The RFP/Q for a Lease — Lease Back (LLB) developer/services was sent out in late July.

Opportunities for some administrators to leave 1000 Broadway before the end of the lease are being explored as a means of managing the budget. Solutions for an off-site parking lot will be considered within the larger approach to land planning.

In 2013, OUSD's central offices were damaged by flood, causing OUSD's central staff and services to be scattered across 7 different school site locations in Oakland. Ultimately the District leased office space at 1000 Broadway. These leases expire in summer 2019.

BOE file 16-2625, Enactment #16-1979 December 4, 2016 adopted to move forward with rehabilitation of 1025 Second Avenue and the Ethel Moore Building as the Administrative Center of the District.

On February 13, 2017, General Counsel issued an opinion that Measure J funds can permissibly be used for the redevelopment of 1025 2nd Avenue and Ethel Moore.
