The OUSD has a large & diverse refugee and newcomer student population many of whom have had significant gaps in their education prior to coming to the U.S. (in addition to acute & on-going trauma in many cases) and many of whom speak little to no English when they arrive. In order to engage in school & succeed academically, they require supplemental support (as described in Title III Immigrant supplemental funds). Funded by the US Office Of Refugee Resettlement and Title III Immigrant Funds, the OUSD'S Refugee and Asylee Student Assistance Program (RASAP) provides supportive educational services to newly- arrived refugee families who have arrived under the auspices of the US government, and through federally-contracted resettlement agencies. Independent contractor, Zack Reidman, has experience starting refugee community gardens in Oakland that provide healthy, productive, safe spaces for immigrant families to grow their own food, utilize their skills, build cross cultural friendships, and strengthen cross generational ties. In addition to focusing on healthy activities and growing healthy food, the community gardens will incorporate a garden based ELD curriculum, as well as a school-connectedness component that will serve to better connect newly resettled linguistically isolated refugee families to their children's education. 8. Status of Contractor: This is not an employment contract. CONTRACTOR, in the performance of this Agreement, shall be and act as an independent contractor.
