- La fusión promete ahorros financieros mínimos y al mismo tiempo tiene el máximo efecto en la comunidad.

Dear Honorable School Board Members,

We, the undersigned families of Manzanita SEED and Manzanita Community School oppose the proposal of a merger for our two schools, put forth in the November 13, 2024 Board Meeting.

Community members from each of our schools have organized and attended several meetings to learn about the merger. **Last week our two schools met for a joint meeting to discuss the merger, and many concerns were voiced.** These include but are not limited to the following concerns:

- This merger is targeting two schools who collectively enroll more than 800 students. These two schools were created out of the recognition that students would be better served by smaller schools which could better address individual needs, and out of a recognition of inequity in school size between the hills and the flatlands. While small schools persist in the hills, merging these two high-needs schools in East Oakland flatlands seems to be a move going backwards. Mergers are proposed as a solution for “right-sizing” multiple “too-small” schools, but this is not the situation at our schools; neither school is small, and together they would be a mega-school.
- The merger promises minimal financial savings while having maximum effect on the community.
- Each school has a specialized character and intentional culture, that parents value, and which it is unclear would be retained in a merger. This includes but is not limited to the dual immersion program at one of the schools.
- There are a number of unanswered questions about whether the intended savings would be realized. Including, but not limited to, what would be the effect on “per school” grants that each school receives from the state and which cover a substantial amount of each school's budget.

We recognize that the huge size of the deficit across OUSD will require painful adjustments across all schools. However, the merger proposal is not strategic. It has a huge impact on vulnerable communities, with unclear and minimal at best savings, and is being proposed on a timeline that does not offer space for considering any of these concerns.

We request that you vote no on this merger proposal.

More broadly, we request a community-wide process, with adequate support, and a much longer timeline - such as a full year - to make decisions as a community for how district savings goals will be met in our schools.

Last week, the joint meeting between our two schools, run by EBAYC demonstrated how powerful it is for communities to have support via organizations skilled in equitable group outreach and facilitation to guide collective decision-making. Organizing in our diverse multilingual communities requires additional time and support, especially for translation. We request that as OUSD undergoes this difficult financial transition, that school communities be provided with support and resources, to make these difficult decisions
