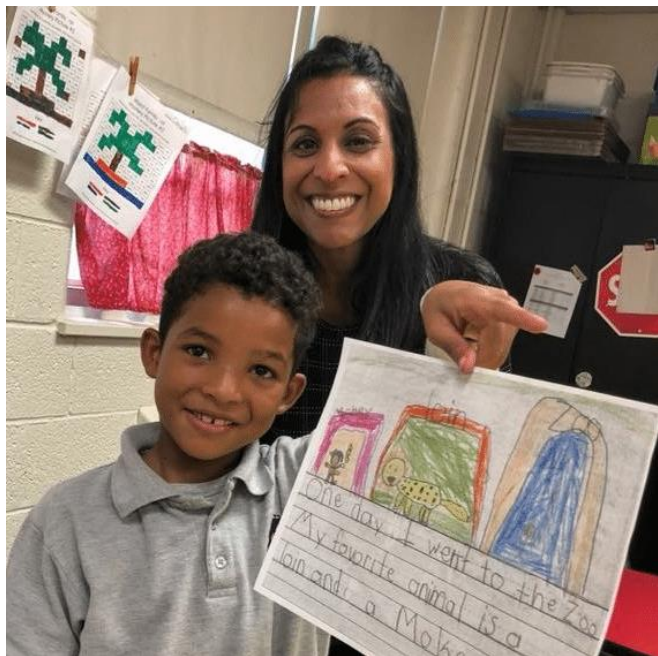
Aspire Public Schools (Aspire) was founded in 1998 and opened its first Bay Area school, Monarch Academy, in 2000.

Aspire Triumph Technology Academy (Triumph), opened in 2014.

Aspire's Vision



Aspire's Vision: Scholars are prepared and empowered to build a fulfilling and liberated future for themselves and their communities.

Proposed Changes

We propose a material revision to co-locate **Aspire Triumph Technology Academy** (Triumph) and **Aspire College Academy** (ACA) at the same campus **for the 2025-2026 school year.**

This is the start of a two-year process.

We plan to propose a merger in Fall 2025 during the ACA renewal hearing with a goal of one single TK-5 school for the 2026-2027 school year.



Material Revision: Benefits



Provide long-term stability to Aspire staff and students

Enhance academic offerings and support services, including more robust supports in behavioral health, special education, and more offerings for enrichment.

Address declining enrollment and rising costs that Oakland is experiencing

Material Revision: Future Academic Benefits

- More robust programming
- Facilities that better serve student needs
- For Triumph students, access to a playground and improved facility.
- Better leverage community partnerships across both schools
- Teacher planning partnerships and collaboration
- Shared professional development between schools, leveraging each site's strengths

