




CST trend shows modest gains: English Language Arts


CST trend shows modest gains: Mathematics

Percent Proficient or Advanced on CST in Mathematics 2009-2012



Percent Proficient or Advanced on CST in Mathematics 2009-2012



CST ELA trend shows modest gains for English Learners


English Learners: Percent Proficient or Advanced on CST in English Language Arts 2009-2012

English Learners: Percent Proficient or Advanced on CST in Mathematics 2009-2012





Reducing Chronic Absence to increase student achievement



Awareness & Early Implementation Year Gains: Chronic Absence reduced from 1 out of 9 students in 2010-11 to 1 out of 10 students in 2011-12.

- 2 Middle Schools
- 1 High School

Total: 20 Schools


Reducing Suspension Rates

Reduced Overall Suspension Rates, and Reduced Suspension Rates for African American Males by 20% in 2012

- 7 Elementary Schools
- 4 Middle Schools
- 8 High Schools

Total: 19 Schools

Cohort Graduation Rate (above) shows the four-year graduation rate for a cohort of first-time ninth grade students. California began using the cohort method of calculating graduation and dropout rates in 2010.
