Linked Learning

Approval of Motion to establish administrative regulations for charter high schools to use the professional services of the OUSD Office of Linked Learning.

Proposed Motion: The Measure N Commission hereby requests the Executive Director for College & Career Readiness (Executive Director of Measure N) to prepare and present to the Measure N Commission for its consideration proposed administrative regulations for how charter high schools access and utilize professional services of the OUSD Office of Linked Learning. Included in the proposed administrative regulations is a provision that when services are provided by OUSD employees and consultants not paid by the Measure N 10% allowable administrative cost account, costs for such services are calculated as accurately as possible and charged by OUSD to charter high schools or charter management organizations. If such services are provided by employees and consultants paid by the Measure N 10% allowable administrative cost account, charter high schools and charter management organizations should not be charged for such services rendered.

Vice Chairperson, Gregory Cluster presented the establishing of an Administrative Regulation for how charter high schools access and utilize professional services of the OUSD Office of Linked Learning. Included in the proposed administrative regulations is a provision that when services are provided by OUSD employees and consultants not paid by the Measure N 10% allowable administrative cost account, costs for such services are calculated as accurately as possible and charged by OUSD to charter high schools or charter management organizations. If such services are provided by employees and consultants paid by the Measure N 10% allowable administrative cost account, charter high schools and charter management organizations should not be charged for such services rendered.

After the presentation, Preston Thomas, Executive Director, College Career and Readiness shared:

- This is one of the complicated areas around figuring out what the minimum specs are for supporting school sites and what do you go above and beyond that
- Working deeply around intervention systems for students
- Figuring out exactly what the right way to do it, without over burdening the staff

The Commissioners and staff discussed about:

- Range of core supports that Measure N 10% should be providing to all schools, charter and district schools bucketing planning process, evaluation process, data process and the fiscal part
- Charter school identifying with the District and not taking advantage some of the resources that other district schools were experiencing and then when its came to planning time the plans were inadequate
- The three buckets: Baseline of what every school and students deserved for their 10% administrative, here's a menu of options things that can be proactively offered throughout the planning design and implementation process, and are the fees for technical assistants if you chose not to take advantage of services

Becky Flanigan spoke about:

- Charter is complicated, it's not a simple issue and there's a lot of strong feelings on both sides
- Will be bargaining a contract with American Indian
- In looking at budgets; need to be able to anticipate costs in how to implement it
- Charter schools are same as OUSD schools; the budgets need to be reviewed

David Silver, Director of Education, Office of Mayor Libby Schaaf presented a PowerPoint regarding The Oakland Promise history, where it is at and where it is going.

- The Oakland Promise Cradle to Career
- Vision We as a community will ensure every child in Oakland graduates high school with the expectations, resources, and skills to complete college and be successful in the career of his or her choice
- The four elements that are being brought to the table are:
- -Every baby is a brilliant baby
- -Kindergarten to College
- -18 Future Centers on 6 middle and 12 high school are a hub of resources, connection, and support
- -College Scholarships and Completion support

Mary Padden, Program Manager, Office of the Mayor, stated, she used to teach a Special Day class at Castlemont and when thinking about The Oakland Promise she thinks of it through the lens of, would this work for her students. There's certainly equity framework with Oakland Promise.

- All Oakland high school graduate get a free semester at Peralta

David Kakishiba, Chairperson, presented the table of contents for 2016-2017 Participatory Action Research Plan, 2016-2017 Measure B budget summary, and the 2015-2016 Student Outcome and Career Pathway Programs Baseline Report.

After Chair Kakishiba presented the item, a discussion developed between the Commission and staff regarding:

- Getting some quality measure in % of all students enrolled in pathway programs
- Student outcomes by school, by district, by charter status and also by pathways, where would the graduation rate accelerate and where the pathways that we see that is lagging
- Student instructional programs
- Will talk with Sr. Deputy Chief, David Montez, Continuous School Improvement regarding school performance framework
- Looking at National Student Clearing House Data
- Measure of College and Career Readiness is about whether the students are transitioning at the college and careers after they graduate
- Trying to collect for 22 years old and 24 years old now as baseline to look at the 9th grade class and what would happen 10 years' latter
- In the three year cycles what's the data that will be looked at system wide that could include employability and whether if there's persistent in college at increase rate
- 2016-2017 action research plan is looking at implementation not on students learning outcomes
- To also look at some one of the negative outcomes to stir the student away from; how does this effect incarceration, public assistants and benefit
- Add climate and culture measure that are part of the school performance framework
- Bigger picture conversations about longitudinal data
- Can track some baseline data for this year, 2015-2016 academic year
- College graduation rates, looking at the 5 year trends for the classes that are graduating last year as baseline
- Long term outcome: College persistent, college graduation, employment, criminal justice involvement or non-involvement, and trades and apprenticeships, and earnings
