(An electronic eComment - Register To Speak Card must have been received on line not later than 30 Minutes prior to meeting noticed time.) A Speaker may be allowed up to a maximum of 3 minutes or less to speak on designated Item(s), depending on the number of Registered Speakers, the number of Items and the time allocated for Item(s). Minutes, or lesser time, are not transferable from Speaker to Speaker.

Modification(s) to the Agenda, by the Board, allows for any change in the printed Order of Business including, but not limited to, an announcement that an Item or Legislative File will be considered out of Agenda printed order, that consideration of an Item has been withdrawn, postponed, rescheduled or "pulled" or taken off of the General Consent Report for separate discussion and/or possible action.

K. Adoption of the General Consent Report No. 1

"Adoption of the General Consent Report" means that all

items appearing on the Agenda under this topic are approved in one motion unless a Board Member requests that an item be removed and voted on separately or otherwise acted upon. Generally, these items are routine in nature, and are acted upon in one motion to conserve time and permit focus on other-than-routine items on the Agenda. An item on the General Consent Report which a Member has requested be removed, shall be removed, without debate for separate consideration and vote or other disposition. All items remaining on the General Consent Report, thereafter, shall be adopted in a single motion.
