Ninyo & Moore is pleased to submit this proposal for additional soil gas mitigation system (SGMS) monitoring events based on DTSC's May 20, 2022, Five-Year Review Report approval letter and April 28, 2023, 1st 2020, 2nd 2020, 1st 2021, and 2nd 2021 Semi-annual Monitoring Report approval letter to Oakland Unified School District (OUSD) for the above-referenced school site. In DTSC's letters, SGMS vent riser monitoring was reduced from semi-annual to annual monitoring and soil gas monitoring will continue semi-annually. The annual and semi-annual monitoring events were also reduced from one report per monitoring event to one report per year. This proposal includes coordinating and implementing Operation and Maintenance (O&M) of the SGMS from the beginning of 2024 through the end of 2025. Note that two monitoring events will occur each year and be conducted during the first and third quarters. Additionally, the second 5-Year Review Inspection and Report is scheduled to be completed in 2024 stated in DTSC's May 20, 2022 letter. Activities associated with O&M include coordination with OUSD and DTSC, collecting semi-annual soil gas monitoring reports, routine SGMS inspection and repairs, conducting a 5-Year Review Inspections, and preparing a 5-Year Review Report for 2020 through 2024.

SCOPE OF SERVICES

Task 1 – Project Coordination and Management from 2024 through 2025

Ninyo & Moore will correspond and coordinate with OUSD and DTSC as necessary to schedule routine monitoring events, discuss the SGMS monitoring results, scope, and frequency of future O&M monitoring at the site, and coordinate with the analytical laboratory to complete the SGMS monitoring events.

Task 2 Estimated Fee - \$9,500

Task 2 – Semi-Annual and Annual SGMS Monitoring Event from 2024 through 2025 (4 Events)

Ninyo & Moore will continue to perform SGMS monitoring and sampling at the site at the revised monitoring schedule. Soil gas monitoring wells will be monitored and sampled semi-annually, during the first and third quarter of each year, and SGMS vent risers will be monitored and sampled annually, during the third quarter of each year. Field activities from 2024 through 2025 will consist of visual inspection of the accessible components of the sub-slab ventilation systems, visual inspection of vent riser caps, visual inspection of the soil gas wells, and collection of soil gas samples from all ventilation risers and soil gas wells; with the exception of vent riser D-SSV-3 and soil gas wells SGMW-1-5 and SGMW-1-10. The sampling of these locations has been suspended, with concurrence from DTSC, due to sampling results consistently below laboratory screening level. Soil gas and vent riser monitoring samples will be analyzed for volatile organic compounds (VOCs) by EPA Method TO-15 and air-phase hydrocarbons (APHs) by the Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection (MA DEP) Method using a standard 10-day turnaround time (TAT). Each soil gas monitoring event will include collection of duplicate samples and a trip blank sample for analysis of VOCs by EPA Method TO-15 and APHs by the (MA DEP) Method.

Task 2 Estimated Fee - \$46,260

Task 3 – 2024 5-Year Review Inspection

In accordance with the O&M Plan and DTSC requirement, a 5-year review will be performed. The purpose of the 5-year review is to ensure that the soil gas mitigation system remains protective of human health and the environment, is functioning as designed, and is maintained properly. The 5-year review will consist of reviewing historical site documents from the last five years and an inspection of all accessible SGMS components.

Task 3 Estimated Fee - \$3,380

Task 4 – O&M Repairs from 2024 through 2025

Ninyo & Moore will provide oversight of repairs to vent riser sample ports and soil gas wells as needed. Two repair oversight events are included in anticipation that additional repairs may be needed.

Task 4 Estimated Fee - \$10,120

Task 5 – SGMS Monitoring Report Preparation from 2024 through 2025 (2 Reports)

Ninyo & Moore will prepare two annual SGMS monitoring reports for semi-annual soil gas monitoring events and annual SGMS monitoring events conducted during 2024 through the end of 2025. As directed in DTSC's April 28, 2023 letter, the results of semi-annual and annual monitoring events will be combined and submitted in an annual monitoring report for the respective year. The reports will discuss the field activities performed including inspection of the accessible components of the subslab ventilation systems, collection of soil gas and vent riser samples, and an evaluation of the analytical results from the monitoring events. The reports will include a health risk assessment of both soil gas probe samples and vent riser vapor samples. The reports will present conclusions and recommendations and will be submitted to DTSC for review.

