## NOTICE OF GRANT AWARD

The 2013-14 State Budget appropriated \$25 million to the California Community College Chancellors Office (CCCCO) to allocate funding for two-year planning and implementation grants in support of Adult Education programs. Funds have been provided to eligible consortia (as defined as partnerships between K-12 school districts and community colleges) for the purpose of developing regional plans for adult education programs. Assembly Bill 86 (AB 86) outlines expectations for planning and implementation requirements contained within the Adult Education Consortium Program. The intent of AB 86 is to better position California for incremental investments starting with the 2015-16 fiscal year to expand and improve the provision of adult education.

As a member of the Northern Alameda County Regional Consortium for Adult Education, the Oakland Unified School District's portion of the NACRCAE planning grant is \$157,209. The term of this grant shall be from March 5, 2014 to June 30, 2015.

According to AB 86, consortium members will use funding to develop regional plans for the education of adults in the following areas:

- 1. Elementary and basic skills;
- 2. Classes for immigrants (English as a Second Language, citizenship, and workforce preparation);
- 3. Programs for adults with disabilities;
- 4. Short term Career Technical Education (CTE) programs with high employment potential; and
- 5. Programs for apprentices

Disbursements shall be made in accordance with the following schedule:

## \$124,709 by June 30, 2014 with the balance of \$32,500 by August 31, 2014

Expenditure reports will be due in accordance with the following schedule:

3/5/14 - 6/30/14: [Due 7/31/14] 3/5/14 - 9/30/14: [Due 10/31/14] 3/5/14 - 12/31/14: [Due 1/31/15] 3/5/14 - 3/31/15: [Due 4/30/15] 3/5/14 - 6/30/15: [Due 7/31/15]
