OAKLAND UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT GOVERNING BOARD NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

DISTRICT'S SUFFICIENCY OF TEXTBOOKS AND INSTRUCTIONAL MATERIALS SCHOOL YEAR 2021-2022

TO ALL INTERESTED PARTIES, IN PARTICULAR, BUT NOT EXCLUSIVELY, PARENTS, TEACHERS, BARGAINING UNIT LEADERS, AND MEMBERS OF THE COMMUNITY INTERESTED IN THE AFFAIRS OF THE OAKLAND UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE THAT ON, SEPTEMBER 22, 2021, at a Regular Meeting of the Governing Board ("Board") of the Oakland Unified School District, the Board, at 7:00 P.M., or as soon thereafter as the matter may be heard, will hold a Public Hearing on the District's Sufficiency of Textbooks and Instructional Materials—School Year 2021-2022 via internet streaming (via Zoom and Granicus Live Manager, simultaneously). Following the conclusion of the hearing the Board shall make a determination, by Resolution, as delineated in (a), (b) and (c) below.

California Education Code Section 60119 requires that the Board hold a public hearing, within the first eight weeks of school, to determine:

(a) whether each pupil in each school of the district has sufficient textbooks or instructional materials or both, that are aligned to the content standards adopted by the state board [of education] in each of the following subjects, as appropriate, that are consistent with the content and cycles of curriculum framework adopted by the California Board of Education:

- Mathematics,
- Science,
- History-social science,
- English language arts, including the English language development component of an adopted program; and

(b) whether each pupil enrolled in a world language or health course has sufficient textbooks or instructional materials that are consistent with the content and cycles of the curriculum frameworks adopted by the state board for those subjects; and

(c) the availability of laboratory science equipment as applicable to science laboratory courses offered in grades 9 to 12 inclusive.
