Caring & Connected Community

- Robust Tier 1 PBIS and SEL curriculum implementation
- Extensive Tier 2 and 3 interventions:
 - 3 therapy/skills groups
 - 10 students receiving individual therapy
- Multitude of teams and clubs to build student connection and belonging:
 - flag football, basketball, cheer, soccer teams
 - boys' club, girls' club, roller skating club, student council, student newspaper, chess club
