## Student Director Report All City Council

January 15, 2014

On December 11, 2013 All City Council as well as other MSE Youth attended a meeting with the superintendent search firm. We were able to tell the search firm some of the qualities that we want from a new superintendent including: Attend community events so that OUSD students know who he/she is, commits to full implementation of A-G Courses available at all schools and electives, and supports the ACC Making A-G Real Campaign which includes implementing the student led recommendations.

On Tuesday November 17, 2013 All City Council held its Middle School General meeting at Bret Harte Middle School. In this meeting we helped the Middle School ACC Delegates create a timeline for the implementation of their specific leadership issues they want to address for their Action Project. Most of the middle school representatives have already completed the survey at their schools. The schools that came to the Middle School General meeting were Montera Middle School, Westlake Middle School, and Bret Harte Middle School.

One of the improvements that occurred at Montera Middle School was they were able to complete their surveys and to identify the root causes of the issues at their school. Bret Harte has improvements such as the school is cleaner, there are less fights, and less instances of bullying. Westlake has an improvement of getting conflict mediators.

Bret Harte and Westlake Middle School students are concerned about the lunches at their schools. Westlake Middle School has a remaining concern of fights and cliques at the school. Montera Middle School students are concerned about getting a chance to meet their school administration and having a meeting with AC transit. Bret Harte Middle School students are concerned about the lack of communication that they have with the administration of their school. One of the upcoming events for Bret Harte Middle School is their Washington, D.C. trip.

We could not hold the ACC High School Meeting on December 19<sup>th</sup> at Skyline high school because unfortunately there was a school lockdown.