Task 5 Estimated Fee - \$28,200

Task 6 – 5-Year Review Report Preparation – 2020 through 2024

Ninyo & Moore will prepare a 5-Year Review Report that will include a summary of the 5-Year Review Inspection, a summary of any O&M repairs or modification made to the SGMS within the previous five years, and a technical assessment and evaluation of the SGMS effectiveness/protectiveness based on analytical data collected since the previous 5-Year Review.

Task 6 Estimated Fees - \$17,430

UNDERSTANDINGS

The conditions listed below will apply to the performance of the scope of services described herein.

 The scope of services outlined above is based upon the DTSC's May 20, 2022 and April 28, 2023 approval letters and our experience on numerous proposed school sites similar to the subject site. The scope of services may change based on requirements from DTSC, requests to analyze samples on a faster TAT, and unforeseen conditions, which may be encountered in the field such as subsurface features or unexpected areas of impacts.

- Laboratory analytical TATs begin from the time that the laboratory receives the samples. Vapor monitoring samples will be shipped via a package transportation company to Eurofins Air Toxic, located in Folsom, California.
- If additional time is required to complete any of these tasks due to inclement weather or unforeseen conditions which may be encountered in the field and beyond the control of Ninyo & Moore or its subcontractors, Ninyo & Moore may request the authorization of additional budget to cover the additional field time required for Ninyo & Moore personnel.

COMPENSATION

The estimated time-and-materials fee for the scope of services outlined above is \$126,379 (One Hundred Twenty-Six Thousand Three Hundred Seventy-Nine Dollars). The total estimate includes a 10% contingency of \$11,489 (Eleven Thousand Four Hundred Eighty-Nine Dollars). A detailed description of the costs associated with the proposed scope of services is presented in the attached Breakdown of Estimated Fees. Work beyond the scope of services will be provided in accordance with the fees provided in the breakdown of estimate fee table.



Ninyo & Moore is pleased to submit this change order for additional soil gas mitigation system monitoring events based on DTSC's May 20, 2022 Five-Year Review Report approval letter to Oakland Unified School District (OUSD) for the above-referenced school site. In DTSC's letter, soil gas monitoring was reduced from semiannual to annual monitoring and vent riser monitoring will continue semiannually. Note that two monitoring events will occur each year, first and third quarter. The May 20, 2020 approval letter was issued after the first quarter of 2022, therefore only the third quarter monitoring event will be included in 2022. This change order includes updates to the Operations and Maintenance Plan (O&M plan), coordinating and implementing field activities associated with the third quarter 2022 and the first and third quarter 2023 semi-annual soil gas mitigation system monitoring events and preparing vapor monitoring reports. This proposal also addresses additional funds needed for work already completed for the Five-Year Review Report and the 2020 through 2021 vapor monitoring report.

Our proposed scope of services for this proposal includes the following:

- Performing three semi-annual soil gas mitigation system monitoring events, one during the second half-2022 and two monitoring events during 2023. All three events will include. sampling and analysis of soil gas monitoring wells SGMW-2 and SGMW-3 at 5 and 10 feet below ground surface (bgs). The third quarter 2022 and 2023 monitoring events will also include all ventilation risers with the exception of D-SSV-3.
- Preparing two annual soil gas mitigation system monitoring reports, one for the third quarter 2022 monitoring event and one for the first and third quarter 2023 monitoring events.

Work already completed includes:

Completion of the Five-Year Review Report and the 2020-2021 Soil Vapor Monitoring report.

SCOPE OF SERVICES

Task i - Five-Year Review Report Revisions and 2020-2021 Soil Vapor Monitoring Report.

