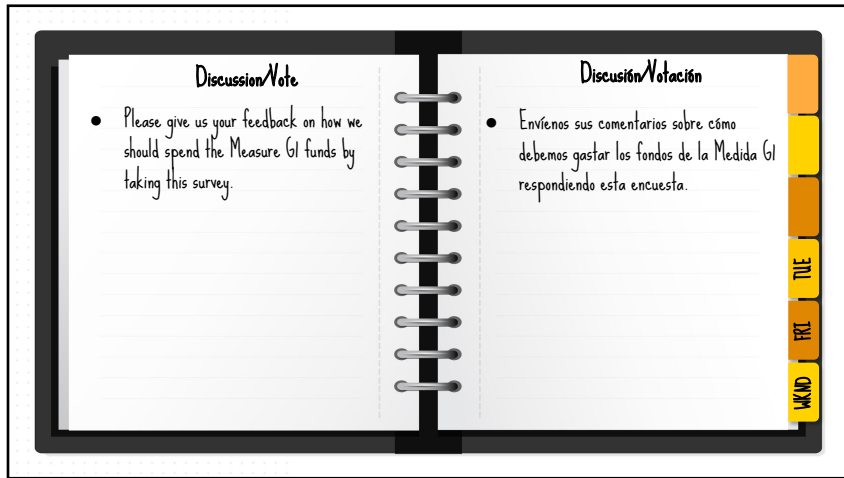
Sanctuary Status and Information on Immigration

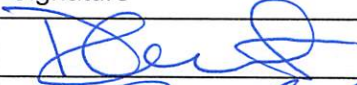
