

The Options Assignment Process. A Step by Step guide

- On Time Applications:
 - On Time applicants are accepted between 12/8/14 and 1/23/15
 - On Time applicants are processed and run through Options Lottery Tool. Lottery tool set based on board policy enrollment priorities:
 - Siblings of students who will attend at the school
 - Students that reside within neighborhood boundary
 - General Lottery of students who are non-sibs and non-neighbors
 - On Time applicants receive letter of assignment offering them one spot at one grade level for 2015-2016. Letter is mailed and received during the window of March 6th -16th.
 - o On time applicants are asked to confirm at assigned site by April 1, 2015
 - On time applicants may submit an appeal. They do so before **Friday, March 20, 2015**.
 - All appeals submitted by on time applicants are randomized within their priority group:
 1) Siblings, 2) neighbors, 3) General Lottery.
- Late Applications:
 - Late applicants submit applications on or after 1/26/15 until early August 2015.
 - Late applicants are considered on a first-come first-serve basis.
 - Once parents of the **on time** applicant pool are notified, late application processing begins.
 - If space at site, students are assigned at available spaces, based on board policy prioritization:
 - 1.Siblings
 - 2.Neighbors
 - 3.General Lottery
 - Assignment Notifications for Late Applicants happen in batches. The first batch will be mailed by the first week of April. Subsequent batches will notify parents every 3-4 weeks, until the first week of August.
 - Late applicants will have their own confirmation date, printed on the letter.
 - Late applicants will have their own deadline to appeal by (although all late appeals are considered first come first serve).
 - Appeals for late applicants are considered on a first come first serve basis, after on-time applicants. They still have priority as per board policy:
 - 1.Siblings
 - 2.Neighbors
 - 3.General Lottery