Additional funds were needed to complete revisions to the Five-Year Review Report based on DTSC comments and completion of the 2020-2021 vapor monitoring report.

Task 1 Estimated Fee - \$11,350

Task 2 - Revisions to the O&M Plan.

As requested by DTSC in the May 20, 2022 approval letter, the O&M plan will be revised to update changes to the sample frequency and schedule, changes to sampling points, personnel and contact information and revised risk assessment methods.

Task 2 Estimated Fee - \$5,500

Task 3 - Preparing Two Annual Soil Gas Mitigation System Monitoring Reports for the 2022 and 2023.

Ninyo & Moore will prepare two annual soil gas mitigation system monitoring reports for the semiannual soil gas mitigation system monitoring events conducted during 2022 and 2023. The reports will discuss the field activities performed including inspection of the accessible components of the sub-slab ventilation systems, collection of soil gas samples, and an evaluation of the analytical results from the soil gas samples. The report will include a health risk assessment of both soil gas probe samples and vent riser vapor samples. The report will present conclusions and recommendations and will be submitted to DTSC for review.

Task 3 Estimated Fee - \$20,050

Task 4 - Three Soll Gas Mitigation System Monitoring Events Including the First Quarter 2022 and First and Third Quarter 2023

Ninyo & Moore will continue to perform soil gas mitigation system monitoring at the site. Field activities will be performed in general accordance with the proposed revised 2022 O&M plan that will be revised based on the modified sampling schedule agreed to by the DTSC. Field activities during 2022 and 2023 will consist of visual inspection of the accessible components of the sub-slab

ventilation systems, vent riser caps and collection of soil gas samples from all ventilation risers, with the exception of D-SSV-3, and soil gas probes SGMW-2-5, and 2-10, and SGMW-3-5 and 3-10. Soil gas mitigation system monitoring samples will be analyzed for volatile organic compounds (VOCs) by EPA Method TO-15 and air-phase hydrocarbons (APHs) by the Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection (MA DEP) Method using a 5-day turn-around-time (TAT). Each soil gas mitigation system monitoring event will include collection of duplicate samples and a trip blank sample for analysis of VOCs by EPA Method TO-15 and APHs by the (MA DEP) Method, as described in the O&M Plan.

Task 4 Estimated Fee - \$35,270

UNDERSTANDINGS

The conditions listed below will apply to the performance of the scope of services described herein.

- The scope of services outlined above is based upon the DTSC's May 20, 2022 approval letter of the Five-year Review Report and a video conference with DTSC and OUSD on May 4, 2022, the scope of work will be outlined in the updated O&M Plan, assumptions, and our experience on numerous proposed school sites similar to the subject site. The scope of services may change based on requirements from DTSC, requests to analyze samples on a faster TAT, and unforeseen conditions, which may be encountered in the field such as subsurface features or unexpected areas of impacts.
- Laboratory analytical TATs begin from the time that the laboratory receives the samples. Vapor monitoring samples will be transported via courier to McCampbell Analytical, located in Pittsburg, California.
- If additional time is required to complete any of these tasks due to inclement weather or unforeseen conditions which may be encountered in the field and beyond the control of Ninyo & Moore or its subcontractors, Ninyo & Moore may request the authorization of additional budget to cover the additional field time required for Ninyo & Moore personnel.

COMPENSATION

The estimated time-and-materials fee for the scope of services outlined above is **\$79,370** (Seventy-Nine Thousand Three Hundred Seventy Dollars). The total estimate includes a 10% contingency of **\$7,200** (Seven Thousand Two Hundred Dollars). A detailed description of the costs associated with the proposed scope of services is presented in the attached Breakdown of Estimated Fees.

