What are you most proud of in terms of Pathway development?

- **Expanded Work Based Learning through our Community** Based Learning programs including increased internship opportunities, industry certifications, career and college exploration and awareness lessons and programming

Career Panels

ACADEMIC MENTORS



We hired over 20 ARISE Alumni who come back to work at the school as Academic Mentors

They provide targeted supports for students throughout different courses.

Real professional development and training for ARISE alumni, which supports college perseverance and job training.

Differentiation support for students.

Teacher sustainability support, as Ac Mentors ensure teachers are able to focus on their craft.

Academic Mentor Support

- Assist faculty and SPED staff in academic support spaces including pathway classrooms and advisories
- Chaperone groups offsite
 - Dual Enrollment (Genomics Lab, College Success)
 - Internship and certification liaisons and support
 - Enrichment (Coding, Boxing, Rock Climbing, Strength Training)
- Co-lead advisories and their own electives
 - Photography, music, community farming, service learning
- Participate in ARISE Professional Learning, including attending and presenting at conferences











Reflections on Past 3 Years

What have been some of the challenges?

- Global Pandemic and Virtual Learning
- Coherence and understanding related to graduation requirements (ie internships, dual enrollment, a-g, etc)
- Decreased graduation rate and increased dropout rate
- Meeting the needs of our English Language Learners and Newcomers









Reflections on Past 3 Years

What have been your biggest learnings?

- Math, literacy and attendance priorities to reduce learning loss
- Additional supports needed for our growing English Language Learner **Population**
- Need for enhanced individualized support Academic Mentors, College and Career Counselors, Social Emotional Support, Mental Health services
- Community Based Learning is critical for the social and emotional development of students and provides space for WBL experiences









Looking Ahead

What have you learned through creating this new plan for the next 3-year cycle?

- The need and demand to provide more college and career pathways for our students and close equity gaps in education (Education Pathway)
- Coherence and strategic thinking as we strengthen our current pathway, while expanding to a new pathway (sustainability model)
- Mutually beneficial community and industry partnerships built on reciprocity (community based learning)
- Increase student and family engagement around A-G and graduation requirements (college and career readiness)









Looking Ahead

What are you most excited about?

- Establish our new Education for the People Pathway through a coherent scope and sequence, industry partner integration, and WBL continuum
- Continue to strengthen and develop our Academic Mentor Program to provide individualized support for all students while creating a pipeline for future educators
- Expand dual enrollment, internship and industry certifications to prepare all students to be college and career ready!









Looking Ahead

What are your biggest challenges moving forward?

- Increasing engagement with diverse family populations and language barriers which creates challenges of awareness/understanding related to graduation requirements for both our students and their families.
- Ensure we establish clear expectations and goals as we introduce our new education pathway, while continuing to strengthen our Public Health **Pathway**
- Hiring and maintaining experienced teachers especially in math, science, CTE.









How are your Pathway(s) helping to close equity gaps in your school? (through the lens of your LCAP focal groups)

- ARISE students will be immersed in common-core, NGSS, and CTE aligned curriculum and instruction which prepares students for college and career while emphasizing knowledge of self, humanizing love, and performance assessment.
- The ARISE community will nurture, train, and discipline our entire school on the importance of college and career readiness, through individualized supports, restorative practices, and expanded learning opportunities
- Continue to prioritize literacy, math & attendance; these connect directly to our CTE & Pathway goals and support college & career readiness, postsecondary matriculation & completion, and a focus on quality teaching & learning.
