Action Requested and Recommendation

Approval by the Board of Education of a Memorandum of Understanding between the District and Oakland Youth Chorus, Oakland, CA, for the latter to provide access to high quality music and choral education and performance opportunities reflecting the cultural diversity of the area; engage children and youth in meaningful, yearlong music education programming resulting in increases in musical skills, knowledge, and performance confidence; strengthen community-based programming at our all-city and neighborhood based sites, fostering cross-cultural participation and community building; unique performance opportunities that engage students and families, acquaint them with different neighborhoods, and promote cross-cultural understanding through building friendships within the chorus, for Kindergarten through 8th grade students at Chabot, Piedmont, Hillcrest, Manzanita Community, Kaiser, Allendale, Redwood Heights, Greenleaf, RISE Community and Peralta Elementary Schools; and Bret Harte and Edna Brewer Middle Schools for the period of August 13, 2018 through August 1, 2021, at no

cost to the District.

Oakland Youth Chorus (OYC) provides joyful and affirming music education and performance programs that focus on musical excellence at all levels while nurturing the development of the whole child.  California laws.
 - 3. Conflict of Interest—CONTRACTOR shall abide by and be subject to all applicable OUSD policies, regulations, statutes or other laws regarding conflict of interest. CONTRACTOR shall not hire any OUSD employee to perform the services in this MOU, and affirms that to the best of its knowledge no such conflict presently exists. CONTRACTOR agrees to alert OUSD in writing if and when a potential conflict arises.
 - 4. Family Education Rights and Privacy Act—CONTRACTOR shall observe all District policies and regulations, and state and federal laws, including the Family Education Rights and Privacy Act of 1974, commonly known as FERPA, related to the confidentiality of pupil and personnel records. A separate Data Sharing Agreement is required if CONTRACTOR seeks identifiable student information.
- C. Tuberculosis Screening: CONTRACTOR is required to screen employees and agents who will be present at OUSD sites during the current school year. CONTRACTOR affirms that each person has current proof of negative TB testing on file and TB results are monitored. Please see Section IV for the relevant documentation that is required.
- D. Fingerprinting of Employees and Agents. The fingerprinting and criminal background investigation requirements of Education Code section 45125.1 apply to CONTRACTOR's services under this MOU. CONTRACTOR certifies its compliance with these provisions as follows:

CONTRACTOR certifies that CONTRACTOR has complied with the fingerprinting and criminal background investigation requirements of Education Code section 45125.1 with respect to all CONTRACTOR's employees, subcontractors, agents, and subcontractors' employees or agents ("Employees") regardless of whether those Employees are paid or unpaid, concurrently employed by OUSD, or acting as independent contractors of CONTRACTOR, who may have contact with

OUSD pupils in the course of providing services pursuant to the MOU, and the California Department of Justice has determined that none of those Employees has been convicted of a felony, as that term is defined in Education Code section 45122.1.

CONTRACTOR further certifies that it has received and reviewed fingerprint results for each of its Employees and CONTRACTOR has requested and reviews subsequent arrest records for all Employees who may come into contact with OUSD pupils in providing services to the District under this MOU. In the event that OUSD, in its sole discretion, at any time during the term of this MOU, desires the removal of any CONTRACTOR related person, employee, representative or agent from any OUSD school; site; and/or property, CONTRACTOR shall immediately, upon receiving notice from OUSD of such desire, cause the removal of such person or persons.

E. Insurance

- General Liability: EITHER (a) CONTRACTOR maintains general liability insurance that
 names OUSD as an additional insured, for operations, students, volunteers, and personnel at
 location where CONTRACTOR provides programs/services with at least \$1 Million in
 coverage, and furnish certificate of said insurance to OUSD OR (b) CONTRACTOR is not
 required to maintain general liability insurance under this MOU if the Risk Management
 Officer signs a waiver of insurance. Please see Section IV for the relevant documentation
 that is required.
- 2. Workers' Compensation: If CONTRACTOR employs any person to perform work in connection with this MOU, CONTRACTOR shall procure and maintain at all times during the performance of such work, Workers' Compensation Insurance in conformance with the laws of the State of California and federal laws, when applicable. The CONTRACTORS' Employers' Liability Insurance shall not be less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) per accident or disease. Please see Section IV for the relevant documentation that is required.

CONTRACTOR will comply with FERPA, and will be allowed to use the data received to solicit funding to continue to expand its services/program, so

long as there is no information from which the identity of any student in the CONTRACTOR's program as a participant could be made.

H. Register With/Update Provider Database—In order to maintain accurate up-to-date information on the services provided, Contractor shall register in OUSD's provider database, update schools of operation prior to commencing services during subsequent school years, and update during the current school year when Contractor's schools of operation change.

XVII. Counterparts

This MOU and all amendments and modifications to it may be executed in counterparts, and all counterparts together shall be construed as one document.

XVIII. Intellectual Property

During the term of this MOU, any works created by or inventions of Contractor, his agents or employees, within the scope of the work contracted herein shall belong to the District together with all associated copy rights and patents. Contractor shall not publish any aspect of the work performed hereunder without prior written consent of the District.

XIX. Relationship of Parties

This is not an employment contract. CONTRACTOR, in the performance of this Agreement, shall be and act as an independent contractor. CONTRACTOR understands and agrees that it and all of its employees shall not be considered officers, employees, agents, partner, or joint venture of OUSD, and are not entitled to benefits of any kind or nature normally provided employees of OUSD and/or to which OUSD's employees are normally entitled, including, but not limited to, State Unemployment Compensation or Worker's Compensation. CONTRACTOR shall assume full responsibility for payment of all Federal, State, and local taxes or contributions, including unemployment insurance, social security and income taxes with respect to CONTRACTOR's employees. In the performance of the work herein contemplated, CONTRACTOR is an independent contractor or business entity, with the sole authority for controlling and directing the performance of the details of the work, OUSD being interested only in the results obtained.