 - (ii) Neither you nor any other involved "insured" will make any settlement without our consent.
 - (iii) We may, at our discretion, participate in defending the "insured" against, or in the settlement of, any claim or "suit".
 - (iv) We will reimburse the "insured" for sums that the "insured" legally must pay as damages because of "bodily injury" or "property damage" to which this insurance applies, that the "insured" pays with our consent, but only up to the limit described in Paragraph C., Limits Of Insurance, of SECTION II – COVERED AUTOS LIABILITY COVERAGE.
 - (v) We will reimburse the "insured" for the reasonable expenses incurred with our consent for your investigation of such claims and your defense of the "insured" against any such "suit", but only up to and included within the limit described in Paragraph C., Limits Of Insurance, of SECTION II – COVERED AUTOS LIABILITY COVERAGE, and not in addition to such limit. Our duty to make such payments ends when we have used up the applicable limit of insurance in payments for damages, settlements or defense expenses.
- (b) This insurance is excess over any valid and collectible other insurance available to the "insured" whether primary, excess, contingent or on any other basis.
- (c) This insurance is not a substitute for required or compulsory insurance in any country outside the United States, its territories and possessions, Puerto Rico and Canada.

You agree to maintain all required or compulsory insurance in any such country up to the minimum limits required by local law. Your failure to comply with compulsory insurance requirements will not invalidate the coverage afforded by this policy, but we will only be liable to the same extent we would have been liable had you complied with the compulsory insurance requirements.



OAKLAND UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT GENERAL SERVICES AGREEMENT

This GENERAL SERVICES AGREEMENT ("Agreement") is made and entered into effective September 9, 2021 (the "Effective Date"), by and between the Oakland Unified School District ("District") and Ninyo & Moore ("Contractor").

1. **Contractor Services.** Contractor agrees to provide the following services to District (collectively, the "Basic Services"): Ninyo & Moore to provide environmental services to include field activities associated with the second-half of 2021 and first-half of 2022 semi-annual soil gas mitigation system monitoring events, and reporting associated with the first and second-half of 2020 and first-half of 2021 semi-annual soil gas mitigation system monitoring events to Oakland Unified School District (OUSD), also addresses responding to Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) 2020 Five Year Review Report, Soil Gas Mitigation for the La Escuelita Education Center Project. The Basic Services include all work described in the July 1, 2021, proposal, which are attached to this Agreement as *Exhibit A*. Contractor may only provide other services ("Additional Services") after authorized in writing by District. "Services" shall mean Basic and Additional Services.

2. **Contractor Qualifications.** Contractor represents and warrants to District that Contractor, and all of Contractor's employees, agents or volunteers (the "Contractor Parties"), have in effect and shall maintain in full force throughout the Term of this Agreement all licenses, credentials, permits and any other qualifications required by law to perform the Services and to fully and faithfully satisfy all of the terms set forth in this Agreement. Contractor and any Contractor Parties performing services shall be competent to perform those services.

3. **Term.** This Agreement shall begin on **September 9, 2021**, and shall terminate upon completion of the Services, but no later than **June 30, 2022** ("Term"), except as otherwise stated in **Paragraph 4** below. There shall be no extension of the Term of this Agreement without the express written consent of all parties. Written notice by the District Superintendent or designee shall be sufficient to stop further performance of the Services by Contractor or the Contractor Parties. In the event of early termination, Contractor shall be paid for satisfactory Services performed to the date of termination. Upon payment by District, District shall be under no further obligation to Contractor, monetarily or otherwise, and District may proceed with the work in any manner District deems proper.

4. **Termination.** Either party may terminate this Agreement at any time by giving thirty (30) days advance written notice to the other party, however the parties may agree in writing to a shorter notice period. Notwithstanding the foregoing, District may terminate this Agreement at any time by giving written notice to Contractor if Contractor materially breaches any of the terms of this Agreement, any act or omission of Contractor or the Contractor Parties exposes District to potential liability or may cause an increase in District's insurance premiums, Contractor is adjudged a bankrupt, Contractor makes a general assignment for the benefit of creditors or a receiver is appointed because of Contractor's insolvency. Such termination shall be effective immediately upon Contractor's receipt of the notice.

