Action Requested

Adoption of Resolution 1314-1044 – Request to the State Superintendent of Public Instruction for Renewal of Alternative School of Choice Waiver of Education Codes pertaining to Community College Attendance – Summer Courses for the period from July 1, 2014 to June 30, 2016 to fully implement the Gateway to College Alternative High School at Laney College.

Background

A one paragraph explanation of why the consultant's services are needed. Gateway to College is a nationally recognized education model serving youth who have dropped out of high school. In June 2008, the District authorized the establishment of Gateway as an Alternative education high school to be operated on the Laney Campus. Students attending Gateway are concurrently enrolled in Laney and Oakland Unified School and from their first day earn credits toward a high school diploma and an Associate's Degree. Gateway's student body is largely comprised of foster youth, adjudicated youth, teen parents, and students recovering from homelessness or drug and alcohol abuse.

Discussion

One paragraph summary of the scope of work.

Gateway to College at Laney Alternative High School is a school of high expectations and equally high levels of community support with the goal that vulnerable youth receive a second chance to re-engage in education in a meaningful way and create better lives for themselves.

The District will seek and obtain all necessary renewal waivers from the California Department of Education in order to fully continue to support Gateway. Under the Waiver Authority of the Education Code Section 58509, the particular Education Code or the California Code of Regulations Section(s) or portion thereof to be waived is: Community College Attendance – Summer Courses.

This is a request to again seek waiver of the following sections of the California Education Code related to providing the criteria under which a high school student can enroll in a community college summer course.

 Education Code §48800 (d)(1) – Criteria for community college summer session

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- (d)(1) The principal of a school may recommend a pupil for community colleges summer session only if that pupil meets all of the following criteria:
- (A) Demonstrates adequate preparation in the discipline to be studied.
- (B) Exhausts all opportunities to enroll in an equivalent course, if any, at his or her school of attendance.
- (2) For any particular grade level, a principal shall not recommend for community college summer session attendance more than 5 percent of the total number of pupils who completed that grade immediately prior to the time of recommendation.
- (3) A highs school pupil recommended by his or her principal for enrollment in an course shall not be included in the 5 percent limitation of pupils allowed to be recommended pursuant to paragraph (2) if the course in which the pupil is enrolled meets one of the criterion listed in subparagraphs (A) to (C), inclusive, and the high school principal who recommends the pupil for enrollment provides the Chancellor of the California Community Colleges, upon the request that office, with the data required for purposes of paragraph (4).
 - (A) The course is a lower division, college-level course for credit that is designated as part of the Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum or applies toward the general education breadth requirements of the California State University.
 - (B) The course is a college-level, occupational course for credit assigned a priority code of "A", "B", or "C", pursuant to the Student Accountability Model, as defined by the Chancellor of the California Community Colleges and reported in the management information system, and the course is part of a sequence of vocational or career technical education courses leading to a degree or certification in the subject area covered by the sequence.

- (C) The course is necessary to assist a pupil who has not passed the California High School Exit Examination (CAHSEE), does not offer college credit in English language arts or mathematics, and the pupil meets both of the following requirements:
- (i) The pupil is in his or her senior year of high school.
- (ii) The pupil has completed all other graduation requirements prior to the end of his or her senior year, or will complete all remaining graduation requirements during a community college summer session, which he or she is recommended to enroll in, following his or her senior year of high school.
- (4) On or before November 1, 2007, and on or before January 1 of each year thereafter, the Chancellor of the Community Colleges shall report to the Department of Finance the number of pupils recommended pursuant to paragraph (3) who enroll in community college summer session courses and who receive a passing grade.
- (5) The Board of Governors of the California Community Colleges shall not include enrollment growth attributable to paragraph (3) as part of its annual budget request for the California Community Colleges.
- (6) Notwithstanding Article 3 (commencing with Section 33050) of Chapter 1 of Part 20 of Division 2, compliance with this subdivision shall not be waived.
- (e) Paragraphs (3), (4), and (5) of subdivision (d) shall become inoperative on January 1, 2014.

Under the California Department of Education regulation and the Alternative School of Choice Waiver Request for (CDE form AEW-1 (Rev 3/10), no public hearing is required if the renewal waiver is not controversial. In addition, meet and confer with bargaining units and review by the SSC are not required if the renewal waiver is not controversial. OEA and the SSC have been advised that the District is seeking renewal of the waivers. There is no controversy related to the Gateway program.

