WHEREAS, In 1926 Carter G. Woodson founded Black History Month - which was just a week at the time - to celebrate the accomplishments of great men and women such as Frederick Douglass, W.E.B. Dubois, Sojourner Truth, Mary McLeod Bethune and many others too numerous name ; and

WHEREAS, Woodson also hoped to shed light on the achievements of ordinary men and women whose quiet successes have helped advance their people and this country; and

WHEREAS, Carter himself lived an inspiration life as the son of former slaves who spent his childhood working in the Kentucky coal mines and enrolled in high school at age twenty before earning a Ph.D. from Harvard; and

WHEREAS, It is historical examples such as this, and real-life examples occurring across the country and in Oakland schools today, that can serve as a model for our children; and

WHEREAS, The path to success is rarely easy, but has been traveled time and again by those determined to conquer the odds; and

WHEREAS, It is this lesson of hard work and perseverance that Oakland Unified School District celebrates as we strive to prepare our students to both expect and to achieve success,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the State Administrator and the Board of Education of the Oakland Unified School District honor the 2009 edition of Black History month and recognize this unique chapter of the multilayered American story.
