Background A one paragraph explanation of why the consultant's services are needed.	To facilitate the attainment of the District and Strategic goals for higher student achievement, the Office of Research, Assessment and Data (RAD) has identified the continuing need for regular progress and benchmark assessments that provide formative and summative test data to aid in the identification of gaps in student understanding and key programmatic areas. To serve the purposes outlined above, RAD recommends that the progress and benchmark assessments align to the district's standards-based pacing guides and be administered several times during the academic year.

Discussion One paragraph summary of the scope of work.

Action Learning Systems, Inc. (ALS) has been providing licensed benchmark assessments to OUSD since the 2007-08 academic year. ALS has a history of working with several schools districts within California, such as Garden Grove and Sacramento, which share similarities with OUSD. Testimonials from these school districts suggest that the assessments developed by ALS are well aligned to the state standards and are as rigorous in content as the CST. Notice shall be effective when received if personally served or, if mailed, three days after mailing. Either party must give written notice of a change of address. CONTRACTOR shall submit invoices in a form that includes the name of the person providing the service, the service performed, the date service was rendered, and the hours spent on the work.

- 17. Walver: No delay or omission by either party in exercising any right under this Agreement shall operate as a waiver of that or any other right or prevent a similar subsequent act from constituting a violation of the Agreement.
- 18. Termination: OUSD may at any time terminate this Agreement upon written notice to CONTRACTOR. OUSD shall compensate CONTRACTOR for services satisfactorily provided through the date of termination. In addition, OUSD may terminate this Agreement for cause should CONTRACTOR fail to perform any part of this Agreement.
