"Without increasing current tax rates, to reduce gun violence, robberies and homicides and improve 911 response times, shall the City of Oakland provide improved police and emergency response services and proven community programs, including dropout prevention, crisis intervention, job training and placement, and support for at-risk youth, by continuing to collect a surcharge on parking lots and a parcel tax subject to annual performance and financial audits monitored by a citizens' oversight committee?"

Next, I will read a description of the measure for the Oakland Unified School District:

"To reduce the drop-out rate and prepare Oakland high school students to get good jobs by providing real-world work and learning opportunities; give all high school students access to the classes needed for admission to the University of California; recruit and retain experienced, qualified teachers; expand mentoring, tutoring, counseling and support services; shall the Oakland Unified School District levy a \$150 parcel tax for ten years, with exemptions for seniors and low income residents, no money for Sacramento, and all money benefitting local students?"

The money raised by this measure will be used for a program in Oakland public high schools known as Linked Learning which connects student interests and classroom learning to the world of work and career. When students begin high school they choose one of many areas of college and career study, such as information technology, business and finance, health care, law, engineering, the arts, hospitality, culinary and tourism, and others, where they get technical training that connects traditional school subjects to a career and where local businesses allow the students to get real world experience such as an internship, job shadowing, or they get experience with a student-run business. The program also makes sure that all students have access to all the courses they need to qualify for the University of California and California State university systems. Enhanced mentoring, tutoring, counseling and family support services help students stay in school and graduate, prepared to succeed in college, career and life, whether or not they choose to go to college. This has already been very successful in several local high schools, but is only available to a limited number of students. The parcel tax would allow most, if not all, Oakland high school students to be able to take advantage of this program.