5. **Payment of Fees for Services.** District agrees to pay Contractor based on the hourly rates listed in *Exhibit B* for Services satisfactorily performed. Contractor shall not increase these hourly rates over the course of this Agreement. Total fees paid by District to Contractor for Services under the

Agreement shall not exceed **Fifty-Eight Thousand Three Hundred Dollars (\$58,300.00**), which consists of a not-to-exceed amount of Fifty-Three Thousand Dollars (\$53,000.00) for performance of the Basic Services, and a not-to-exceed amount of Fifty-Eight Thousand Three Dollars (\$5,300.00) for performance of any Additional Services. Contractor shall perform all Services required by the Agreement even if the applicable not-to-exceed amount has already been paid and no more payments will be forthcoming. District agrees to make payment within sixty (60) days of receipt of a detailed invoice from Contractor based on hours worked and hourly rates, including any additional supporting documentation that District reasonably requests. Contractor shall not submit its invoices to District more frequently than monthly. Contractor shall not be reimbursed directly for any of its expenses, as the fees to be paid under this Agreement include compensation for any and all of Contractor's expenses.

6. **Indemnity.** Contractor shall defend, indemnify, and hold harmless District and its agents, representatives, officers, consultants, employees, Board of Trustees, members of the Board of Trustees (collectively, the "District Parties"), from and against any and all claims, demands, liabilities, damages, losses, suits and actions, and expenses (including, but not limited to attorney fees and costs including fees of consultants) of any kind, nature and description (collectively, the "Claims") directly or indirectly arising out of, connected with, or resulting from any act, error, omission, negligence, or willful misconduct of Contractor, the Contractor Parties or their respective agents, subcontractors, employees, material or equipment suppliers, invitees, or licensees in the performance of or failure to perform Contractor's obligations under this Agreement, including, but not limited to Contractor's or the Contractor Parties' use of the site, Contractor's or the Contractor Parties' performance of the Services, Contractor's or the Contractor Parties' breach of any of the representations or warranties contained in this Agreement, or for injury to or death of persons or damage to property or delay or damage to the District or the District Parties. Such obligation shall not be construed to negate, abridge, or reduce other rights or obligations of indemnity, which would otherwise exist as to a party, person, or entity described in this paragraph.

7. **Equipment and Materials**. Contractor at its sole cost and expense shall provide and furnish all tools, labor, materials, equipment, transportation services and any other items (collectively, "Equipment") which are required or necessary to perform the Services in a manner which is consistent with generally accepted standards of the profession for similar services. Notwithstanding the foregoing, District shall not be responsible for any damages to persons or property as a result of the use, misuse or failure of any Equipment used by Contractor or the Contractor Parties, even if such Equipment is furnished, rented or loaned to Contractor or the Contractor Parties by District. Furthermore, District may reject any Equipment or workmanship that does not conform to the requirements of this Agreement and Contractor must then promptly remedy or replace it at no additional cost to District and subject to District's reasonable satisfaction.

8. **Insurance.** Without in any way limiting Contractor's liability, or indemnification obligations set forth in Paragraph 6 above, Contractor shall secure and maintain throughout the Term of this Agreement the following insurance: (i) comprehensive general liability insurance with limits of not less than **\$1,000,000** each occurrence and **\$2,000,000** in the aggregate; (ii) commercial automobile liability insurance with limits not less than **\$1,000,000** each occurrence and **\$2,000,000** each occurrence and **\$2,000,000** in the aggregate; (if applicable; and (iii) worker's compensation insurance as required by Labor Code section 3200, *et seq.*, if applicable. Neither Contractor nor any of the Contractor Parties shall commence performing any portion of the Services until all required insurance has been obtained and certificates indicating the required coverages have been delivered to and approved by District. All insurance policies shall include an endorsement stating that District and District Parties are named additional insureds. All of the policies

shall be amended to provide that the insurance shall not be suspended, voided, canceled, reduced in coverage or in limits except after thirty (30) days' prior written notice has been given to District. If such a notice is not given or even if District receives a notice, District may, at its sole option, terminate this Agreement. All insurance policies shall include an endorsement stating that it is primary to any insurance or self-insurance maintained by District and shall waive all rights of subrogation against District and/or the District Parties. A copy of the declarations page of Contractor's insurance policies shall be attached to this Agreement as proof of insurance.

