated by the youth, YIS, parents and the probation officer. The ISP will determine whether a short or long-term case management is required. As part of the plan, clients agree to abide by important conditions of the program which confirm the desire of the youth to change, some conditions include: present school attendance regularly, keep all appointments with program staff, no drug or alcohol usage while participating in project activities, respect of staff and other participants, no gang colors, tagging or signs flashed while at program sites or on field trips, etc. The YIS will work with the youth to identify the causes of truancy and re-enroll them or transfer them to a learning environment where they may be successful. The youth are responsible for developing a 30-day renewable plan outlining their goals, objectives, outcomes and a schedule of services for the year that they will participate in. The YIS also refer the youth and/or their family to other CYO program services or outside sources of assistance as needed. In addition, client emergency crisis intervention is used to assist clients with Immediate needs such as bus passes, non-gang clothing, food, etc.

School Success/Life Skills Development Curriculum

- CYO provides a school success program with a structured one-hour per week life skills curriculum. The program includes video presentations, discussions and written exercises
- Topics consist of Violence Prevention, Education and Personal Goal Setting, Problem Solving, Communication/Anger Mgmt skills
- The class structure uses a group process allowing the youth to reflect their personal/family life experiences, personal crisis points, experience with violence and encounters with the law, etc. All YIS instructors must be certified by the Agency in the curriculum
- The class provides the youth a broader perspective on how current choices are affecting their opportunities to succeed in life
- Ultimately the youth are led to identify positive alternative behaviors and lifestyles, along with this knowledge they learn some life skills
 required to make alternative choices and encouraged to continue working with CYO in setting and reaching positive goals
- The YIS provide two hour field trips or pro-social activities as incentives for program participation and success.

Referrals

- The school based truancy intervention program will have staff assigned to all schools and the YIS will accept referral of clients by the social administrators, teachers, counselors, SARB, parents or the youth themselves
- At the beginning of the school year the YIS will visit the teachers and classrooms, introduce themselves and the work of CYO staff in addition to determining a what days and times are available/convenient
- YIS will walk the campus in order to be visible at the school also be available before, during, after school in addition to lunch breaks

Expected Results/Projected Outcomes

- 80% of the youth in the Truancy Case Mgmt program will complete the school year with reduced truancy and disciplinary actions
- CYO will track and record all relevant data in order to deliver the following outcomes:
 - (1.) 80% of the youth referred to the program will report increased success in school

 - (3.) At least 50% of parents of the youth referred to the program will report improved involvement in their children's education