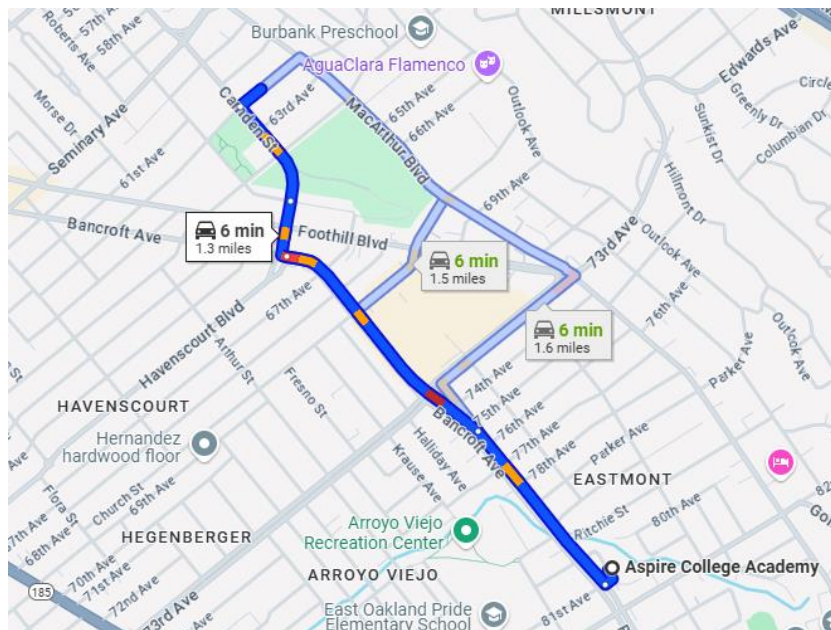


Material Revision: Logistics

1.5 mi = average distance from family homes to Triumph.

1.7 mi = average distance from family homes to ACA.

The average distance for Triumph families to reach schools will increase by 0.2 mi.