9. **Independent Contractor Status.** Contractor is engaged in an independently established trade, occupation, or business to provide the Services required by this Agreement and is hereby retained to provide specialized services for District that are outside the usual course of District's business. Contractor is free from the control and direction of District in connection with the manner in which it provides the Services to District. Contractor understands and agrees that Contractor and the Contractor Parties shall not be considered officers, employees, agents, partners, or joint venturers of District, and are not entitled to benefits of any kind or nature normally provided to employees of District and/or to which District's employees are normally entitled.

10. **Taxes.** All payments made by District to Contractor pursuant to this Agreement shall be reported to the applicable federal and state taxing authorities as required. District will not withhold any money from fees payable to Contractor, including FICA (social security), state or federal unemployment insurance contributions, or state or federal income tax or disability insurance. Contractor shall assume full responsibility for payment of all federal, state and local taxes or contributions, including unemployment insurance, social security and income taxes with respect to Contractor and the Contractor Parties and otherwise in connection with this Agreement.

11. **Fingerprinting/Criminal Background Investigation Certification.** Contractor and the Contractor Parties shall at all times comply with the fingerprinting and criminal background investigation requirements of the California Education Code ("Education Code") section 45125.1, and shall complete the Fingerprinting Notice and Acknowledgement Form and Student Contract Form.

12. **Tuberculosis Certification.** Contractor and the Contractor Parties shall at all times comply with the tuberculosis ("TB") certification requirements of Education Code section 49406. Accordingly, by checking the applicable boxes below, Contractor hereby represents and warrants to District the following:

A. X Contractor and Contractor Parties shall **only have limited or no contact** (as determined by District) with District students at all times during the Term of this Agreement.

B. \equiv The following Contractor and Contractor Parties shall have **more than limited contact** (as determined by District) with District students during the Term of this Agreement and, at no cost to District, have received a TB test in full compliance with the requirements of Education Code section 49406:

Contractor shall maintain on file the certificates showing that the Contractor and Contractor Parties

were examined and found free from active TB. These forms shall be regularly maintained and updated by Contractor and shall be available to District upon request or audit.

Contractor further agrees and acknowledges that all new personnel hired after the Effective Date of this Agreement by Contractor and Contractor Parties are subject to the TB certification requirements and shall be prohibited from having any contact with District students until the TB certification requirements have been satisfied and District determines whether any contact is permissible.

13. **Confidential Information.** Contractor shall maintain the confidentiality of, and protect from unauthorized disclosure, any and all individual student information received from the District, including but not limited to student names and other identifying information. Contractor shall not use such student information for any purpose other than carrying out the obligations under this Agreement. Upon termination of this Agreement, Contractor shall turn over to District all educational records related to the services provided to any District student pursuant to this Agreement.

14. **Assignment/Successors and Assigns.** Contractor shall not assign or transfer by operation of law or otherwise any or all of its rights, burdens, duties or obligations under this Agreement without the prior written consent of District. Subject to the foregoing, this Agreement shall be binding on the heirs, executors, administrators, successors, and assigns of the respective parties.

15. **Severability.** If any provision of this Agreement shall be held invalid or unenforceable by a court of competent jurisdiction, such holding shall not invalidate or render unenforceable any other provision of this Agreement.

16. **Amendments.** The terms of this Agreement shall not be waived, altered, modified, supplemented or amended in any manner whatsoever except by written agreement signed by both parties and approved by the governing board.

17. **Governing Law.** This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of California, excluding its choice of law rules. Any action or proceeding seeking any relief under or with respect to this Agreement shall be brought solely in the Superior Court of the State of California for the County of Alameda, subject to transfer of venue under applicable State law, provided that nothing in this Agreement shall constitute a waiver of immunity to suit by the District.