XX. Signature Authority

Each party has the full power and authority to enter into and perform this Agreement, and the person signing this Agreement on behalf of each Party has been given the proper authority and empowered to enter into this Agreement.

XXI. Incorporation of Recitals and Exhibits

The Recitals and each exhibit attached hereto are hereby incorporated herein by reference. CONTRACTOR agrees that to the extent any recital or document incorporated herein conflicts with any term or provision of this Agreement, the terms and provisions of this Agreement shall govern.

XXII. Public Document

EXHIBIT "A" SCOPE OF WORK

Description of Services to be Provided and Specific Expected Outcomes: Highlight each program that you provide to OUSD. Attach a separate document if more space is needed.

Middle School Chorus started in 2003 to bridge the gap between Miracle Chorus and our advanced ensembles. We believe in developing accessible pathways for success for at-risk students through the arts, helping them to find their voices and express themselves in healthy ways. In 2018-19, OYC serves 170 singers at four Oakland schools in this program.

Miracle Choruses started in 1998 to address the decreasing availability of music education in schools. 500 elementary school children participate in choral classes in Oakland, Richmond and Alameda.

Multicultural Music in our Schools TK-6 music programs started in 1998 to address the decreasing availability of music education in schools. In 2018-19, OYC works with seven elementary schools in Oakland and Richmond serving full grades and/or full schools with yearlong, sequential, comprehensive music education programs.

Sing Me A Story TK pilot project began in January 2018, serving 4 OUSD TK classes with music instruction that connected and used picture books to teach musical concepts while reinforcing and supporting early literacy development (oral language development, vocabulary, sight words, and comprehension). In 2018-19, we expect to add this to all TK classes in our full school programs and serve 6 additional schools with the TK 15 week program. When funding is available, students receive copies of the books used in the program to build their home libraries.

Program Goals and Objectives: OYC programs strive to reach children who would not otherwise have access to music education. Choruses at all levels provide school and community-based opportunities for youth. OYC's experience developing and sustaining both school and community based programming gives us flexibility in designing programs to reach underserved children and youth. Programs focus on the following outcomes:

- 1. OYC expects to continue to provide access to high quality music education and performance opportunities reflecting the cultural diversity of the area.
- 2. OYC programs engage children and youth in meaningful, yearlong music education programming resulting in increases in musical skills, knowledge, and performance confidence.
- 3. OYC strengthens community based programming at our all-city and neighborhood based sites, fostering cross-cultural participation and community building.
- 4. OYC will provide unique performance opportunities that engage students and families, acquaint them with different neighborhoods, and promote cross-cultural understanding through building friendships within the chorus.

Broad goals for this program are to:

- · reach children and youth who have little or no access to music education or other enrichment activities;
- · provide safe and positive out-of-school time activities;
- · improve participant self-confidence through performance;
- · increase student learning in the arts through building musical skills;
- · strengthen multi-cultural respect;
- support academic aspirations;
- · develop a positive support network of caring adults and peers; and
- · provide unique community-building opportunities.

Specific objectives for Miracle Chorus participants in grades K-5, measured by formal written and performance assessments and surveys, include the following:

• 80% will report enjoying music more than they used to because of their OYC class;

- · 90% will report learning to sing songs from different countries;
- · 90% will report being able to sing a song from their OYC class from memory;
- · 85% will report participating in at least one performance, which builds confidence, public presentation skills, and pride in accomplishment;
- · 80% will report being more confident performing music in front of people because of their OYC class;
- · 90% will demonstrate increased skill in matching pitches, rhythmic patterning, and 75% will be able to independently complete basic rhythmic and melodic sight reading.

OYC's advanced ensembles have performed with Linda Tillery, Jon Hendricks, Bobby McFerrin, SoVoSo and Nancy Wilson, and collaborated with the Oakland Symphony, Oakland Ballet, Marcus Shelby, Hector Armienta and Opera Cultura, and the Oakland East Bay Gay Men's Chorus.

They can be heard on social justice recordings from the Max Park Band and the Music of the Spheres project from the Andy S. Way Foundation. They can also be heard on Ripple Effects' Bouncy the People trainer I Pad app. Of the over 1000 singers who have stayed with OYC through their senior year, 90% have gone onto college.

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OYC advanced ensembles have performed at the White House, across seven states and in Canada, Jamaica and Japan.

OYC has been recognized by the California Arts Council as an "Exemplary Arts Program", for our multicultural arts education programs grounded in youth development.

The Oakland Youth Chorus unites diverse communities and transforms young people's lives through excellence in music education and community performance.

Oakland Youth Chorus provides K-12 choral and vocal based general music classes in collaboration and partnership with 20-24 school and community sites throughout the academic year. Our agency infrastructure is comprised of a 3 person administrative leadership team, contracted bookkeeper, part time and temporary administrative support staff, and program staff including a diverse and accomplished team of teaching artists. OYC has served as an after school lead agency in partnership with OUSD for the academic year and for summer programming in comprehensive academic and enrichment programming, preparing the organization for contracting, administrative and reporting requirements needed to effectively partner with the district to provide music program services.

We have a 44 year history of providing quality choral music education and performance programs, and have been working in after school and in school programs in East Bay schools since 1998. The OUSD Music Department has chosen us as their lead agency for the Oakland Summer Jazz camp for OUSD middle school band and orchestra students, and we have also provided the vocal component of that camp since its inception. OYC has served OUSD schools with in-school and after school music instruction and performance programs for 20 years, reaching thousands of students each academic year.