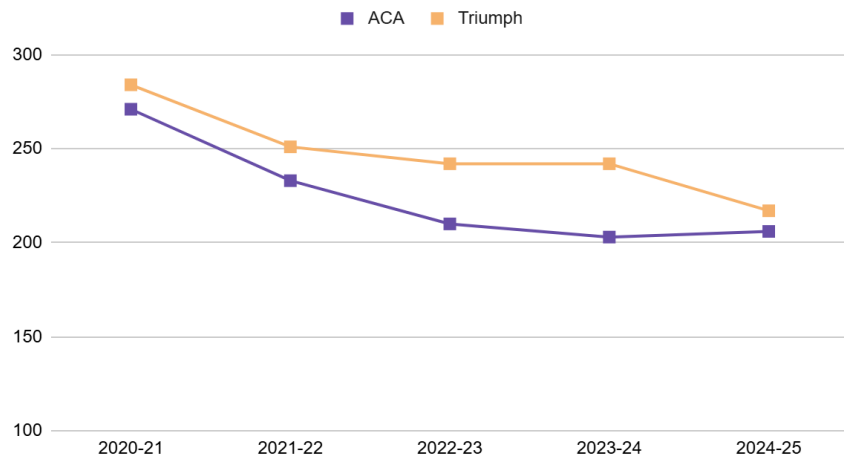

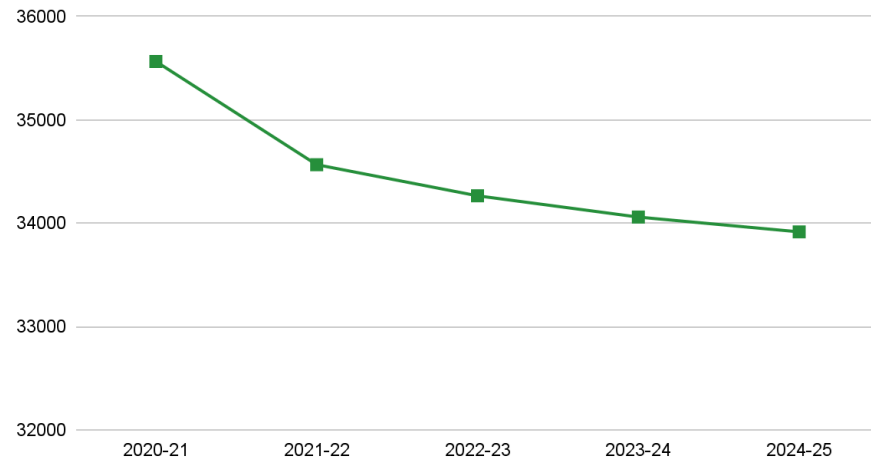


ACA, Triumph, and OUSD: Student Populations

ACA and Triumph: YTY Student Population

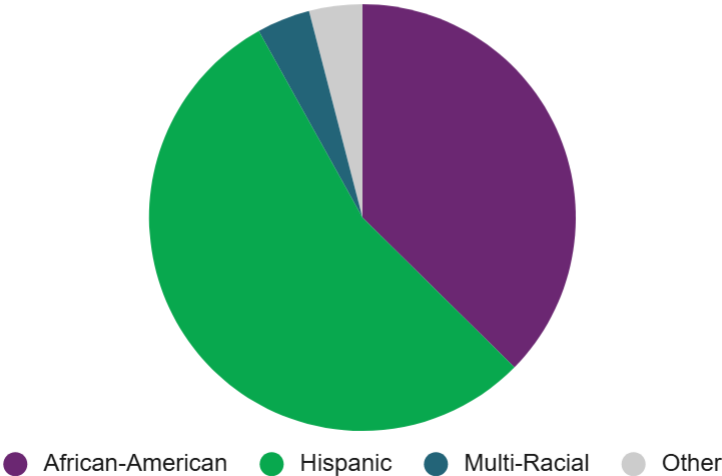


OUSD: YTY Student Population

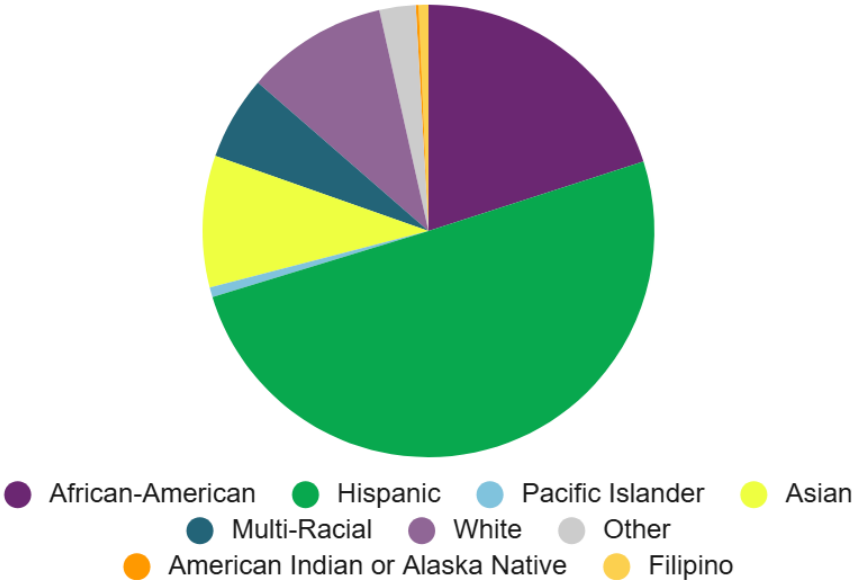


Student Demographics

(2024-25)

