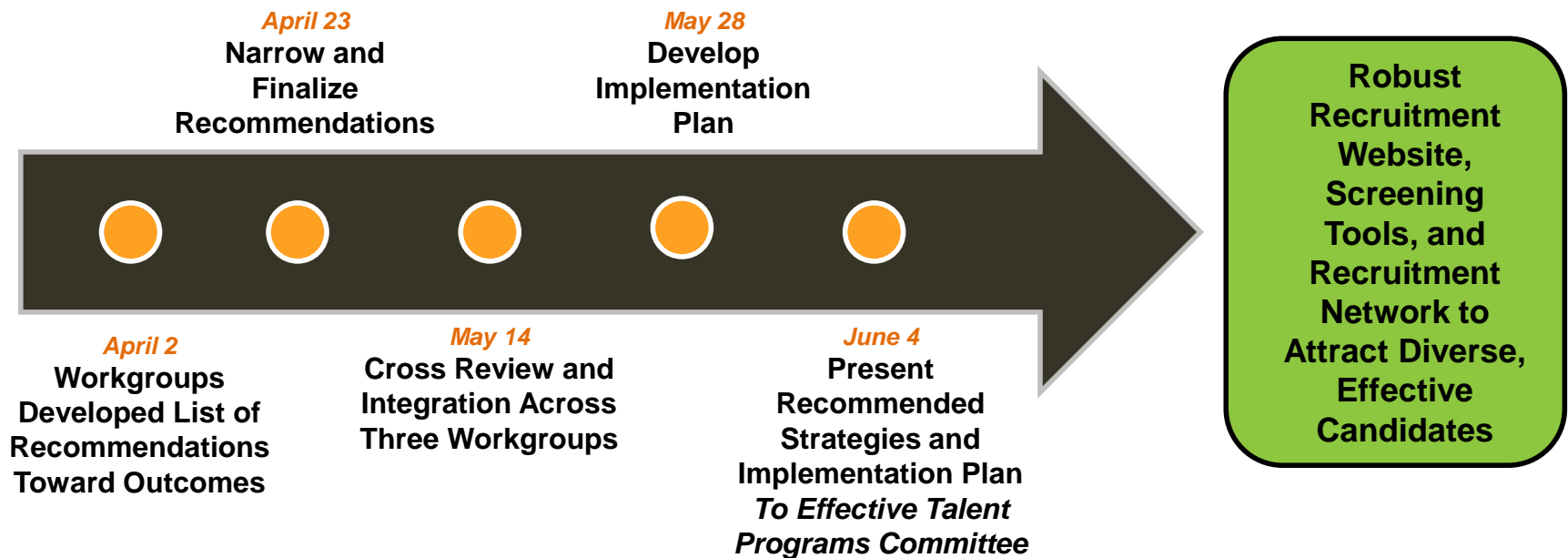

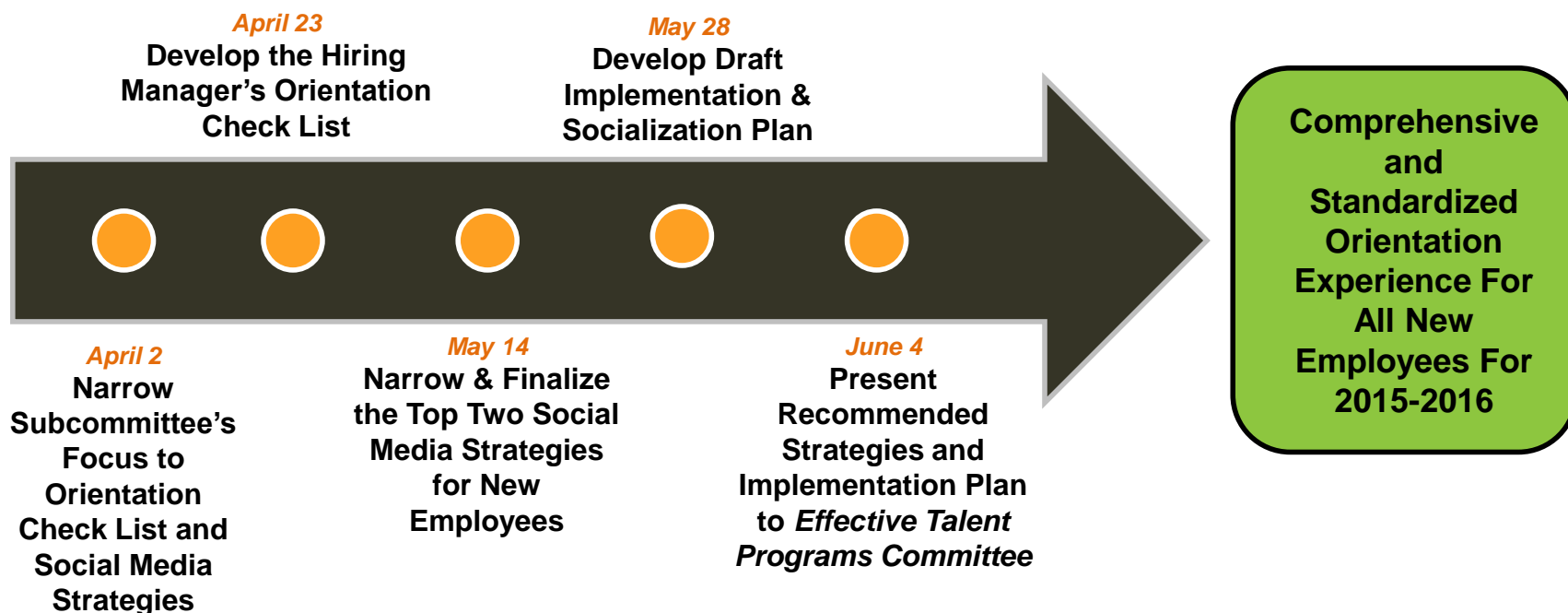

## Outcome of Subcommittee Group:

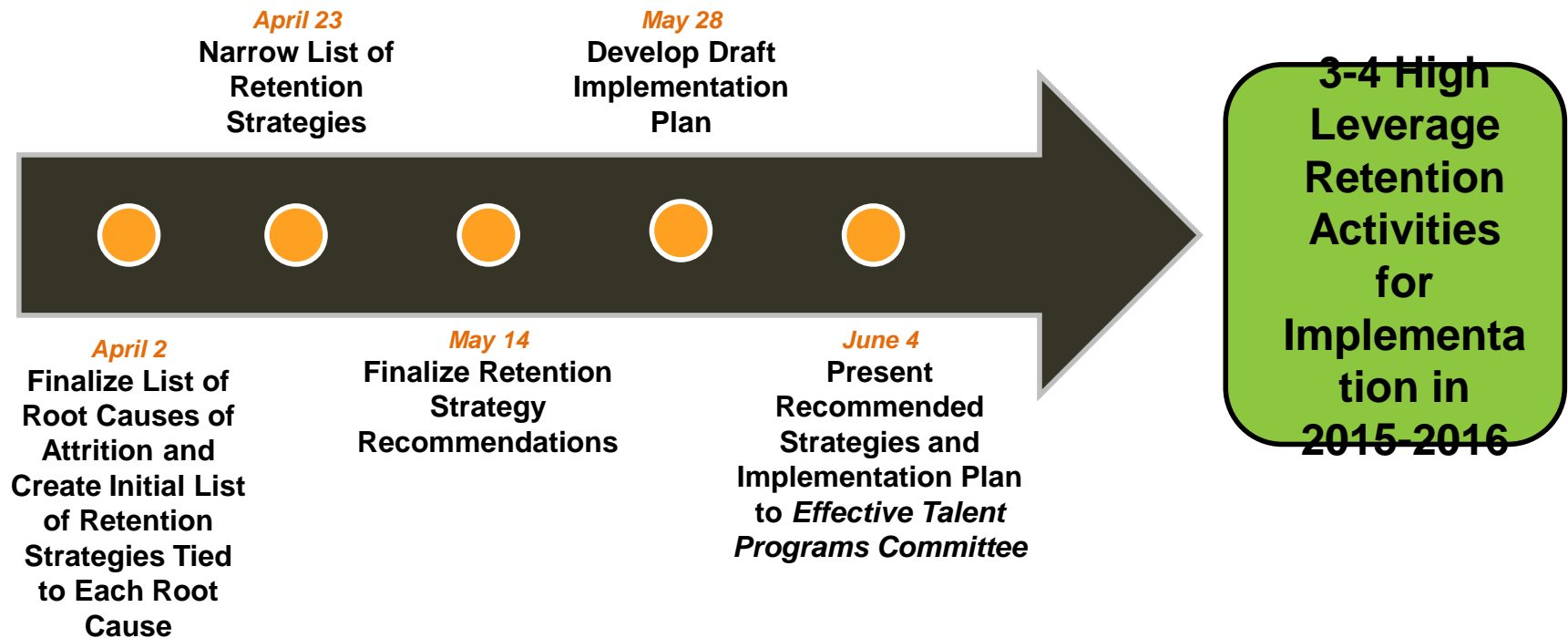
- **Orientation:** Develop a comprehensive template for all hiring managers to use for 1-30-60-90 day orientation for new employees

**WHY**  
The Board of Education passed a Quality School Development (QSD) Policy to support the following:  
Board of Education is responsible for ensuring that the Oakland Unified School District (OUSD) is a high-quality full-service community school district that serves the whole child, addresses emerging and persistent challenges and opportunities in the district.