18. Written Notice. Written notice shall be deemed to have been duly served if delivered in person to Contractor at the address located next to the party signatures below, or if delivered at or sent by registered or certified or overnight mail to the last business address known to the person who sends the notice.

19. **Compliance with Law.** Each and every provision of law and clause required by law to be inserted into this Agreement shall be deemed to be inserted herein and this Agreement shall be read and enforced as though it were included therein. Contractor shall comply with all applicable federal, state, and local laws, rules, regulations and ordinances, including but not limited to fingerprinting under Education Code section 45125.1, confidentiality of records, Education Code section 49406 and others. Contractor agrees that it shall comply with all legal requirements for the performance of duties under this Agreement and that failure to do so shall constitute material breach.

20. **Non-Discrimination.** There shall be no unlawful discrimination in the contracting of persons under this Agreement because of race, color, national origin, age, ancestry, religion, sex, or sexual orientation of such persons.

21. Attorneys' Fees. If any legal action is taken to interpret or enforce the terms of this Agreement, the prevailing party shall be entitled to recover reasonable attorneys' fees and other reasonable costs and expenses incurred in connection with that legal action.

22. Liability of District. Notwithstanding anything stated herein to the contrary, District shall not be liable for any special, consequential, indirect or incidental damages, including but not limited to lost profits in connection with this Agreement.

23. Time. Time is of the essence to this Agreement.

24. **Waiver.** No delay or omission by District in exercising any right under this Agreement shall operate as a waiver of that or any other right and no single or partial exercise of any right shall preclude the District from any or further exercise of any right or remedy.

25. Entire Agreement. This Agreement is intended by the parties as the final expression of their agreement with respect to such terms as are included herein and as the complete and exclusive statement of its terms and may not be contradicted by evidence of any prior agreement or of a contemporaneous oral agreement, nor explained or supplemented by evidence of consistent additional terms.

26. **Ambiguity.** The parties to this Agreement, and each of them, hereby represent that the language contained herein is to be construed as jointly proposed and jointly accepted, and in the event of any subsequent determination of ambiguity, all parties shall be treated as equally responsible for such ambiguity.

27. **Execution of Other Documents.** The parties to this Agreement shall cooperate fully in the execution of any and all other documents and in the completion of any additional actions that may be necessary or appropriate to give full force and effect to the terms and intent of this Agreement.

28. Execution in Counterparts. This Agreement may be executed in counterparts such that the signatures may appear on separate signature pages. A copy, facsimile, or an original, with all signatures appended together, shall be deemed a fully executed agreement.

29. **Warranty of Authority**. The persons who have signed this Agreement warrant that they are legally authorized to do so on behalf of the respective parties, and by their signatures to bind the respective parties to this Agreement.

30. **Local Business.** Contractor shall comply with the requirements of the District's Local, Small Local, and Small Local Resident Business Enterprise Program, which may require a 50% minimum local participation requirement in the performance of this Agreement. A copy of this program may be obtained at www.ousd.k12.ca.us, under the Facilities Planning & Management Department drop down menu, at "Bids and Requests for Proposals."

31. Forms. The following forms, attached to the proposal, are incorporated into the contract:

Ninyo & Moore is pleased to submit this new contract proposal for filed activities associated with the second-half of 2021 and first-half of 2022 semi-annual soil gas mitigation system monitoring events, and reporting associated with the first and second-half of 2020 and first-half of 2021 semi-annual soil gas mitigation system monitoring events to Oakland Unified School District (OUSD) for the above-referenced school site. This proposal also addresses responding to comments discussed in the Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) 2020 *Five Year Review Report, Soil Gas Mitigation System - Comment Letter, La Escuelita Education Center and Metwest High School, AKA Downtown Education Complex, 314 East 10th Street, Oakland, Alameda County, California, dated October 14. Our proposed scope of services for this proposal includes the following:*

- Preparing one semi-annual soil gas mitigation system monitoring report for the semi-annual soil gas mitigation system monitoring events conducted during first and second-half of 2020 and the first half of 2021.
- Performing two semi-annual soil gas mitigation system monitoring events, one during the second half-2021 and the other during the first half-2022, which will include sampling and analysis of soil gas monitoring wells SGMW-2 and SGMW-3 at 5 and 10 feet below ground surface (bgs) and all ventilation risers with the exception of D-SSV-3.
- Preparing two semi-annual soil gas mitigation system monitoring reports, one for the second half-2021 and one for the first half-2022 for the two semi-annual soil gas mitigation system monitoring events.

