Background	Federal Law and California Education Code require a Special Education Local Plan Area (SELPA) to provide a full continuum of program options. When a school district or SELPA does not have an appropriate public education program for a student, a non- public school (NPS) and/or the services of a non-public agency (NPA) shall be made available. The District places students in a NPS for services such as Day Treatment, Residential Treatment, Extreme Behaviors and Severely Disabled students. The District uses the services of an NPA to supplement in-house staff services such as Speech and Language Therapists. This Individual Service Agreement is necessary to meet the needs of a student requiring specialized care to meet his/her educational needs as deemed through his/her IEP.
