OVERVIEW & OBJECTIVE

Seventeen OUSD district schools, nine charter schools and the District Administrative 10% have unspent Measure N funds from the 2020-2021 fiscal year. For the December 7, 2021 Measure N Commission meeting, 15 sites have submitted their 2020-2021 Measure N Carryover Justification Form that articulates the context that contributed to the carryover, the amount of carryover, the percentage of Measure N funds that are being carried over, and a clear budget for the carryover funds. The Measure N Commission approved the Measure N Carryover Justification Forms of eight sites at their November 16, 2021 meeting, and the remaining schools will submit their 2020-2021 Measure N Carryover Justification Forms to the January 2022 Measure N Commission meeting.

Per Measure N Commission policy, Measure N commission approval is required for all carryover justification forms. Measure N staff have reviewed the submitted 2020-2021 Measure N Carryover Justification Forms and provided feedback to school sites that were addressed before submission to the Measure N Commission.

Clerical Salaries: Hire 1 Case Manager for Media Arts Academy, at 1.0 FTE to navigate academic and wellness support systems during the pandemic. The Case Manager will focus on 9th and 10th graders to strengthen their connection to school, to see school as a resource for themselves and to provide support to navigate the demands of work, school and the challenges of being newcomers. The Case Manager will support students' access to pathway electives in 10th grade and participation in work-based learning and internships in the 11th and 12th grades. Up to 200 students will be served by the Case Manager, who will be coordinating services and interventions among school staff and partner organizations such as after school programs, KDOL, YouthBeats, Art Together, and Refugee and Immigrant Transitions. During the continued pandemic, the needs of our newcomer students have increased tremendously. This additional case manager will be dedicated to the 9th and 10th grade students, while our existing case manager will be assigned to the 11th and 12th grades. The event helps promote our pathway, supports 9th grade students' understanding of what it means to be in a Media Arts pathway, and creates a connection between the Media Arts Academy and families. Newcomer Assistants will plan the event with Media Academy teachers, which includes calendaring, logistics, agenda, program and invitations. They will also attend and monitor the event and make sure students and families participate fully. The exhibition of learning will create a connection between the Media Arts Academy and families, to showcase student learning in Media Arts wherein students in pathway classes will interactively present their learning to a large audience comprised of peers, families, staff, partners and industry professionals either in person or remotely, thus supporting a high quality pathway experience for all students. The Media Arts Pathway Exhibition of Learning will help promote our pathway and will support 9th grade students' understanding of what it means to be in a Media Arts pathway. All students (up to 400+ as we enroll students all year long) will be served by this exhibition of learning. Teacher Salaries Stipends: Extended Contracts for 1 Teacher to teach in the 2022 Summer Bridge Program, which focuses on supporting student transitions into Oakland International High School. The Summer Bridge Program was developed out of the need to support students in the adjustment from middle to high school, and specifically for Newcomer students who are new to the country. The program includes social-emotional opportunities to connect with peers and to get used to campus. Additionally, students can jump-start their academics to be ready for a successful start to high school and positive movement towards graduation, all of which prepares students to engage in our Media Arts pathway. By focusing intentionally on building students' connection to school and one another, we are able to increase student engagement in our school and all that their pathways have to offer. Teacher Salaries Stipends: Extended Contracts for the Counselor and Newcomer Specialist (2 certificated staff) to do summer "melt" work in support of post high school graduation transitions for students enrolling in Peralta Colleges from June 6th through June 30th, including Saturdays for a total of 80 hours each. Summer melt is "the phenomenon of college-intending students who have applied to, been accepted by, and made a deposit to a college or university, but fail to matriculate to that college (or any other) in the fall following their high school graduation." A majority of Oakland International graduating seniors choose to enroll in one of the Peralta Colleges. Navigating the enrollment system and financial aid is a challenge, and for our students to be able to successfully start, they need the support of a counselor. Our counselors will support students with online registration, completing financial aid applications, clearing any "holds" on students peralta accounts, and generally orienting students to the start of classes. This support can impact up to 50+ graduating seniors, some additional students in 9,10 & 11th grades who want to take college classes in the summer, and a number of alumnae who need support to enroll or re-enroll.