The legislation authorizing the establishment of alternative schools of choice provides, in part, that school districts may establish alternative schools based on the premise that the best learning takes place when the student learns because of his or her desire to learn. Alternative schools and programs of choice are often characterized by responsiveness to instructional style differences, the positive consequences of being a school of choice, and small unit size. The Gateway to College alternative high school fits this profile.

Gateway to College at Laney College ("Gateway") serves 350 students, 16 to 20 years old, who have dropped out of school and provides a second chance for students to get back on a path leading to economic and educational opportunity. In keeping with the statutory purpose, the program achieves success by maintaining a learning situation that

maximizes student self-motivation and encourages a student in his own time to follow his interests.

Gateway to College is a college-based program serving at-risk youth, 16 to 20 years old, who have dropped out of school. All class are college classes, and the program is fully integrated into the college setting. Gateway to College classes are offered both during the academic year and summer term, providing much needed flexibility for working students or students with children. The ability to enroll in summer courses is a necessary component of the program and would facilitate the timely completion of graduation requirements. Hence, renewal of the waiver of the aforementioned K-12 provision is necessary to fully implement the Gateway to College model in the college setting. The District is requesting a renewal of the waiver for two years.

Evaluation Procedure

An annual evaluation, pursuant to Education Code Section 58510, will be performed in accordance with guidelines established by the California Department of Education and the State Superintendent of Public Instruction. The evaluation will be conducted by the OUSD Office of Alternative Education and will include input from key stakeholders such as teachers, students, and parents or guardians.

The methodology used will be consistent with evaluations of other OUSD Alternative Schools and Programs. The evaluation will include student performance data on K-12 mandatory testing and will examine features such as the following to determine their impact on student learning outcomes:

- Sustainable Partnerships (e.g., advisory committee, referrals, information sharing systems, etc.)
- Integration of the program into the college (e.g., attendance on college calendar, college orientation, flexible class schedule)
- Dual credit (e.g., diploma and testing requirements are aligned with college courses, counselors trained in high school and advising systems.)
- Adequate teaching and administrative staff
- Collaboration between faculty members and between students (e.g., team based approach to student success)
- Teaching and Learning (e.g., rigor and relevance in the curriculum)
- Student Support systems (e.g., focus on academic and non-academic barriers)
- Professional Development for faculty and staff (e.g., mission and core values communicated, roles and responsibilities are clearly communicated)

Dear Acting Superintendent Yee:

This letter is in response to your request for renewal of the waivers pertaining to your district's alternative school of choice, the Gateway to College (GTC) Program at Laney College. The California *Education Code* sections you have requested to waive are listed in the attached table.

Your renewal request explains that the GTC Program is being offered in partnership with Laney College. The program is based on the national GTC model, which has achieved success serving at-risk youth aged sixteen to twenty-one who have dropped out of high school and are significantly behind in credits. Your request explains that the program achieves success by combining high academic expectations with one-on-one advising and support. A key component of the program is that the district is able to claim average daily attendance (ADA) for GTC Program students who are taking all their classes at Laney College from Laney College instructors. We understand that this unusual arrangement is necessary to provide sufficient resources for the personalized support these students will need to succeed.

Based on the unusual nature of the requested funding and continued challenges inherent in such an approach, I approve your waiver renewals for one year with the following conditions:

- The GTC Program will set a target of at least a 25 percent increase in the number of graduates in the 2013–14 school year compared to the 2012–13 school year. The GTC Program will provide an outcome report to the California Department of Education (CDE) within six weeks after the end of the 2014 spring semester.
- Your district will continue to use an audit process that demonstrates that the ADA funding received for the GTC Program was used only for the GTC Program.

3. The GTC Program staff will continue to conduct end-of-semester reviews in addition to a year-end review of the progress made toward the graduation target, program expenditure, and other academic outcomes. We appreciate your efforts to analyze achievement of objectives—particularly those relating to course completions, attendance improvement, and steady progress in earning credits needed to achieve a diploma.

It is important that the GTC Program continues to provide excellent service to students and make a difference for a significant number of students enrolled in the program.

Please send the outcome report regarding the graduation target and a preliminary annual evaluation to the CDE within six weeks after the end of the 2014 spring semester. Also, please send the full annual evaluation report on or before August 1, 2014, to:

These waivers will be effective for the 2013–14 school year only. We will review audit findings and achievement of program objectives before approving any future renewal requests.