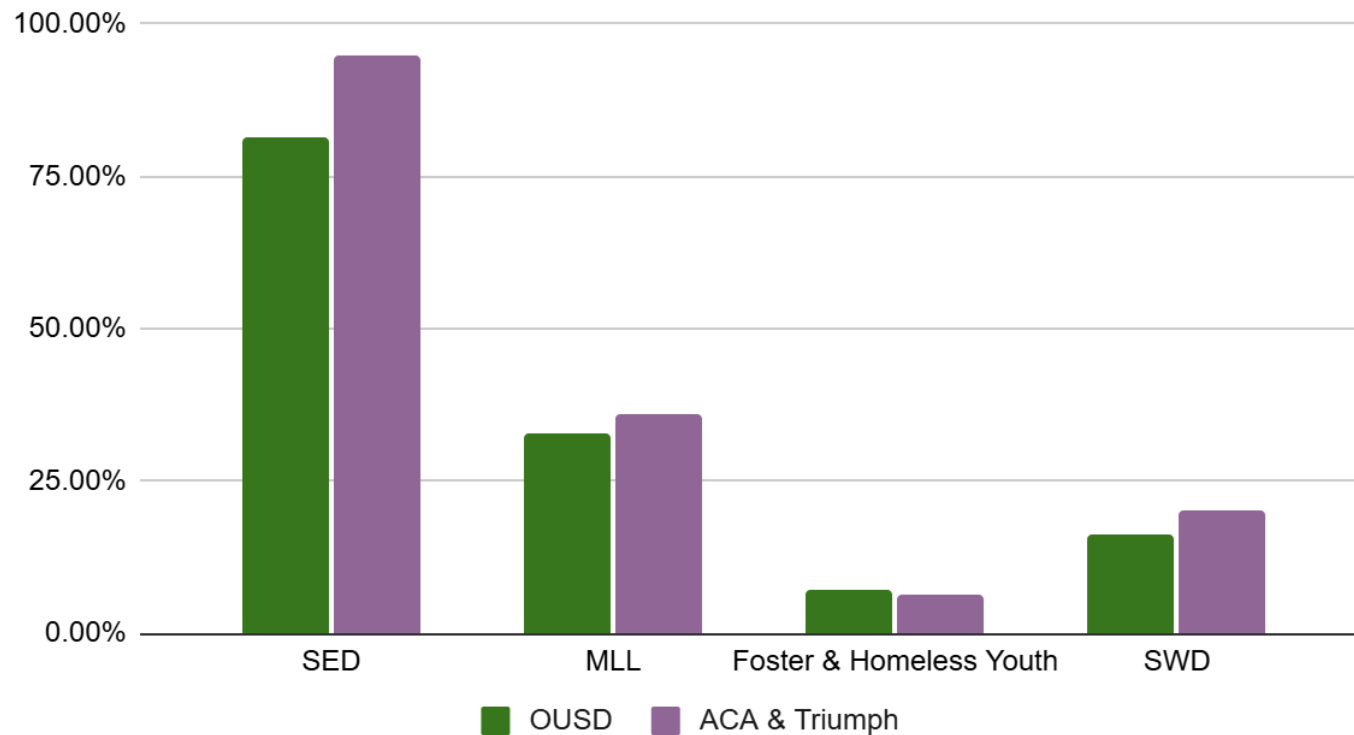


OUSD Student Demographics (2023-2024)

The first step toward a school merger is co-location.

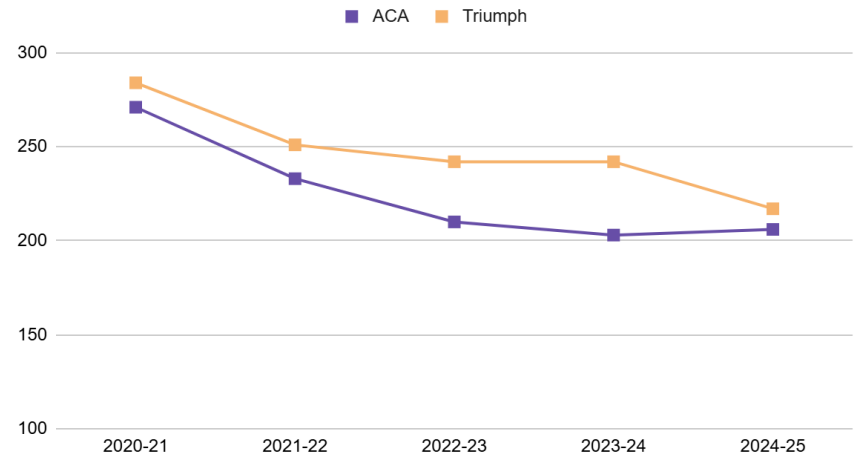
With the support of the OUSD Board, **Triumph would move to the Atherton campus in Fall 2025.**

The current campus capacity at Atherton is 392 students.

Material Revision: Projected Fiscal Sustainability

Co-location allows for economies of scale that streamline operations, services, and creates an opportunity for longer term sustainability.

Material Revision: Local Parish and Diocese

Co-location is possible without additional construction, however, we are proposing to add 3 additional classroom portables to add more flexible spacing for special programs and services.

The Diocese has approved these enhancements and we are in active partnership with them to move forward.