Planned out-of-scope tasks that have yet to be completed in 2021 include:

• Coordinate with the Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) to revise the 2020 Five-Year Review Report.

SCOPE OF SERVICES

Task 1 – Preparing One Semi-Annual Soil Gas Mitigation System Monitoring Report for the First and Second-Half of 2020 and the First-Half of 2021

Ninyo & Moore will prepare one soil gas mitigation system monitoring report for the semi-annual soil gas mitigation system monitoring events conducted during first and second-half of 2020 and the first half of 2021. The report will discuss the field activities performed including inspection of the accessible components of the sub-slab ventilation systems, collection of soil gas samples, and an evaluation of the analytical results from the soil gas samples. The report will include a health risk assessment of both soil gas probe samples and vent riser vapor samples. The report will present conclusions and recommendations and will be submitted to DTSC for review.

Task 1 Estimated Fee - \$17,670

Task 2 – Two Soil Gas Mitigation System Monitoring Events, Including the Second-Half of 2021 and First-Half of 2022

Ninyo & Moore will continue to perform soil gas mitigation system monitoring at the site. Field activities will be performed in general accordance with the existing Operations and Maintenance (O&M) Plan dated March 9, 2015, that will be revised based on the modified sampling schedule agreed to by the DTSC. Field activities during the second-half 2021/first-half 2022 will consist of visual inspection of the accessible components of the sub-slab ventilation systems, collection of soil gas samples from all ventilation risers with the exception of D-SSV-3, and four (4) soil gas probes including SGMW-2-5, and 2-10, and SGMW-3-5 and 3-10. Soil gas mitigation system monitoring samples will be analyzed for volatile organic compounds (VOCs) by EPA Method TO-15 and air-phase hydrocarbons (APHs) by the Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection (MA DEP) Method using a 5-day turn-around-time (TAT). Each soil gas mitigation system monitoring event will include collection of duplicate samples and a trip blank sample for analysis of VOCs by EPA Method TO-15 and APHs by the (MA DEP) Method.

Task 2 Estimated Fee - \$23,473

Task 3 – Five Year Review Report Revisions

Coordinate with the DTSC to revise and finalize the 2020 Five-Year Review Report, Soil Gas Mitigation Systems, La Escuelita Education Center 314 East 10th Street, Oakland, California based on DTSC comments.

Task 3 Estimated Fee - \$6,858

UNDERSTANDINGS

The conditions listed below will apply to the performance of the scope of services described herein.

- The scope of services outlined above is based upon the scope of work outlined in the O&M Plan dated March 9, 2105, assumptions, and our experience on numerous proposed school sites similar to the subject site. The scope of services may change based on requirements from DTSC, requests to analyze samples on a faster TAT, and unforeseen conditions, which may be encountered in the field such as subsurface features or unexpected areas of impacts.
- Laboratory analytical TATs begin from the time that the laboratory receives the samples. Vapor monitoring samples will be transported via courier to McCampbell Analytical, located in Pittsburg, California.
- If additional time is required to complete any of these tasks due to inclement weather or unforeseen conditions which may be encountered in the field and beyond the control of Ninyo & Moore or its subcontractors, Ninyo & Moore may request the authorization of additional budget to cover the additional field time required for Ninyo & Moore personnel.

COMPENSATION

The estimated time-and-materials fee for the scope of services outlined above is **\$53,000** (Fifty-Three Thousand Dollars). Based on a request from OUSD, a 10% contingency fee will be added to the total.