The Board of Education is committed to providing all students a continuum of high-quality schools, including schools that are directly operated by the OUSD, public charter schools authorized by the Oakland Unified School District, and schools funded by but not exclusively operated by the Oakland Unified School District.

**WHAT**  
The Board of Education has called for Administrative Regulations (operating procedures) to ensure Transparency, Consistency, and Alignment between the policy's intent and the actions taken to implement it.

**The OUSD Admin Regs Sub-Committee will provide feedback and input on the contents of the Administrative Regulations and the process of implementing them.**

**HOW**  
The Sub-Committee will explore the following values within the policy to ensure they are reflected in the Administrative Regulations:

    - define terms, explore the Draft regulations
    - make immediate recommendations for improvements (draft)
    - discuss and provide feedback and input on the implementation
  - Collaboration
  - Capacity Building
  - Support

    - Are the right structures and systems in place to ensure success?

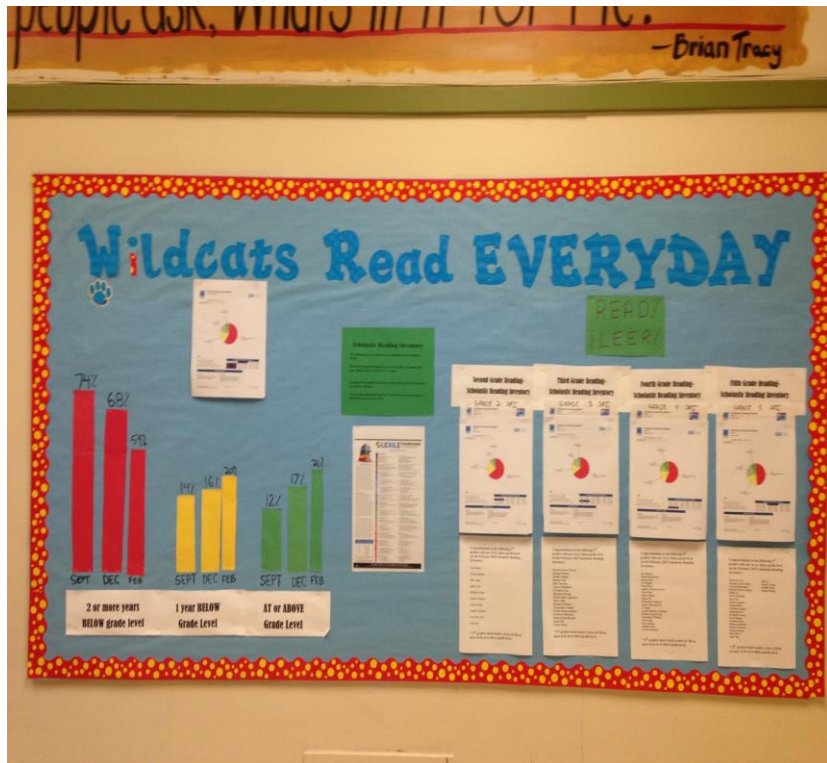

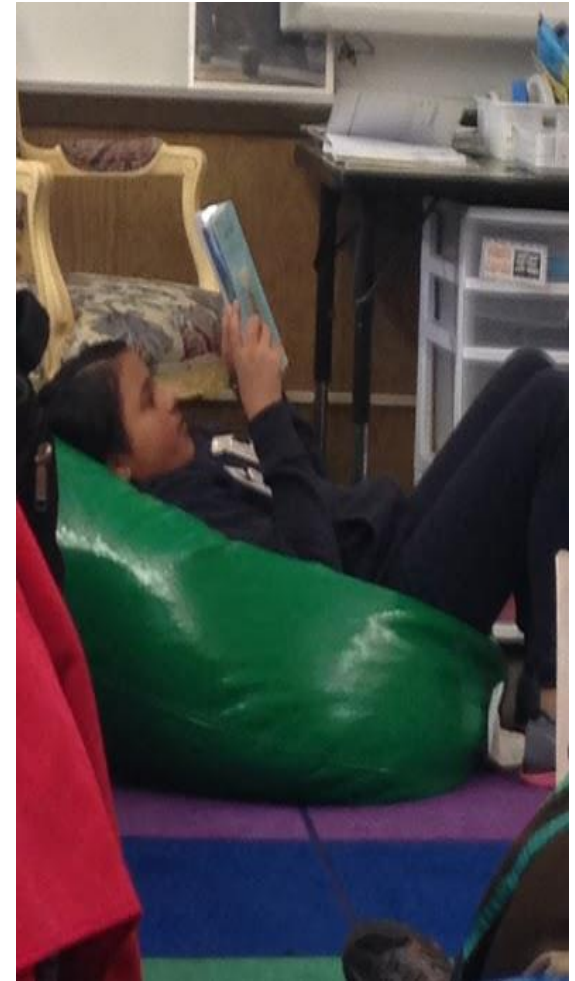
