


- Developed in 2005/2006 with community members as a response to NCLB Program Improvement (PI) Year 5 status of former school (Stonehurst Elementary)
- Opened in 2006/2007
- Entered PI Year 1 status in 2009
- Exited PI Status in 2011!

- Pre-K- 5th Grade
- Current Enrollment = 383
- >70% Latino
- >17% African American
- >10% Arabic
- >3% Other (Pacific Islander, Asian)
- 70% English Learners
- 95% Free and reducedprice lunch (although 100% students receive free meals due to their Provision II status.)

State Projected API Growth vs. KDA Actual API Growth




How Did KDA 2nd, 3rd, 4th, & 5th Graders Do on the Language Arts and Math CST over Two Years?




Korematsu CST ELA Increase of Success Rate: Proficient and Advanced


Korematsu CST Math Increase of Success Rate: Proficient and Advanced


Korematsu CST ELA Reduction of Failure Rate: Far Below Basic / Below Basic

Reflections on KDA's Growth: How did we get here? Where are we going?

- Consistent Teaching Staff: Amazing group of teachers unified around a single vision of student growth
- Consistent Leadership: No change in leadership over 6 years.
 Leadership is avidly focused on instruction
- Focused Coaching: Instructional Facilitator develops skills of teachers to use data to craft instruction
- Real Collaboration: Data Teams meet weekly to focus on inquiry process in disciplinary writing
- Focus on Social and Emotional Learning: School-wide, daily use of Caring Schools Community curriculum, consistent approach to school climate, increased mental health services

Reflections on KDA's Growth: How did we get here? Where are we going?

- <u>Direct instruction</u>: School-wide use of Direct Instruction model developed by staff specifically for KDA
- <u>Differentiation and Intervention</u>: Focusing resources around innovative, research-driven practices (e.g. Fast ForWord, RTI Deployment, one-on-one / small-group intervention)
- <u>Family Involvement</u>: Data-driven goal-setting practices supported by frequent progress reports
- Focus on Data and Goals: School-wide frequent analysis and recognition of performance
