Charter Schools in Oakland by Authorizer

Over the past six years (since 2016-2017), the number of Charter schools in Oakland has decreased by six. In each of these years, the total number of charters has either gone down or remained flat.














Charter & District: Total Enrollment

Enrollment in both Oakland Charter schools and OUSD District schools has decreased over the past few years. For charter schools, this decrease has occurred over the past three years (compared to four continuous years of enrollment decreases for District schools).






Charter & District: % Enrollment Change

Based on the most recent annual enrollment data (2021-2022), Oakland Charter schools are experiencing total enrollment decreases at a greater rate than District schools.

















Resident vs Non-Resident Enrollment

Non-Oakland Residents











Enrollment by Attendance Area







Areas with Greatest % of Charter Enrollment
















Areas with Smallest % of Charter Enrollment















Charter Enrollment by Board District

School Level Enrollment for Charters

In general, most OUSD Charter schools saw a drop in total enrollment from 2020-2021 to 2021-2022.

Out of 28 OUSD Charter schools:

- 19 schools experienced a <u>drop</u> in enrollment from the year prior
- 5 schools saw an increase in enrollment
- 4 schools maintained enrollment levels


Across all charter schools, the median enrollment decrease was 19 fewer students.

Overall, total charter enrollment decreased by 549 students.

*Lodestar added a grade at the beginning of the 21-22 year. Without this added grade, Lodestar's 21-22 enrollment total would have actually decreased by 35 students.












Current Enrollment vs. Maximum Enrollment

13 schools were at or above 90% of their estimated enrollment maximum (as communicated in their petition).















Current Enrollment vs. Maximum Enrollment

Note: Lodestar and Francophone are currently adding grades/sections which accounts for the lower enrollment compared to their maximum














Charter & District: Student Demographics

The gap between OUSD district and charter schools was at its lowest in 2020-2021.









OUSD Charter schools had the highest percentage of English Language Learners in 2020-21 since 2014-15.












Charter & District: Socioeconomically Disadvantaged









Enrollment by Attendance Area (1)












2020-21 English Language Learner Percentage by School
